Section 1. Section 321.34, Code 2001, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 23. CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION SPECIAL PLATES. An owner referred to in subsection 12 who is a member of lowa's congressional delegation may, upon written application to the department and presentation of satisfactory proof of membership in such delegation, order special registration plates with a congressional delegation processed emblem. The emblem shall be designed by the department and shall signify that the owner is a member of Iowa's congressional delegation. The application is subject to approval by the department. The special plates shall be issued at no charge and are subject to an annual registration fee of fifteen dollars. The county treasurer shall validate the special plates in the same manner as regular registration plates are validated under this section.

Special registration plates issued under this subsection shall be surrendered to the department or the appropriate county treasurer upon the death of or discontinuance of service in the United States senate or house of representatives by the vehicle owner who was initially issued the special plates under this subsection.

EXPLANATION
This bill authorizes the state department of transportation to issue congressional delegation special registration plates to persons who are members of Iowa's congressional delegation. The plates shall display a congressional delegation processed emblem, designed by the department, and shall be issued at no charge, subject to an annual $\$ 15$ registration fee. Such plates shall be turned in to the department or the appropriate county treasurer when a person who was issued the plates dies or discontinues service in the United States senate or house of representatives.
