A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to state general fund expenditure limitation

2 requirements for transmission of the state budget by the

3 governor and passage of the state budget by the general

4 assembly.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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SF & APPHOPRIATIONS

Section 1. Section 8.54, subsections 7 and 8, Code 2001, 2 are amended by striking the subsections and inserting in lieu 3 thereof the following:

7. The governor shall transmit to the general assembly, in accordance with section 8.21, a budget which does not exceed the state general fund expenditure limitation. The general assembly shall pass a budget which does not exceed the state general fund expenditure limitation. The governor shall not transmit a budget with recommended appropriations in excess of the state general fund expenditure limitation and the general assembly shall not pass a budget with appropriations in excess of the state general fund expenditure limitation. In complying with the requirements of this subsection, the governor and the general assembly shall not rely on any anticipated reversion of appropriations or other funds in order to meet the state general fund expenditure limitation.

18 This bill amends Code section 8.54, relating to the budget 19 transmission and passage provision of the state general fund 20 expenditure limitation.

The bill strikes and rewrites two subsections. In doing 22 so, the bill eliminates a requirement that the governor in 23 submitting a budget under Code section 8.21, and the general 24 assembly in passing a budget, not have recurring expenditures 25 in excess of recurring revenues. Rather the bill requires 26 that the budgets transmitted by the governor and passed by the 27 general assembly do not exceed the state general fund 28 expenditure limitation.

The bill also prohibits the governor from transmitting a 30 budget with recommended appropriations in excess of the state 31 general fund expenditure limitation and the general assembly 32 from passing a budget with appropriations in excess of the 33 limitation. The bill provides, in applying the expenditure 34 limitation requirements, that the governor and the general 35 assembly shall not rely on any anticipated reversion of
