

Wildlife Violator Compact

The attached bill allows the Department of Natural Resources to enter into a compact with other states for reciprocal recognition of the suspension of hunting and fishing license privileges by the compact participating states. Fish and Wildlife law violators that are habitual offenders in Iowa will be prohibited from fishing and hunting activites, as appropriate and applicable, in other states through this compact. Discussions with other states created this recommendation, as they see a need to not allow habitual fish and game law violators hunting and fishing rights in other states.
