Section 1. HEALTHY IOWANS TOBACCO TRUST -- APPROPRIATIONS

3 A woman who meets the criteria of this paragraph shall be 4 presumptively eligible for medical assistance.

5 Sec. 10. Section 901B.1, subsection 1, paragraph c, Code
6 2001, is amended by adding the following new subparagraph:
7 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (5) A substance abuse treatment

8 facility as established and operated by the Iowa department of 9 public health.

10 Sec. 11. Section 901B.1, subsection 4, paragraph a, Code 11 2001, is amended to read as follows:

31 Sec. 13. REFERENCES. References in this Act to the 32 tobacco settlement endowment fund and to the savings account 33 for healthy Iowans of the tobacco settlement endowment fund 34 are references to the fund and the account pursuant to section 35 12.65, Code 2001, and, unless otherwise provided,

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1 appropriations from the fund and the account are references to 2 appropriations of moneys in the fund and the account on or 3 before June 30, 2001, and such moneys shall remain available 4 for appropriation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, 5 and ending June 30, 2002, as provided in this Act.

6 Sec. 14. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 4 of this Act, relating 7 to nonreversion of funds remaining unencumbered or unobligated 8 which were appropriated for the purchase of service contract 9 providers, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect 10 upon enactment.

11 Sec. 15. CONTINGENT EFFECTIVE DATE. The section in this 12 Act amending section 12.65 shall take effect only if 2001 Iowa 13 Acts, Senate File 532 is enacted. If 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate 14 File 532 is not enacted, the section in this Act amending 15 section 12.65 shall not take effect and references in this Act 16 to the healthy Iowans tobacco trust are references to the 17 tobacco settlement endowment fund created in section 12.65, 18 Code 2001. If 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate File 532 is not enacted, 19 all moneys paid to the state pursuant to the master settlement 20 agreement as defined in section 453C.1 shall be deposited in 21 the tobacco settlement endowment fund created in section 22 12.65, Code 2001.

## EXPLANATION

This bill relates to and makes appropriations from the tobacco settlement endowment fund.

26 The bill makes the following appropriations to the 27 department of human services:

1. To maintain the reimbursement rate for all noninstitutional providers at the rate paid under the federal Medicare program during FY 2000-2001, and for continuation of the resource-based relative value system, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002: 33 \$11,595,718.

34 2. To maintain the reimbursement rate for dental services 35 at the usual and customary rate as provided during FY 2000-

1 2001 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending
2 June 30, 2002: \$3,814,973.

3 3. To maintain the cost-of-living adjustment for 4 rehabilitative treatment services providers as provided during 5 FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and 6 ending June 30, 2002: \$3,243,026.

7 4. To maintain the cost-of-living adjustment for adoption,
8 independent living, shelter care, and home studies services
9 providers as provided during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year
10 beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002: \$468,967.
11 5. To maintain the reimbursement rate for hospitals as

12 provided during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning 13 July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002: \$3,035,278.

14 6. To maintain the reimbursement rate for home health 15 agencies at the rate provided to such agencies as provided 16 during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 17 2001, and ending June 30, 2002: \$2,108,279.

18 7. To maintain the reimbursement rate for critical access 19 hospitals at the rate provided such hospitals under the 20 federal Medicare program during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal 21 year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002: 22 \$250,000.

8. To maintain the expansion of home health care services
and habilitative day care services under the medical
assistance program for children with special needs:
\$1,975,496.

9. To maintain the expansion of respite care services
28 provided through home and community-based waiver services
29 under the medical assistance program: \$1,137,309.

30 10. To maintain the reimbursement rate as provided during 31 FY 2000-2001 for service providers under the purview of the 32 department of human services: \$545,630.

The bill provides \$200,000 for supplementation of the appropriation for the children's health insurance program. The bill provides \$4,000,000 for supplementation of the

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1 medical assistance appropriation.

2 The bill appropriates \$250,000 to the department of human 3 services to provide coverage under the medical assistance 4 program to certain women who require treatment for breast or 5 cervical cancer. The bill also codifies language to include 6 this optional category of coverage under the medical 7 assistance program.

8 The bill appropriates \$9,345,394 to the Iowa department of 9 public health for the tobacco use prevention and control 10 program and \$11,900,000 for additional substance abuse 11 treatment. Under this appropriation, the department is 12 directed to enhance the quality of and to expand capacity to 13 provide 24-hour substance abuse treatment programs for 14 children; to expand the length of individual client substance 15 abuse treatment plans, as necessary to reduce recidivism; to 16 share research-based best practices for treatment with 17 substance abuse treatment facilities; to develop a results-18 based funding approach for substance abuse treatment services; 19 and to develop a program to encourage individuals who are 20 successfully managing their substance abuse problems to serve 21 as role models.

The bill appropriates \$2,550,000 to the Iowa department of public health for development of a healthy Iowans 2010 plan including the use of up to the following amounts for the following purposes: \$1,250,000 for core public health functions including home health care and public health nursing rervices contracted through a formula by local boards of health, to enhance disease and injury prevention services; \$400,000 for the implementation and support of a coordinated system of delivery of trauma and emergency medical services; \$437,000 for the poison control center; \$300,000 for cervices in environmental epidemiology; \$81,500 for prevention strategies to address the leading causes of deaths of Iowans; and \$81,500 for the childhood lead poisoning prevention program.

The bill provides that any moneys remaining at the end of the fiscal year from the appropriation for the fiscal year peginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, for assistance to counties with limited county mental health, mental retardation, and developmental disabilities services fund balances to pay reimbursement increases, is to not revert, but is to be deposited in the healthy Iowans tobacco trust to be used for the purposes of the trust. The bill also amends Code section 12.65, the tobacco

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1 settlement endowment fund, to rename the fund the healthy 2 Iowans tobacco trust. The bill also provides that moneys 3 appropriated from the healthy Iowans tobacco trust from the 4 endowment for Iowa's health account of the tobacco settlement 5 trust fund established in Code section 12E.12 and from any 6 other source are to be deposited in the healthy Iowans tobacco 7 trust. The bill eliminates the savings account for healthy 8 Iowans that was established within the tobacco settlement 9 endowment fund.

The bill provides that the department of public health 10 11 shall establish a substance abuse treatment facility to 12 provide a structured substance abuse treatment program for 13 persons who are on probation and under the supervision of a 14 judicial district department of correctional services. The 15 bill provides that the department of public health and the 16 department of corrections shall enter into a Code chapter 28E 17 agreement to assist the department in establishing security 18 for the facility. The bill provides that a judicial district 19 may, with the approval of the department of public health and 20 the department of corrections, place a person who is on 21 probation at the substance abuse treatment facility to assist 22 the person in complying with the terms and conditions of 23 probation.

The bill establishes a substance abuse treatment facility advisory council within the Iowa department of public health to advise and make recommendations to the director of public health. The members of the council shall consist of the directors of the eight judicial district departments of correctional services, and representatives of the judicial branch, the Iowa department of public health, the department of corrections, and the governor's office of drug control policy.

33 The bill provides that moneys appropriated in the bill that 34 are unexpended or unencumbered at the end of the fiscal year 35 beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, are to

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1 revert to the healthy Iowans tobacco trust. 2 The bill provides that references in the bill to the 3 tobacco settlement endowment fund and to the savings account 4 for healthy Iowans are to the fund and the account as created 5 in section 12.65, Code 2001, and that unless otherwise 6 provided, appropriations from the fund and the account are 7 from moneys in the fund and the account on or before June 30, 8 2001, and such moneys are to remain available for 9 appropriation in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and 10 ending June 30, 2002, as provided in the bill. The bill provides that the section of the bill relating to 11 12 nonreversion of moneys appropriated for purchase of service 13 contract providers takes effect upon enactment. The bill provides that the section in the bill amending 14 15 section 12.65 takes effect only if 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate File 16 532 takes effect and that if 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate File 532 17 is not enacted, the section in the bill amending section 12.65 18 does not take effect and the references to the healthy Iowans 19 tobacco trust are references to the tobacco settlement 20 endowment fund created in section 12.65, Code 2001. If 2001 21 Iowa Acts, Senate File 532 is not enacted, all moneys paid to 22 the state under the master settlement agreement are to be 23 deposited in the tobacco settlement endowment fund created in 24 section 12.65, Code 2001. 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35

If 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate 30 File 532 is not enacted, the section in this Act amending 31 section 12.65 shall not take effect and references in this Act 32 to the healthy Iowans tobacco trust are references to the 33 tobacco settlement endowment fund created in section 12.65, 34 Code 2001. If 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate File 532 is not enacted, 85 all moneys paid to the state pursuant to the master settlement

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1 agreement as defined in section 453C.1 shall be deposited in 2 the tobacco settlement endowment fund created in section 3 12.65, Code 2001.

EXPLANATION

5 This bill relates to and makes appropriations from the 6 tobacco settlement endowment fund.

7 The bill makes the following appropriations to the 8 department of human services:

9 1. Unless otherwise provided to maintain the reimbursement 10 rate for all noninstitutional providers at the rate paid under 11 the federal Medicare program during FY 2000-2001, and for 12 continuation of the resource-based relative value system, for 13 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 14 2002: \$11,595,718.

15 2. To maintain the reimbursement rate for dental services 16 at the usual and customary rate as provided during FY 2000-17 2001 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending 18 June 30, 2002: \$3,814,973.

19 3. To maintain the cost-of-living adjustment for 20 rehabilitative treatment services providers as provided during 21 FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and 22 ending June 30, 2002: \$3,243,026.

4. To maintain the cost-of-living adjustment for adoption,
independent living, shelter care, and home studies services
providers as provided during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year
beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002: \$468,967.
5. To maintain the reimbursement rate for hospitals as
provided during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning
July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002: \$3,035,278.

30 6. To maintain the reimbursement rate for home health 31 agencies at the rate provided to such agencies as provided 32 during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 33 2001, and ending June 30, 2002: \$2,108,279.

34 7. To maintain the reimbursement rate for critical access35 hospitals at the rate provided such hospitals under the

1 federal Medicare program during FY 2000-2001, for the fiscal 2 year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002: 3 \$250,000.

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8. To maintain the expansion of home health care services
5 and habilitative day care services under the medical
6 assistance program for children with special needs:
7 \$1,975,496.

8 9. To maintain the expansion of respite care services 9 provided through home and community-based waiver services 10 under the medical assistance program: \$1,137,309.

11 10. To maintain the reimbursement rate as provided during 12 FY 2000-2001 for service providers under the purview of the 13 department of human services: \$545,630.

14 The bill provides \$200,000 for supplementation of the 15 appropriation for the children's health insurance program. 16 The bill provides \$4,000,000 for supplementation of the 17 medical assistance appropriation.

The bill appropriates \$250,000 to the department of human services to provide coverage under the medical assistance program to certain women who require treatment for breast or cervical cancer. The bill also codifies language to include this optional category of coverage under the medical assistance program.

The bill appropriates \$9,345,394 to the Iowa department of public health for the tobacco use prevention and control program and \$11,900,000 for additional substance abuse treatment. Under this appropriation, the department is directed to enhance the quality of and to expand capacity to provide 24-hour substance abuse treatment programs for children; to expand the length of individual client substance abuse treatment plans, as necessary to reduce recidivism; to share research-based best practices for treatment with substance abuse treatment facilities; to develop a resultsabuse treatment plans, as necessary to reduce treatment services; and to develop a program to encourage individuals who are

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1 successfully managing their substance abuse problems to serve
2 as role models.

3 The bill appropriates \$2,550,000 to the Iowa department of 4 public health for development of a healthy Iowans 2010 plan 5 including the use of up to the following amounts for the 6 following purposes: \$1,250,000 for core public health 7 functions including home health care and public health nursing 8 services contracted through a formula by local boards of 9 health, to enhance disease and injury prevention services; 10 \$400,000 for the implementation and support of a coordinated 11 system of delivery of trauma and emergency medical services; 12 \$437,000 for the poison control center; \$300,000 for 13 development of scientific and medical expertise in 14 environmental epidemiology; \$81,500 for prevention strategies 15 to address the leading causes of deaths of Iowans; and \$81,500 16 for the childhood lead poisoning prevention program. The bill appropriates \$610,000 to the department of 17 18 corrections for day programming and the drug court program. The bill appropriates \$146,750 to the property tax relief 19 20 fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending 21 June 30, 2002, for assistance to counties with limited county 22 mental health, mental retardation, and developmental 23 disabilities services fund balances to pay reimbursement 24 increases in the same amount as provided in the fiscal year 25 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001. The bill appropriates \$1,153,250 from the savings account 26 27 for healthy Iowans created within the tobacco settlement 28 endowment fund created in section 12.65, Code 2001, to the 29 Iowa empowerment fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 30 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, for deposit in the school 31 ready children grants account and provides for distributing 32 the moneys.

33 The bill appropriates \$2,000,000 from the savings account 34 for healthy Iowans created within the tobacco settlement 35 endowment fund created in section 12.65, Code 2001, to the

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1 Iowa department of public health for the fiscal year beginning 2 July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, for establishing and 3 operating a substance abuse treatment facility and providing 4 staffing for the facility to be used to provide substance 5 abuse treatment for persons on probation and under the 6 supervision of a judicial district department of correctional 7 services.

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8 The bill provides that any moneys remaining at the end of 9 the fiscal year from the appropriation for the fiscal year 10 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001, for 11 assistance to counties with limited county mental health, 12 mental retardation, and developmental disabilities services 13 fund balances to pay reimbursement increases, is to not 14 revert, but is to be deposited in the healthy Iowans tobacco 15 trust to be used for the purposes of the trust.

The bill also amends Code section 12.65, the tobacco settlement endowment fund, to rename the fund the healthy Is Iowans tobacco trust. The bill also provides that moneys appropriated from the healthy Iowans tobacco trust from the endowment for Iowa's health account of the tobacco settlement trust fund established in Code section 12E.12 and from any cother source are to be deposited in the healthy Iowans tobacco trust. The bill eliminates the savings account for healthy Iowans that was established within the tobacco settlement endowment fund.

The bill provides that the department of public health shall establish a substance abuse treatment facility to provide a structured substance abuse treatment program for persons who are on probation and under the supervision of a judicial district department of correctional services. The bill provides that the department of public health and the department of corrections shall enter into a Code chapter 28E agreement to assist the department in establishing security for the facility. The bill provides that a judicial district may, with the approval of the department of public health and

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1 the department of corrections, place a person who is on 2 probation at the substance abuse treatment facility to assist 3 the person in complying with the terms and conditions of 4 probation.

5 The bill establishes a substance abuse treatment facility 6 advisory council within the Iowa department of public health 7 to advise and make recommendations to the director of public 8 health. The members of the council shall consist of the 9 directors of the eight judicial district departments of 10 correctional services, and representatives of the judicial 11 branch, the Iowa department of public nealth, the department 12 of corrections, and the governor's office of drug control 13 policy.

14 The bill provides that moneys appropriated in the bill that 15 are unexpended or unencumbered at the end of the fiscal year 16 beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, are to 17 revert to the healthy Iowans tobacco trust.

18 The bill provides that references in the bill to the 19 tobacco settlement endowment fund and to the savings account 20 for healthy Iowans are to the fund and the account as created 21 in section 12.65, Code 2001, and that unless otherwise 22 provided, appropriations from the fund and the account are 23 from moneys in the fund and the account on or before June 30, 24 2001, and such moneys are to remain available for 25 appropriation in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and 26 ending June 30, 2002, as provided in the bill.

The bill provides that the section of the bill relating to nonreversion of moneys appropriated for purchase of service contract providers and the section of the bill relating to the transfer of moneys remaining in the savings account for healthy Iowans on June 30, 2001, to the healthy Iowans tobacco 22 trust take effect upon enactment.

The bill provides that the section in the bill amending 34 section 12.65 takes effect only if 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate File 35 532 takes effect and that if 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate File 532

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1 is not enacted, the section in the bill amending section 12.65 2 does not take effect and the references to the healthy Iowans 3 tobacco trust are references to the tobacco settlement 4 endowment fund created in section 12.65, Code 2001. If 2001 5 Iowa Acts, Senate File 532 is not enacted, all moneys paid to 6 the state under the master settlement agreement are to be 7 deposited in the tobacco settlement endowment fund created in 8 section 12.65, Code 2001.

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
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

A woman is considered screened for breast and cervical cancer under this subparagraph if the woman is screened by any provider or entity, and the state grantee of the United States centers for disease control and prevention funds under Title XV of the federal Public Health

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Services Act has elected to include screening activities by that provider or entity as screening activities pursuant to Title XV of the federal Public Health Services Act. This screening includes but is not limited to breast or cervical cancer screenings or related diagnostic services provided by family planning or community health centers and breast cancer screenings funded by the Susan G. Komen foundation which are provided to women who meet the eligibility requirements established by the state grantee of the United States centers for disease control and prevention funds under Title XV of the federal Public Health Services Act.

(4) Are not otherwise covered under creditable coverage as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 300gg(c).

A woman who meets the criteria of this paragraph shall be presumptively eligible for medical assistance.

Sec. 10. Section 901B.1, subsection 1, paragraph c, Code 2001, is amended by adding the following new subparagraph:

<u>NEW SUBPARAGRAPH</u>. (5) A substance abuse treatment facility as established and operated by the Iowa department of public health.

Sec. 11. Section 901B.1, subsection 4, paragraph a, Code 2001, is amended to read as follows:

a. The district department of correctional services shall place an individual committed to it under section 907.3 to the sanction and level of supervision which is appropriate to the individual based upon a current risk assessment evaluation. Placements may be to levels two and three of the corrections continuum. The district department may, with the approval of the Iowa department of public health and the department of corrections, place an individual in a level three substance abuse treatment facility established pursuant to section 135.130, to assist the individual in complying with a condition of probation. The district department may, with the approval of the department of corrections, place an individual in a level four violator facility established pursuant to section 904.207 only as a penalty for a violation of a condition imposed under this section. Sec. 12. 2000 Iowa Acts, chapter 1221, section 1, subsection 1, paragraph c, is amended to read as follows:

c. To provide a cost-of-living adjustment for the fiscal year July 1, 2000, through June 30, 2001, of 5 percent to rehabilitative treatment and support services providers under the-medical-assistance-program receiving child and family services reimbursements:

.....\$ 3,100,000

Sec. 13. REVERSION. Any moneys appropriated under this Act that are unexpended or unencumbered at the end of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, shall revert to the healthy Iowans tobacco trust.

Sec. 14. REFERENCES. References in this Act to the tobacco settlement endowment fund and to the savings account for healthy Iowans of the tobacco settlement endowment fund are references to the fund and the account pursuant to section 12.65, Code 2001, and, unless otherwise provided, appropriations from the fund and the account are references to appropriations of moneys in the fund and the account on or before June 30, 2001, and such moneys shall remain available for appropriation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, as provided in this Act.

Sec. 15. EFFECTIVE DATES.

1. Section 3, subsection 3, of this Act relating to transfer of the moneys remaining in the savings account for healthy Iowans created within the tobacco settlement endowment fund created in section 12.65, Code 2001, on June 30, 2001, to the healthy Iowans tobacco trust, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

2. Section 4 of this Act, relating to nonreversion of funds remaining unencumbered or unobligated which were appropriated for the purchase of service contract providers, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

Sec. 16. CONTINGENT EFFECTIVE DATE. The section in this Act amending section 12.65 shall take effect only if 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate File 532 is enacted. If 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate File 532 is not enacted, the section in this Act amending section 12.65 shall not take effect and references in this Act to the healthy Iowans tobacco trust are references to the tobacco settlement endowment fund created in section 12.65, Code 2001. If 2001 Iowa Acts, Senate File 532 is not enacted, all moneys paid to the state pursuant to the master settlement agreement as defined in section 453C.1 shall be deposited in the tobacco settlement endowment fund created in section 12.65, Code 2001.
