# HOUSE FILE 272 FISCAL NOTE

The estimate for **House File 272** is hereby submitted as a fiscal note pursuant to Joint Rule 17 and as a correctional impact statement pursuant to Section 2.56, <u>Code of Iowa</u>. Data used in developing this fiscal note and correctional impact statement are available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 272 concerns felonious misconduct by a public officer or employee. The Bill prohibits a public officer or employee from falsifying a writing, or knowingly delivering a falsified writing that will become a public record of a government body. The effect of House File 272 is to apply existing penalties earlier in a document's life cycle. The penalty for felonious misconduct in office is a Class D felony.

#### **ASSUMPTIONS**

- 1. Charge, conviction, and sentencing patterns and trends will not change over the projection period.
- 2. Prisoner length of stay, revocation rates, and other corrections' practices and policies will not change over the projection period.
- 3. The law will become effective July 1, 2001. A lag effect of six months is assumed, from the effective date of the change in the law to the date of first entry of affected offenders into the correctional system.
- 4. The analysis is based on information obtained from the Justice Data Warehouse, which includes statewide court information. Conviction and penalty information is based on FY 2000 data.
- 5. There were two convictions under Section 721.1(2), <u>Code of Towa</u> during FY 2000. One person was sentenced to <u>prison</u> and the other person was sentenced to probation.
- 6. The marginal cost per day for State prisons is \$16 per offender. The average length of stay for Class D felons in the State prison system is 21.3 months.
- 7. The marginal cost per day for probation or parole is \$1.55 per offender. The average length of stay for street supervision is 29 months for a Class D felony.
- 8. The median cost per case for Class D felonies is \$1,000 to defend.
- 9. Court costs vary by type of offense charged as well as contested versus uncontested cases. Trial costs for a Class D felony case range from \$2,900 to \$5,100. These costs include expenses for the Clerk of Court, court attendant, court reporter, juries, and judges; i.e., Magistrates,

District Associate Judges, and District Court Judges.
