As part of implementing the reduction made in this section, notwithstanding the annual salaries established under 2001 Iowa Acts, chapter 190, section 3, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, each of those salaries shall be reduced by applying a 5 percent reduction to the portion of the salary attributable to the period beginning on the effective date of this Act through June 30, 2002. Subsection 2 does not apply to appointed executive branch officers subject to this subsection.
