Section 1. Section 602.6306, subsection 2, Code 2001, is 2 amended to read as follows:

3 2. District associate judges also have jurisdiction in 4 civil actions for money judgment where the amount in 5 controversy does not exceed ten thousand dollars, jurisdiction 6 over involuntary commitment, treatment, or hospitalization 7 proceedings under chapters 125 and 229, jurisdiction of 8 indictable misdemeanors, and felony violations of section 9 321J.2, and felony arraignments, jurisdiction to enter a 10 temporary or emergency order of protection under chapter 236, 11 and to make court appointments and set hearings in criminal 12 matters, jurisdiction to enter orders in probate which do not 13 require notice and hearing and to set hearings in actions 14 under chapter 633, and the jurisdiction provided in section 15 602.7101 when designated as a judge of the juvenile court. 16 While presiding in these subject matters a district associate 17 judge shall employ district judges' practice and procedure. 18 EXPLANATION

19 This bill relates to the jurisdiction of district associate 20 judges. The bill provides that a district associate judge may 21 exercise jurisdiction over an arraignment involving a felony. 22 Current law provides that in criminal proceedings, a district 23 associate judge has jurisdiction over indictable misdemeanors 24 and felony offenses involving operating while intoxicated. 25 An arraignment is generally defined as a proceeding where

26 the criminal charge is read to the defendant and the defendant 27 enters a plea of "guilty" or "not guilty" to the charge.
