A BILL FOR 1 An Act relating to the amount of state assistance provided to each school district to purchase textbooks for accredited nonpublic school pupils. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 301.1, Code 2001, is amended to read as
- 2 follows:
- 3 301.1 ADOPTION -- PURCHASE AND SALE -- ACCREDITED
- 4 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPIL TEXTBOOK SERVICES.
- 5 l. The board of directors of each and every school
- 6 district is hereby authorized and empowered to adopt textbooks
- 7 for the teaching of all branches that are now or may hereafter
- 8 be authorized to be taught in the public schools of the state,
- 9 and to contract for and buy said books and any and all other
- 10 necessary school supplies at said contract prices, and to sell
- 11 the same to the pupils of their respective districts at cost,
- 12 loan such textbooks to such pupils free, or rent them to such
- 13 pupils at such reasonable fee as the board shall fix, and said
- 14 money so received shall be returned to the general fund.
- 15 2. Textbooks adopted and purchased by a school district
- 16 may,-and shall, to the extent funds are appropriated by the
- 17 general assembly, be made available to pupils attending
- 18 accredited nonpublic schools upon request of the pupil or the
- 19 pupil's parent under comparable terms as made available to
- 20 pupils attending public schools. If the general assembly
- 21 appropriates moneys for purposes of making textbooks available
- 22 to accredited nonpublic school pupils, the department of
- 23 education shall ascertain the amount available to a school
- 24 district for the purchase of nonsectarian, nonreligious
- 25 textbooks for pupils attending accredited nonpublic schools.
- 26 The amount shall be in the proportion that the basic
- 27 enrollment of a participating accredited nonpublic school
- 28 bears to the sum of the basic enrollments of all participating
- 29 accredited nonpublic schools in the state for the budget year.
- 30 For purposes of this section, a "participating accredited
- 31 nonpublic school" means an accredited nonpublic school that
- 32 submits a written request on behalf of the school's pupils in
- 33 accordance with this subsection, and that certifies its actual
- 34 enrollment to the department of education by October 1,
- 35 annually. By October 15, annually, the department of

- 1 education shall certify to the director of revenue and finance
- 2 the annual amount to be paid to each school district, and the
- 3 director of revenue and finance shall draw warrants payable to
- 4 school districts in accordance with this subsection. For
- 5 purposes of this subsection, an accredited nonpublic school's
- 6 enrollment count shall include only students who are residents
- 7 of Iowa. The costs of providing textbooks to accredited
- 8 nonpublic school pupils as provided in this subsection shall
- 9 not be included in the computation of district cost under
- 10 chapter 257, but shall be shown in the budget as an expense
- 11 from miscellaneous income. Textbook expenditures made in
- 12 accordance with this subsection shall be kept on file in the
- 13 school district.
- 14 3. As used in this-paragraph subsection 2, "textbooks"
- 15 means books and loose-leaf or bound manuals, systems of
- 16 reusable instructional materials or combinations of books and
- 17 supplementary instructional materials which convey information
- 18 to the student or otherwise contribute to the learning
- 19 process, or electronic textbooks, including but not limited to
- 20 computer software, applications using computer-assisted
- 21 instruction, interactive videodisc, and other computer
- 22 courseware and magnetic media.
- 23 Sec. 2. Sections 301.29 and 301.30, Code 2001, are
- 24 repealed.
- 25 EXPLANATION
- 26 This bill provides that when the general assembly
- 27 appropriates funds for textbooks for accredited nonpublic
- 28 school pupils, the department of education must determine the
- 29 amount available to a school district for the purchase of the
- 30 textbooks based upon the proportion that the basic enrollment
- 31 of a participating accredited nonpublic school bears to the
- 32 sum of the basic enrollments of all participating accredited
- 33 nonpublic schools in the state for the budget year.
- 34 The bill directs accredited nonpublic schools to submit a
- 35 written request on behalf of the school's students and to

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1 certify their enrollments to the department by October 1 2 annually. 3 The bill directs the department to notify by October 15 4 annually each school district of the amount available for use 5 to purchase nonsectarian, nonreligious textbooks for the 6 participating accredited nonpublic schools. The bill directs school districts to keep on file textbook 8 expenditures made for accredited nonpublic schools. The bill repeals a provision that establishes a procedure 10 by which the department pays claims submitted by school 11 districts for the costs of providing textbook services. 12 provision provides for the proration of the amounts paid to 13 school districts if the general assembly does not provide 14 sufficient funds. 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34
