HOUSE FILE 550 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for **House File 550** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 550 requires a person who commits an offense of criminal transmission of human immunodeficiency virus to register as a sex offender.

ASSUMPTIONS

HOUSE CLIP SHEET

- Current law requires a sex offender to register for ten years on the sex offender registry.
- 2. A person who is convicted of criminal transmission of human immunodeficiency virus commits a Class B felony.
- 3. According to the Justice Data Warehouse, there was one offender convicted during FY 2000. The number of offenders in the future is unknown.
- 4. Court costs for a Class B felony range from approximately \$9,000 to \$15,000.
- 5. The marginal cost per day for a prison inmate is \$16.
- 6. The average length of stay for a Class B felony is 103.7 months.
- 7. The cost to the State Public Defender's Office is \$3,000.
- 8. The Bill takes effect upon enactment.

CORRECTIONAL IMPACT

The number of people who might be convicted of criminal transmission of human immunodeficiency virus, in the future, is unknown. During FY 2000, only one person was convicted of this offense.

FISCAL IMPACT

Due to insufficient information, an accurate fiscal impact cannot be determined. However, for each offender, the General Fund cost would be between \$75,000 and \$81,000.
