Section 1. Section 805.6, subsection 5, Code 2001, is amended to read as follows:

5. The uniform citation and complaint shall contain a place for the verification of the officer issuing the complaint. The complaint may be verified in-accordance-with section-622:1 before the chief officer of the law enforcement agency, or the chief officer's designee.
