Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 613.22 LIMITATION ON LIABILITY
2 OF HEALTH CARE FACILITIES.

3 1. a. In an action to recover damages arising out of the 4 personal injury or death of a resident of a health care 5 facility, as defined in section 135C.1, the present value of 6 the damages awarded for noneconomic losses incurred or to be 7 incurred in the future by the resident shall not exceed two 8 hundred fifty thousand dollars.

9 b. In an action described in paragraph "a" tried to a jury 10 where damages for noneconomic losses are sought, the court 11 shall submit an instruction to the jury that the maximum 12 allowable award for noneconomic losses is two hundred fifty 13 thousand dollars. A separate interrogatory verdict shall be 14 submitted for damages for noneconomic losses unless waived by 15 all parties.

16 c. As used in this section, "noneconomic losses" includes, 17 but is not limited to, pain and suffering, mental anguish, 18 emotional distress, humiliation, loss of consortium, lost 19 opportunity, loss of expectations, and punitive or exemplary 20 damages.

EXPLANATION

This bill creates new Code section 613.22, limiting damages for noneconomic losses arising out of the personal injury or death of a resident of a health care facility. The bill caps damages for noneconomic losses at \$250,000, and defines noneconomic losses to include pain and suffering and punitive or exemplary damages. The bill also requires a special interrogatory and instructions in a jury trial where noneconomic losses are claimed.

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
