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Section 1. Section 91D.1, subsection 1, paragraph b, Code 1 2 2001, is amended to read as follows: 3 b. Every employer,-as-defined-in-the-federal-Fair-babor 4 Standards-Act, shall pay to each of the employer's employees, 5 as-defined-in-the-federal-Fair-Labor-Standards-Act; wages of 6 not less than the current federal minimum wage, pursuant to 29 7 U.S.C. § 206, or the wage rate stated in paragraph "a", 8 whichever is greater. Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 9 91D.2 DEFINITIONS. For purposes of this chapter, unless the context otherwise 10 ll requires: 12 1. "Employee" means the same as defined in 29 U.S.C. § 203 13 of the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938. "Employer" means the same as defined in 29 U.S.C. § 203 14 2. 15 of the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938. 3. "Overtime" means the hours worked in excess of forty 16 17 hours in a calendar week. 18 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 91D.3 MANDATORY OVERTIME 19 LIMITATION. An employer shall not require an employee to work more than 20 21 eighty hours of overtime in any consecutive two-week period. 22 In addition, an employee shall not be required by the employer 23 to work any hours during one twenty-four-hour period each 24 calendar week. Sec. 3. IMPLEMENTATION OF ACT. Section 25B.2, subsection 25 26 3, shall not apply to this Act. **EXPLANATION** 27 This bill places a limit on the number of mandatory hours 28 29 that an employer can require of an employee to not more than 30 80 hours of overtime in any consecutive two-week period. The 31 bill also requires that an employer grant employees one day of 32 rest per week. The bill also adds a definition section to the Code chapter 33 34 91D. 35 The bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code

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1 section 25B.3. The bill makes inapplicable Code section 2 25B.2, subsection 3, which would relieve a political 3 subdivision from complying with a state mandate if funding for 4 the cost of the state mandate is not provided or specified. 5 Therefore, political subdivisions are required to comply with 6 any state mandate included in the bill.

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
