A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act creating a criminal offense for leaving an unattended or
- 2 not properly supervised child in a motor vehicle, and
- 3 publicizing the hazards of leaving a child in a motor vehicle
- 4 and providing a penalty.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

SF 2363 HUMAN RESOURCES

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 321.8A UNATTENDED OR NOT
- 2 PROPERLY SUPERVISED CHILD IN A MOTOR VEHICLE -- PUBLICATION.
- 3 The department shall provide information to the public
- 4 concerning the hazards of leaving a child unattended or not
- 5 properly supervised in a motor vehicle. The department is
- 6 encouraged to include such information in the publication
- 7 distributed pursuant to section 321.15.
- 8 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 321.276 UNATTENDED OR NOT PROPERLY
- 9 SUPERVISED CHILD IN A MOTOR VEHICLE.
- 10 A person shall not leave a child six years of age or
- 11 younger in a motor vehicle unattended or under the supervision
- 12 of a person who is eleven years of age or younger. A person
- 13 does not violate this section if the person can maintain
- 14 visual contact with the child. A person who violates this
- 15 section commits a simple misdemeanor punishable as a scheduled
- 16 violation under section 805.8A, subsection 14, paragraph "j".
- 17 Sec. 3. Section 602.8108, subsection 2, Code Supplement
- 18 2001, is amended to read as follows:
- 2. Except as otherwise provided, the clerk of the district
- 20 court shall report and submit to the state court
- 21 administrator, not later than the fifteenth day of each month,
- 22 the fines and fees received during the preceding calendar
- 23 month. Except as provided in subsections 4, and 5, and 6, the
- 24 state court administrator shall deposit the amounts received
- 25 with the treasurer of state for deposit in the general fund of
- 26 the state. The state court administrator shall report to the
- 27 legislative fiscal bureau within thirty days of the beginning
- 28 of each fiscal quarter the amount received during the previous
- 29 quarter in the account established under this section.
- 30 Sec. 4. Section 602.8108, Code Supplement 2001, is amended
- 31 by adding the following new subsection:
- 32 NEW SUBSECTION. 7. The state court administrator shall
- 33 allocate fifty percent of the fines and fees attributable to a
- 34 violation of section 321.276 to the state department of
- 35 transportation to be used as provided in section 321.8A.

Section 805.8A, subsection 14, Code Supplement Sec. 5. 2 2001, is amended by adding the following new paragraph: NEW PARAGRAPH. j. UNATTENDED CHILD IN A MOTOR VEHICLE. 3 4 For a violation under section 321.276, the scheduled fine is 5 one hundred dollars. **EXPLANATION** 7 This bill creates a criminal offense for leaving an 8 unattended or not properly supervised child in a motor 9 vehicle. 10 The bill provides that a person shall not leave a child in 11 a motor vehicle unattended or under the supervision of a 12 person who is 11 years of age or younger. A person who is 13 able to maintain visual contact with the child in the motor 14 vehicle does not violate the bill. The bill provides that a person who violates the bill 16 commits a simple misdemeanor subject to a scheduled fine of 17 \$100. The bill provides that 50 percent of the fines and fees 19 collected for a violation of this bill shall be used by the 20 department of transportation to publicize the hazards of 21 leaving an unattended or not properly supervised child in a 22 motor vehicle. 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31
