A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the funding and provision of media services

2 and education services, and containing an applicability

3 provision.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 257.35, Code 2001, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 257.35 AREA EDUCATION AGENCY PAYMENTS.
- 4 1. The department of management shall deduct the amounts
- 5 calculated for special education support services, media
- 6 services, and educational services for each school district
- 7 from the state aid due to the district pursuant to this
- 8 chapter and shall pay the amounts to the respective area
- 9 education agencies on a monthly basis from September 15
- 10 through June 15 during each school year. The department of
- 11 management shall notify each school district of the amount of
- 12 state aid deducted for these purposes and the balance of state
- 13 aid shall be paid to the district. If a district does not
- 14 qualify for state aid under this chapter in an amount
- 15 sufficient to cover its amount due to the area education
- 16 agency as calculated by the department of management, the
- 17 school district shall pay the deficiency to the area education
- 18 agency from other moneys received by the district, on a
- 19 quarterly basis during each school year.
- 20 2. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2002, and
- 21 succeeding budget years, notwithstanding any other provision
- 22 of the Code to the contrary, amounts calculated by the
- 23 department of management for media services and educational
- 24 services shall be distributed as follows:
- 25 a. Sixty percent of the amounts calculated shall be paid
- 26 to the respective area education agencies as provided in
- 27 subsection 1.
- 28 b. Forty percent of the amounts shall be paid directly to
- 29 each school district as part of the state aid otherwise due to
- 30 the district. Amounts paid to a school district for media
- 31 services and educational services shall be expended by the
- 32 district pursuant to section 257.37A only for such services.
- 33 A school district shall not be authorized to utilize the
- 34 amounts for any other purpose.
- 35 c. Out of the amount paid to each school district pursuant

- 1 to paragraph "b", the school district shall remit to the
- 2 nonpublic schools located within the school district an amount
- 3 determined by the department of management to represent the
- 4 school district's proportionate share of the sum of the
- 5 product of the cost per pupil in basic enrollment for the
- 6 budget year for media services times the difference between
- 7 the enrollment served and the basic enrollment recorded for
- 8 the school district, and the product of the cost per pupil in
- 9 basic enrollment for the budget year for educational services
- 10 times the difference between the enrollment served and the
- 11 basic enrollment recorded for the school district.
- 12 Sec. 2. Section 257.37, Code 2001, is amended to read as
- 13 follows:
- 14 257.37 FUNDING MEDIA AND EDUCATIONAL SERVICES.
- 15 Media services and educational services provided-through
- 16 the-area-education-agencies shall be funded, to the extent
- 17 provided, by an addition to the combined district cost of each
- 18 school district, determined as follows:
- 19 1. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1991, and
- 20 succeeding budget years, the total amount funded in each area
- 21 for media services shall be computed as provided in this
- 22 subsection. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1991, the
- 23 total amount funded in each area for media services in the
- 24 base year, including the cost for media resource material
- 25 which shall only be used for the purchase or replacement of
- 26 material required in section 273.6, subsection 1, paragraphs
- 27 "a", "b", and "c", shall be divided by the enrollment served
- 28 in the base year to provide an area media services cost per
- 29 pupil in the base year, and the department of management shall
- 30 compute the state media services cost per pupil in the base
- 31 year which is equal to the average of the area media services
- 32 costs per pupil in the base year. For the budget year
- 33 beginning July 1, 1991, and succeeding budget years, the
- 34 department of management shall compute the allowable growth
- 35 for media services in the budget year by multiplying the state

- 1 media services cost per pupil in the base year times the state
- 2 percent of growth for the budget year, and the total amount
- 3 funded in each area for media services cost in the budget year
- 4 equals the area media services cost per pupil in the base year
- 5 plus the allowable growth for media services in the budget
- 6 year times the enrollment served in the budget year. Funds
- 7 shall be paid to area education agencies and school districts
- 8 as provided in section 257.35.
- 9 2. Thirty percent of the budget of an area for media
- 10 services shall be expended for media resource material which
- 11 shall only be used for the purchase or replacement of material
- 12 required in section 273.6, subsection 1. Funds shall be paid
- 13 to area education agencies as provided in section 257.35.
- 14 Beginning July 1, 2002, the requirements of this subsection
- 15 shall be funded from the sixty percent funding amount paid to
- 16 an area education agency pursuant to section 257.35,
- 17 subsection 2.
- 18 3. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1991, and
- 19 succeeding budget years, the total amount funded in each area
- 20 for educational services shall be computed as provided in this
- 21 subsection. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1991, the
- 22 total amount funded in each area for educational services in
- 23 the base year shall be divided by the enrollment served in the
- 24 area in the base year to provide an area educational services
- 25 cost per pupil in the base year, and the department of
- 26 management shall compute the state educational services cost
- 27 per pupil in the base year, which is equal to the average of
- 28 the area educational services costs per pupil in the base
- 29 year. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1991, and
- 30 succeeding budget years, the department of management shall
- 31 compute the allowable growth for educational services by
- 32 multiplying the state educational services cost per pupil in
- 33 the base year times the state percent of growth for the budget
- 34 year, and the total amount funded in each area for educational
- 35 services for the budget year equals the area educational

1 services cost per pupil for the base year plus the allowable 2 growth for educational services in the budget year times the 3 enrollment served in the area in the budget year. Funds shall 4 be paid to area education agencies and school districts as 5 provided in section 257.35.

- 4. "Enrollment served" means the basic enrollment plus the number of nonpublic school pupils served with media services 8 or educational services, as applicable, except that if a 9 nonpublic school pupil or a pupil attending another district 10 under a whole-grade sharing agreement or open enrollment 11 receives services through an area other than the area of the 12 pupil's residence, the pupil shall be deemed to be served by 13 the area of the pupil's residence, which shall by contractual 14 arrangement reimburse the area through which the pupil 15 actually receives services. Each school district shall 16 include in the third Friday in September enrollment report the 17 number of nonpublic school pupils within each school district 18 for media and educational services served by the area.
- If an area education agency does not serve nonpublic 19 20 school pupils in a manner comparable to services provided 21 public school pupils for media and educational services, as 22 determined by the state board of education, the state board 23 shall instruct the department of management to reduce the 24 funds for media services and educational services one time by 25 an amount to compensate for such reduced services. 26 services budget shall be reduced by an amount equal to the 27 product of the cost per pupil in basic enrollment for the 28 budget year for media services times the difference between 29 the enrollment served and the basic enrollment recorded for The educational services budget shall be reduced by 30 the area. 31 an amount equal to the product of the cost per pupil in basic 32 enrollment for the budget year for educational services times 33 the difference between the enrollment served and the basic 34 enrollment recorded for the area.

This subsection applies only to media and educational

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- 1 services which cannot be diverted for religious purposes.
- Notwithstanding this subsection, an area education agency
- 3 shall distribute to nonpublic schools media materials
- 4 purchased wholly or partially with federal funds in a manner
- 5 comparable to the distribution of such media materials to
- 6 public schools as determined by the director of the department
- 7 of education.
- 8 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 257.37A CONTRACTS FOR SERVICES.
- 9 A school district or nonpublic school may utilize amounts
- 10 received for media services and educational services pursuant
- 11 to section 257.35, subsection 2, to contract with one or more
- 12 school districts, area education agencies, or independent
- 13 agencies not associated with a school district or area
- 14 education agency pursuant to section 28E.12 for the partial or
- 15 complete furnishing of any service or activity which the
- 16 district could have contracted with the area education agency
- 17 to which it is assigned to provide for the budget year. This
- 18 section shall not be construed to impact the utilization of an
- 19 area education agency for the identifying, weighting, or
- 20 providing of special education enrollment counts pursuant to
- 21 section 273.5, the provision of special education support
- 22 services, or the administration of federally funded health
- 23 care programs pursuant to section 256B.15. A district or
- 24 nonpublic school shall contract with the area education agency
- 25 to which it is assigned for provision of these services.
- Sec. 4. Section 273.2, subsection 3, Code 2001, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:
- 28 3. The area education agency board shall furnish
- 29 educational services and programs as provided in sections
- 30 273.1 to 273.9 and chapter 256B to the pupils enrolled in
- 31 public or nonpublic schools located within its boundaries, or
- 32 within the boundaries of another area education agency
- 33 pursuant to a contract under section 257.37A, which are on the
- 34 list of accredited schools pursuant to section 256.11. The
- 35 programs and services provided shall be at least commensurate

- 1 with programs and services existing on July 1, 1974. The
- 2 programs and services provided to pupils enrolled in nonpublic
- 3 schools shall be comparable to programs and services provided
- 4 to pupils enrolled in public schools within constitutional
- 5 quidelines.
- 6 Sec. 5. Section 273.2, subsection 4, Code 2001, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 4. The area education agency board shall provide for
- 9 special education services and media services for the local
- 10 school districts in the area, or another area pursuant to a
- 11 contract under section 257.37A, and shall encourage and assist
- 12 school districts in-the-area to establish programs for gifted
- 13 and talented children.
- 14 Sec. 6. Section 273.3, subsection 6, Code 2001, is amended
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 6. Area education agencies may cooperate and contract
- 17 between themselves and with other public agencies to provide
- 18 special education programs and services, media services, and
- 19 educational services to schools and children residing within
- 20 their respective areas, or another area pursuant to a contract
- 21 under section 257.37A. Area education agencies may provide
- 22 print and nonprint materials to public and private colleges
- 23 and universities that have teacher education programs approved
- 24 by the state board of education.
- 25 Sec. 7. Section 273.4, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2001, are
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- 27 1. Co-operate Cooperate with boards of directors of local
- 28 school districts of-the-area-education-agency in considering
- 29 and developing plans for the improvement of the educational
- 30 programs and services in the area education agency.
- 31 2. When requested, provide such other assistance as
- 32 possible to school districts of-the-area-education-agency for
- 33 the general improvement of their educational programs and
- 34 operations.
- Sec. 8. Section 273.7, Code 2001, is amended to read as

1 follows:

- 2 273.7 ADDITIONAL SERVICES.
- 3 If sixty percent of the number of local school boards
- 4 located in, or who have contracted with, an area education
- 5 agency, or if local school boards representing sixty percent
- 6 of the enrollment in the school districts located in, or who
- 7 have contracted with, the agency, request in writing to the
- 8 area education agency board that an additional service be
- 9 provided them, for pupils in grades kindergarten through
- 10 twelve or children requiring special education as defined in
- 11 section 256B.2 or for employees or board members of school
- 12 districts or area education agencies, the area education
- 13 agency board shall arrange for the service to be provided to
- 14 all school districts in the area within the financial
- 15 capabilities of the area education agency.
- 16 Sec. 9. Section 273.7A, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2001,
- 17 is amended to read as follows:
- 18 The board of an area education agency may provide services
- 19 to school districts located in within or outside the area
- 20 education agency under contract with the school districts.
- 21 These services may include, but are not limited to,
- 22 superintendency services, personnel services, business
- 23 management services, specialized maintenance services, and
- 24 transportation services. In addition, the board of the area
- 25 education agency may provide for furnishing expensive and
- 26 specialized equipment for school districts. School districts
- 27 shall pay to area education agencies the cost of providing the
- 28 services.
- 29 Sec. 10. APPLICABILITY DATE. This Act applies to school
- 30 budget years beginning on or after July 1, 2002.
- 31 EXPLANATION
- 32 This bill provides for a change in the distribution of
- 33 funding for the provision of media services and education
- 34 services. The bill provides that for the school budget year
- 35 beginning July 1, 2002, and succeeding budget years, amounts

1 calculated by the department of management for media services 2 and educational services shall be distributed on a 60-40 basis 3 between area education agencies and local school districts. 4 The bill provides that 60 percent of the amounts calculated 5 pursuant to Code section 257.35 shall be paid to the 6 respective area education agencies, and that 40 percent of the 7 amounts shall be paid directly to each school district as part 8 of the state aid otherwise due to the district. 9 provides that amounts paid to a school district for media 10 services and educational services shall be expended by the 11 district only for such services. The bill provides for the 12 payment by school districts to nonpublic schools located 13 within the school district, out of the 40 percent funding 14 amount, of an amount for media and educational support 15 services representing the proportional enrollment of nonpublic 16 school pupils compared to both public and nonpublic school 17 enrollment in the school district. The bill provides that a 18 school district or nonpublic school may utilize the amounts 19 received for media services and educational services to 20 contract with one or more school districts, area education 21 agencies, or independent agencies for the partial or complete 22 furnishing of any service or activity for which the district 23 could have contracted with the area education agency to which 24 it is assigned. The bill provides that a school district or 25 nonpublic school shall continue to contract with the area 26 education agency to which it is assigned for special education 27 purposes and relating to the administration of federally 28 funded health care programs pursuant to Code section 256B.15. 29 The bill provides several conforming changes to Code chapter 30 273 relating to the provision of services by an area education 31 agency to school districts both within the area and with whom 32 it may contract pursuant to Code section 257.37A. 33 applies to the school budget year beginning July 1, 2002.

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
