SENATE FILE 482 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for **Senate File 482** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 482 amends Section 648.1, <u>Code of Iowa</u>, to allow a seller of real property seeking to recover possession of the real property to use an action for forcible entry and detainer when the buyer of the real property defaults on the contract for deed governing sale. Senate File 482 also amends Section 631.1, <u>Code of Iowa</u>, to allow such actions on contract for deed and actions in which the defendant continues in possession after foreclosure to be pursued as small claims actions in Small Claims Court.

ASSUMPTIONS

- Current property foreclosure cases are handled in District Court.
- 2. Forcible entry and retainer is normally used when evicting a renter.
- 3. Provisions contained in Senate File 482 may result in Small Claims Court considering cases involving title to real property not generally dealt with in Small Claims Court. These cases are more complex and may require two to three days to conduct. The actual impact on the Small Claims Court cannot be determined.

FISCAL IMPACT

Senate File 482 would increase costs to the Judicial Branch. However, due to insufficient information, a reliable estimate of the impact cannot be provided.
