A BILL FOR 1 An Act relating to certifying law enforcement training facilities at institutions of higher education, and providing for a fee. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 2 adding the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 4. The Iowa law enforcement academy may
- 4 charge a certified law enforcement training facility
- 5 established pursuant to section 80B.12, a per student fee
- 6 sufficient to offset the administrative costs incurred by the
- 7 academy for inspecting and certifying the facilities.

- 10 80B.12 AGREEMENTS WITH OTHER AGENCIES, COLLEGES, OR

- 12 1. The director, with the approval of the council, may
- 13 enter-into-agreements-with-other shall permit public and
- 14 private agencies, public and nonpublic colleges, and
- 15 universities to-carry-out-the-intent-of-this-chapter, and
- 16 community colleges to apply for certification as a law
- 17 enforcement training facility.

1 enforcement or jailer training schools or facilities, or 2 examine the curriculum or training procedures, for which 3 application for approval has been made. Issue certificates to law enforcement training schools 5 or facilities qualifying under the regulations rules of the 6 council. **EXPLANATION** This bill relates to certifying law enforcement training 9 facilities at postsecondary educational institutions. The bill provides that the director of the Iowa law 10 11 enforcement academy, with approval of the Iowa law enforcement 12 academy council, shall permit public and private universities 13 and colleges, including community colleges, to apply for 14 certification as a law enforcement training facility. The 15 bill provides that the director, with approval of the council, 16 shall set the standards to obtain certification by 17 administrative rule. The bill provides that the rules shall 18 specifically state the standards required to obtain 19 certification. Any training facility qualifying for 20 certification based upon the standards adopted by rule shall 21 be certified. Criteria other than the standards adopted by 22 rule shall not be used as a basis for denying certification. 23 The bill provides that the Iowa law enforcement academy may 24 charge a facility certified under this bill a per student fee 25 sufficient to offset the administrative costs incurred by the 26 academy for inspecting and certifying the facilities. Under current law, only the Iowa law enforcement academy or 28 a governmental agency facility recognized pursuant to Code 29 section 80B.11, subsection 8, may provide law enforcement 30 training. 31 32 33 34
