	A BILL FOR
1	An Act relating to expenditure by school districts of Iowa early
2	intervention block grant program moneys for teacher
3	compensation reform and student achievement activities.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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- 1 Section 1. Section 256D.2, Code 2001, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 256D.2 PROGRAM EXPENDITURES.
- 4 1. A Except as provided in subsection 2, a school district
- 5 shall expend funds received pursuant to section 256D.4 at the
- 6 kindergarten through grade three levels to reduce class sizes
- 7 to the state goal of seventeen students for every one teacher
- 8 and to achieve a higher level of student success in the basic
- 9 skills, especially reading. In order to support these
- 10 efforts, school districts may expend funds received pursuant
- 11 to section 256D.4 at the kindergarten through grade three
- 12 level on programs, instructional support, and materials that
- 13 include, but are not limited to, the following: additional
- 14 licensed instructional staff; additional support for students,
- 15 such as before and after school programs, tutoring, and
- 16 intensive summer programs; the acquisition and administration
- 17 of diagnostic reading assessments; the implementation of
- 18 research-based instructional intervention programs for
- 19 students needing additional support; the implementation of
- 20 all-day, everyday kindergarten programs; and the provision of
- 21 classroom teachers with intensive training programs to improve
- 22 reading instruction and professional development in best
- 23 practices, including but not limited to training programs
- 24 related to instruction to increase students' phonemic
- 25 awareness, reading abilities, and comprehension skills.
- 26 2. In addition to the expenditures allowed under
- 27 subsection 1, a school district that has reduced the average
- 28 size of the kindergarten, first, second, and third grade
- 29 classes in the district to the state goal may expend funds
- 30 received pursuant to section 256D.4 for teacher compensation
- 31 reform and student achievement activities approved by the
- 32 Seventy-ninth General Assembly or future general assemblies.
- 33 EXPLANATION
- 34 This bill allows a school district that has reduced its
- 35 average K-3 class sizes to the state goal of 17 students for

1 every one teacher to use its Iowa early intervention block 2 grant program moneys for teacher compensation reform and 3 student achievement activities approved by the Seventy-ninth 4 General Assembly or future general assemblies.
