Listing of Code Chapters/Sections To Be Recommended For Deletion During the 2001 Legislative Session

- 1. Chapters 159.15 and 7A.3: Requiring the Department to submit a biennial report to the Governor in each even numbered year. (Financial and operational information is available to the Governor at any time through our Department, the lowa Department of Revenue, the Legislative Fiscal Bureau and the Department of Management. Immediate and more current information retrieval is now available at any time. Removal of this requirement would eliminate redundancy. Financial information from the previous and this requirement is no longer necessary.)
- 2. Chapter 159.5(15): The requirement of Chapter 159.5(15) for the IDALS to inspect and regulate water sold in sealed containers for human consumption. (If a funding request is not granted during the current session this code requirement should be removed prior to the end of the Legislative session. The Department has repeatedly requested funding and code deletion.
- 3. <u>Chapter 159.37</u>: Requiring the Department to establish a grains electronic bulletin board and promote the use of such. (The Department currently provides the public market information on the Internet home page, which is easily and readily obtained by the public.)
- 4. Chapter 159.5 (12): Requiring the Department to establish a sheep promotion division. (There have been no funds no FTE's appropriated for this function since June 30, 1993. Numerous attempts have been made for this deletion.
- 5. Chapter 99D.22,1: Requiring the Department to pay the breeder of the winning lowa foaled horse or lowa whelped dog by December 31, of each year. (Funds are received through February of each year and the date needs to be changed to March 31 for payment to the breeders.)
- 6. Chapter 159.10: Requiring the Department to publish the lowa Book of Agriculture containing agricultural information at the discretion of the Secretary. (This type of information is available from various sources including the Ag. Statistics Bureau, the lowa State Fair, ISU, and a wide variety of commodity groups. The IDALS Internet is also a source for much of this information and will continue to grow.)
- 7. Chapter 159.30: Requiring the Department to designate, promote and market packaging products which are degradable. (This section should be deleted as no resources have been allocated for research to make the biodegradable designation.)
- 8. Chapter 192.101A, 192.102 and 191,110(1): Need to have a reference change for years from 1995 to 1999 on both the "Methods" and the "Procedures" documents.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STENARDSHIP.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 7A.3, subsection 3, Code 2001, is amended by striking the subsection.

Sec. 2. Section 99D.22, subsection 1, Code 2001, is amended to read as follows:

1. A licensee shall hold at least one race on each racing day limited to Iowa-foaled horses or Iowa-whelped dogs as defined by the department of agriculture and land stewardship using standards consistent with this section. However, if sufficient competition cannot be had among that class of horses or dogs on any day, another race for the day may be substituted. A sum equal to twelve percent of the purse won by an Iowa-foaled horse or Iowa-whelped dog shall be used to promote the horse and dog breeding industries. The twelve

percent shall be withheld by the licensee from the breakage and shall be paid at the end of the race meeting to the state department of agriculture and land stewardship which in turn shall deposit it in a special fund to be known as the Iowa horse and dog breeders fund and-pay-it. The department shall pay the amount deposited in the fund that is withheld from the purse won by an Iowa-foaled horse to the breeder of the winning lowa-foaled horse by December 31 of each calendar year to-the-breeder-of-the-winning-fowa-fowled-horse-or-fowawhelped-dog. The department shall pay the amount deposited in the fund that is withheld from the purse won by an Iowawhelped dog to the breeder of the winning Iowa-whelped dog by March 31 of each calendar year. For the purposes of this section, the breeder of a thoroughbred horse shall be considered to be the owner of the brood mare at the time the foal is dropped. The-breeder-of-a-quarter-horse-or standardbred-horse-shall-be-considered-to-be-the-owner-of-the mare-at-the-time-of-breeding:

Sec. 3. Section 192.101A, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2001, is amended to read as follows:

As used in this chapter, all terms shall have the same meaning as defined in the "Grade 'A' Pasteurized Milk Ordinance, 1995 1999 Revision". However, notwithstanding the ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:

Sec. 4. Section 192.102, Code 2001, is amended to read as follows:

192.102 GRADE "A" PASTEURIZED MILK ORDINANCE.

The department shall adopt, by rule, the "Grade 'A' Pasteurized Milk Ordinance, 1995 1999 Revision", including a subsequent revision of the ordinance. If the ordinance specifies that compliance with a provision of the ordinance's appendices is mandatory, the department shall also adopt that provision. The department shall not amend the ordinance, unless the department explains each amendment and reasons for the amendment in the Iowa administrative bulletin when the

Sec. 5. Section 192.110, subsection 1, Code 2001, is amended to read as follows:

1. The person has a pasteurized milk and milk products sanitation compliance rating of ninety percent or more as calculated according to the rating system as contained in the federal public health service publications, "Procedures Governing the Cooperative State-Public Health Service/Food and Drug Administration Program for Certification of Interstate Milk Shippers 1995 1999" and "Method of Making Sanitation Ratings of Milk Supplies, 1995 1999 Revision". The applicable provisions of these publications are incorporated into this section by this reference. A copy of each publication shall be on file with the department or in the office of the person subject to an inspection contract as provided in section 192.108.

Sec. 6. Section 455E.11, subsection 1, unnumbered paragraph 3, Code 2001, is amended to read as follows:

The secretary of agriculture shall submit with the report prepared-pursuant-to on a biennial basis to the governor in the same manner as provided in section 7A.3. The report shall include a proposal for the use of groundwater protection fund moneys, and a-report-of-the uses of the groundwater protection fund moneys appropriated in the two previous fiscal year years.

Sec. 7. Sections 159.10, 159.15, 159.30, and 159.37, Code 2001, are repealed.

Sec. 8. DIRECTIONS TO THE CODE EDITOR. The Code editor shall consolidate or eliminate the repeal, reserve, and transfer entries for 2001 Iowa Code sections 192.1 through 192.100, in order to enhance the readability of chapter 192. As part of consolidating or eliminating the entries, the Code editor shall provide directions to the reader that explain

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where historical information pertaining to the repeal, transfer, or reserving of those entries may be obtained.
