1 Section 1. IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY LAND USE POLICIES STUDY. 2 The general assembly recognizes the importance of preserving 3 the state's finite supply of agricultural land. It is the 4 intent of the general assembly and the policy of this state to 5 provide for the orderly use and development of land and 6 related natural resources in Iowa for residential, commercial, 7 industrial, and recreational purposes. It is further the 8 intent of the general assembly to use state and local tax 9 policy and other state policies as incentives to encourage 10 smart and orderly growth in the state of Iowa. It is further 11 the policy of the state to discourage conversion of prime 12 agricultural land to other uses while providing for a balance 13 between legitimate public purposes and private property 14 rights.

Iowa state university shall conduct a study of land use policies in this state and in other states. The study shall consider policies discouraging conversion of agricultural land, such as the limitation on the power of public agencies is to impose special assessments on agricultural land, limitations on the ability to declare a farm or farm operation a nuisance, and imposition of a state regulatory scheme that is less restrictive on farms or farm operations. 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1 particular attention to smart growth policies which prohibit 2 financial assistance to those cities and counties that are not 3 adhering to a comprehensive or other strategic development 4 plan.

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5 The study shall review current state and local tax 6 assessments and incentives that encourage development and 7 affect, directly or indirectly, the course of development in 8 the state. The university shall also study local government 9 economic development programs and infrastructure finance 10 programs and the effect of those programs on development. The 11 study shall give particular attention to finding a balance 12 between state and local policies and taxation that require 13 increased government regulation and those providing the 14 private sector an incentive to act in a way that furthers 15 state and local land use policies.

16 Iowa state university may request from any state agency or 17 official the information and assistance needed to perform the 18 study.

19 Iowa state university shall submit a final report and an 20 executive summary of the final report to the general assembly 21 no later than January 2, 2002. The final report and executive 22 summary shall contain suggested goals for the state regarding 23 land use and recommendations for utilization of a smart growth 24 policy.

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## EXPLANATION

This bill requires Iowa state university to conduct a study of land use policies if funds are appropriated for the study. The university is required to study current state and local tax incentives for development of land and related natural resources. The university also is required to study policies in place in the state of Iowa which discourage conversion of agricultural land. The study is required to consider the feasibility of preparation of county land use inventories and the creation or expansion of agricultural areas.

35 The university is required to study Iowa's annexation laws

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1 and zoning laws.

2 The study is also required to review smart growth policies 3 in other states and those currently being used in the state of 4 Iowa. Smart growth policies which are to be focused upon 5 include those that prohibit financial assistance to cities and 6 counties that do not adhere to a comprehensive plan or other 7 strategic development plan.

8 The university is required to study whether current state 9 and local tax incentives encourage or affect development. The 10 university is to study local government economic development 11 programs and infrastructure finance programs and their effect 12 on development. The study shall give attention to government 13 regulation and government incentives regarding land use 14 polices.

IS Iowa state university is required to submit a final report and executive summary to the general assembly no later than January 2, 2002. The final report and executive summary of the final report shall contain suggested goals for the state regarding land use and recommendations for utilization of a smart growth policy.

## ASSUMPTIONS

- The study would require 1.75 faculty and 4 half-time graduate assistants (\$170,000).
- 2. The study would require a legal consultant for approximately 200 hours (\$40,000).
- 3. Publishing the study report would cost \$45,000.
