## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the use of energy efficiency plan-related moneys to provide financial assistance to low-income customers of gas public utilities and providing an effective date. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 

- 1 Section 1. Section 476.6, Code 2001, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 25. LOW-INCOME FUNDING. Moneys collected
- 4 by rate-regulated gas utilities pursuant to subsection 19,
- 5 paragraph "e", that represent unrecovered amounts for the gas
- 6 portions of energy efficiency plans approved prior to July 1,
- 7 1996, shall be paid, up to a maximum of twenty million dollars
- 8 per year, to the department of human rights. The moneys paid
- 9 to the department shall be used to provide financial
- 10 assistance to eligible low-income customers of gas public
- 11 utilities, as defined by the federal low-income heating energy
- 12 assistance program guidelines, in paying their natural gas
- 13 bills. The board shall adopt rules specifying each rate-
- 14 regulated gas utility's share of the fund and each utility's
- 15 allocation methods among residential and other firm customers,
- 16 but a customer's rates shall not increase as a result of this
- 17 subsection. These funds shall be paid to the department until
- 18 July 1, 2003, at which time rate-regulated gas utilities may
- 19 continue recovery of any remaining amounts for the gas
- 20 portions of energy efficiency plans approved prior to July 1,
- 21 1996.
- The board may direct, upon the department of human rights'
- 23 request, all rate-regulated gas utilities to advance a maximum
- 24 of twenty million dollars to the department, pursuant to the
- 25 allocation methods adopted by the board, to allow for the
- 26 provision of immediate financial assistance to eligible
- 27 customers. A rate-regulated gas utility advancing moneys
- 28 shall have the amount of the advance added to the unpaid
- 29 amount of the gas portion of its energy efficiency plan
- 30 approved prior to July 1, 1996, and interest shall be paid on
- 31 any moneys advanced at a rate equal to the interest paid on
- 32 the unrecovered gas portions of energy efficiency plans
- 33 approved prior to July 1, 1996.
- 34 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of
- 35 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

## EXPLANATION

2 This bill provides financial assistance to low-income 3 customers of gas public utilities. The bill provides that 4 moneys collected by rate-regulated utilities that represent 5 unrecovered moneys for the gas portions of energy efficiency 6 plans approved prior to July 1, 1996, shall be paid, up to a 7 maximum of \$20 million per year, to the department of human 8 rights. The bill provides that the moneys shall be used for 9 purposes of providing eligible customers of gas public 10 utilities with financial assistance in paying their natural 11 gas bills. The bill provides that the utilities board shall 12 determine each rate-regulated gas utility's share of the fund 13 and each utility's allocation methods among residential and 14 other firm customers. The bill provides that a customer's 15 rates shall not increase as a result of the bill. 16 provides that moneys shall continue to be paid to the 17 department until July 1, 2003.

The bill provides that the department may request the board 19 to direct all rate-regulated gas utilities to advance a 20 maximum \$20 million to the department to allow immediate 21 financial assistance to eligible customers.

22 The bill takes effect upon enactment.

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
