EDUCATION

1 Section 1. CARBONATED BEVERAGE SALES IN SCHOOLS -- STUDY.
2 The department of education shall conduct a study concerning
3 the sale of carbonated beverages to students in schools during
4 the 2001-2002 school year. The department shall require
5 school boards, or persons under the supervision of school
6 boards, to provide information to the department in records or
7 reports required by section 283A.5 with respect to school
8 breakfast and lunch programs. The information to be provided
9 shall include the number of elementary, middle, and high
10 schools within each school district that sell carbonated
11 beverages to students, the method by which the carbonated
12 beverages are sold, the number of locations within each school
13 where the sales are made, the amount of carbonated beverages
14 sold on a per-pupil basis, and the gross sales amount of such
15 carbonated beverages. The information shall not include sales
16 of carbonated beverages at extracurricular events.

17 On or before December 1, 2002, the department of education
18 shall file a report with the general assembly that contains
19 its findings and recommendations, including any proposals to
20 change or limit the sale of carbonated beverages in schools.

21 EXPLANATION

22 This bill requires the department of education to conduct a
23 study concerning the sale of carbonated beverages to students
24 in schools during the 2001-2002 school year. The department
25 shall require school boards to submit information, in records
26 or reports kept pursuant to Code section 283A.5, concerning
27 school breakfast and lunch programs, about the type and number
28 of schools in each district that sell carbonated beverages,
29 the method by which the beverages are sold, the number of
30 locations within each school where the sales are made to
31 students, the amount of such beverages sold on a per-pupil
32 basis, and the gross sales amount of such beverages in each
33 school district. The bill also provides that the department
34 of education shall file a report with the general assembly on
35 or before December 1, 2002, containing its findings and
