1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 709D.1 FEMALE GENITAL MUTILATION
2 -- FEMALE MINOR -- EDUCATION -- PENALTY.

3 1. Except as provided in subsection 2, a person who 4 knowingly performs female genital mutilation on a female minor 5 is guilty of a class "C" felony.

6 2. This section does not apply to a surgical operation 7 performed by a licensed medical practitioner that is necessary 8 for the health of a female minor or that is necessary to 9 correct an anatomical abnormality of a female minor.

10 3. In any prosecution pursuant to this section, it is not 11 an affirmative defense, and consideration shall not be given 12 to a belief of the person on whom the procedure would be 13 performed or of any other person that the female genital 14 mutilation is required as a matter of custom, ritual, or 15 standard of practice.

16 4. In addition to any other sentence imposed or counseling 17 ordered, a person convicted of female genital mutilation shall 18 also be ordered to attend, at the person's own expense, a 19 batterers' treatment program pursuant to section 708.2B. 20 5. In addition to any other court costs or assessments 21 imposed, a person convicted of female genital mutilation shall 22 pay a twenty-five dollar assessment. The moneys collected 23 under this subsection shall be deposited in the general fund 24 of the state.

6. The director of public health shall carry out appropriate education, prevention, and outreach activities to inform the public about the health risks and emotional trauma inflicted by the practice of female genital mutilation and to inform the public and the medical community of the criminal penalties contained in this section. The director shall work to obtain private funds to help finance these prevention and outreach activities.

2 This bill prohibits female genital mutilation of a female 3 minor which is the separation or surgical alteration of 4 normal, healthy, functioning female genital tissue. A person 5 who violates the provisions of the bill is guilty of a class 6 "C" felony, which is punishable by confinement of not more 7 than 10 years and a fine of at least \$1,000 but not more than 8 \$10,000. The bill provides that a licensed medical 9 professional who performs a surgical operation necessary for 10 the health of the female minor or that is necessary to correct 11 an anatomical abnormality is not in violation of the bill. 12 The bill also provides that a belief that the procedure is 13 required as a matter of custom, ritual, or standard of 14 practice is not to be considered in any prosecution pursuant 15 to the bill and is not an affirmative defense. In addition, a 16 person convicted of female genital mutilation is also required 17 to attend a batterers' treatment program and is required to 18 pay an assessment of \$25, with the moneys collected to be 19 deposited in the general fund of the state. The bill also 20 directs the director of public health to carry out 21 appropriation education, prevention, and outreach activities 22 to inform the public of the health risks, emotional trauma, 23 and criminal penalties associated with female genital 24 mutilation. 3 1. By striking everything after the enacting 4 clause, and inserting the following:

5 "Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 135.39A FEMALE GENITAL 6 MUTILATION -- EDUCATION, PREVENTION, AND OUTREACH 7 PROGRAM.

8 1. For the purposes of this section, "female 9 genital mutilation" means the separation or surgical 10 alteration of normal, healthy, functioning female 11 genital tissue.

12 2. The general assembly finds that it is in the 13 interest of the public health, safety, and welfare to 14 protect the female children of this state from the 15 physical, emotional, and psychological harm associated 16 with female genital mutilation. The general assembly 17 further finds that, although the practice of female 18 genital mutilation is an accepted practice in certain 19 cultures, individuals should be made aware of the 20 nature and extent of the potential long-term physical, 21 emotional, and psychological trauma that may result 22 from such practice. Therefore, the general assembly 23 declares that the protection of the public requires 24 the establishment of a program to educate the 25 appropriate communities concerning female genital 26 mutilation including the health risks associated with 27 this practice.

In accordance with subsection 2, the violence 28 3. 29 prevention educator of the Iowa department of public 30 health shall work in coordination with a group 31 representing victim advocacy organizations, public 32 health services, and immigrant rights organizations to 33 implement appropriate education, prevention, and 34 outreach activities to inform the public about the 35 health risks and the psychological and emotional 36 trauma inflicted by the practice of female genital The activities shall include informing 37 mutilation. 38 the medical community and the general public of any 39 criminal penalties that may apply to a person who 40 knowingly performs female genital mutilation.

41 4. The violence prevention educator of the Iowa 42 department of public health shall work in coordination 43 with victim advocacy organizations, public health 44 services, and immigrant rights organizations to 45 educate health care workers about the unique health 46 care needs of survivors of female genital mutilation. 47 5. The Iowa sexual abuse hotline shall provide 48 twenty-four-hour information, support, and referral 49 services on the subject of female genital mutilation.
