# A BILL FOR

1	An	Act providing for the establishment of a commission on the
2		status of Iowans of Asian and Pacific Islander heritage within
3		the department of human rights.
4	BE	IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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Section 1. Sections 2 through 10 of this Act are enacted
 2 as subchapter 11 of Code chapter 216A.

3 Sec. 2. Section 216A.1, Code 2001, is amended by adding 4 the following new subsection:

5 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 8. Division on the status of Iowans of 6 Asian and Pacific Islander heritage.

7 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 216A.151 DEFINITIONS.

8 For purposes of this subchapter, unless the context 9 otherwise requires:

10 1. "Administrator" means the administrator of the division 11 on the status of Iowans of Asian and Pacific Islander heritage 12 of the department of human rights.

13 2. "Asian and Pacific Islander" means an individual from14 any of the countries of Asia or islands of the Pacific.

15 3. "Commission" means the commission on the status of16 Iowans of Asian and Pacific Islander heritage.

17 4. "Division" means the division on the status of Iowans18 of Asian and Pacific Islander heritage of the department of19 human rights.

20 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 216A.152 ESTABLISHMENT.

A commission on the status of Iowans of Asian and Pacific Islander heritage is established consisting of nine members appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by the senate. Members shall be appointed representing every geographical area of the state. The members of the commissic shall appoint one of the members to serve as chairperson of the commission.

28 Sec. 5. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 216A.153 TERM OF OFFICE.

Four of the members appointed to the initial commission shall be designated by the governor to serve two-year terms, and five shall be designated by the governor to serve fouryear terms. Succeeding appointments shall be for a term of four years. Vacancies in the membership shall be filled for the remainder of the term of the original appointment. Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 216A.154 MEETINGS OF THE

1 COMMISSION.

2 The commission shall meet at least four times each year, 3 and shall hold special meetings on the call of the 4 chairperson. The commission shall adopt rules pursuant to 5 chapter 17A as it deems necessary for the conduct of its 6 business. The members of the commission shall be reimbursed 7 for actual expenses while engaged in their official duties. A 8 member may also be eligible to receive compensation as 9 provided in section 7E.6.

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10 Sec. 7. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 216A.155 DUTIES.

11 The commission shall:

1. Advise the governor and the general assembly on issues
 13 confronting Asian and Pacific Islander persons in this state,
 14 including the unique problems of non-English-speaking
 15 immigrants and refugees.

16 2. Advise the governor and the general assembly of 17 administrative and legislative changes necessary to ensure 18 Asian and Pacific Islander persons access to benefits and 19 services provided to people in this state.

3. Recommend to the governor and the general assembly any revisions in the state's affirmative action program and other steps necessary to eliminate underutilization of Asian and Pacific Islander persons in the state's workforce.

4. Recommend legislation to the governor and the general
25 assembly designed to improve the economic and social condition
26 of Asian and Pacific Islander persons in this state.

5. Serve as a conduit to state government for
28 organizations of Asian and Pacific Islander persons in this
29 state.

30 6. Serve as a referral agency to assist Asian and Pacific
31 Islander persons in securing access to state agencies and
32 programs.

33 7. Serve as a liaison with federal, state, and local
34 governmental units, and private organizations on matters
35 relating to the Asian and Pacific Islander persons in this

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1 state.

8. Perform or contract for the performance of studies
 3 designed to suggest solutions to the problems of Asian and
 4 Pacific Islander persons in the areas of education,
 5 employment, human rights, health, housing, social welfare, and
 6 other related areas.

9. Implement programs designed to solve the problems of
8 Asian and Pacific Islander persons when authorized by law.
9 10. Publicize the accomplishments of Asian and Pacific
10 Islander persons and their contributions to this state.
11 11. Work with other state and federal agencies and
12 organizations to develop small business opportunities and
13 promote economic development for Asian and Pacific Islander
14 persons.

15 12. Supervise development of an Asian and Pacific Islander 16 trade primer, outlining Asian and Pacific Islander customs, 17 cultural traditions, and business practices, including 18 language usage for use by Iowa's export community.

19 13. Cooperate with other state and federal agencies and 20 organizations to develop improved state trade relations with 21 Asian and Pacific Islander countries.

22 Sec. 8. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 216A.156 REVIEW OF GRANT 23 APPLICATIONS AND BUDGET REQUESTS.

Before the submission of an application, state departments and agencies shall consult with the commission concerning applications for federal funding that will have its primary reffect on persons of Asian and Pacific Islander heritage in Nova. The commission shall advise the governor and the director of revenue and finance concerning any state agency budget request that will have its primary effect on persons of Asian and Pacific Islander heritage in Iowa.

32 Sec. 9. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 216A.157 ADDITIONAL AUTHORITY.
33 The commission may:

Enter into contracts, within the limit of funds made
 available, with individuals, organizations, and institutions

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1 for services.

2 2. Solicit and accept grants of moneys or property from 3 the federal government or any other source, and upon its own 4 order use this money, property, or other resources to perform 5 the duties of the commission.

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6 Sec. 10. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 216A.158 EMPLOYEES AND 7 RESPONSIBILITY.

8 The commission shall employ necessary employees. Pursuant 9 to section 216A.2, the commission shall have responsibility 10 for budgetary and personnel decisions for the commission and 11 division. The administrator shall administer programs and 12 policies as determined by the commission.

13 Sec. 11. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 216A.159 STATE AGENCY ASSISTANCE. 14 On the request of the commission, state departments and 15 agencies shall supply the commission with advisory staff 16 services on matters relating to the jurisdiction of the 17 commission. The commission shall cooperate and coordinate its 18 activities with other state agencies to the highest possible 19 degree.

20 Sec. 12. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 216A.160 ANNUAL REPORT.

Not later than February 1 of each year, the commission shall file an electronic report with the governor and the general assembly of its activities for the previous calendar year. With the report, the commission may submit any recommendations pertaining to its activities and shall submit recommendations for legislative consideration and other action it deems necessary.

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### EXPLANATION

This bill establishes a division on the status of Iowans of 30 Asian and Pacific Islander heritage within the department of 31 human rights. The commission on the status of Iowans of Asian 32 and Pacific Islander heritage is also created. The commission 33 consists of nine members, appointed by the governor and 34 subject to senate confirmation. Duties of the commission are 35 specified.

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# SENATE FILE 411 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for **Senate File 411** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 411 provides for the establishment of a Commission on the Status of Towans of Asian and Pacific Islander heritage within the Department of Human Rights.

#### BACKGROUND

In FY 2000, the Department of Human Rights conducted a study of the status of persons of Asian and Pacific Islander descent in the State of Iowa. The study focused on the areas of education, language development, employment, human rights, health, housing, and social welfare. A report of the findings and recommendations determined by the study was submitted to the General Assembly.

In FY 2001, the Department of Human Rights was appropriated \$40,000 in the Health and Human Rights Appropriations Bill to establish an outreach program for Asian and Pacific Islanders.

#### ASSUMPTIONS

- 1. The estimate is based on the salary and support costs for 1.0 FTE position for a Division Administrator.
- The estimate also includes costs associated with establishing and maintaining a Commission consisting of nine members that must meet a minimum of four times each year. These costs include the actual expenses associated with attending meetings, including mileage, meals, and lodging when applicable.
- 3. The Department of Human Rights has requested an appropriation of \$103,000 and 1.0 FTE position for FY 2002 for the establishment of a Commission on the Status of Asian and Pacific Islanders. The Governor's FY 2002 recommendation is \$93,000.

## FISCAL IMPACT

Senate File 411 would have a General Fund fiscal impact of approximately \$93,000 annually.
