# SENATE FILE 98 FISCAL NOTE

A fiscal note for **Senate File 98** is hereby submitted pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Data used in developing this fiscal note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau to members of the Legislature upon request.

Senate File 98 provides that an employer will not be charged for unemployment benefits paid due to a major natural disaster declared by the President of the United States. The employer would need to be a contributory employer and not one who is required or has elected to reimburse the unemployment compensation fund.

#### ASSUMPTIONS

- Towa Workforce Development has used its experience with the 1993 floods to determine the impact.
- Mid-range economic assumptions regarding employment growth, wage growth, and insured unemployment levels were used.
- 3. Noncharging of benefits will have an impact on the distribution of employer tax rates, but it does not have a significant impact on total Unemployment Trust Fund revenue received.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated fiscal impact of Senate File 98 in the event of a major natural disaster to the Unemployment Trust Fund is \$4.2 million. Currently, the trust fund balance is approximately \$750 million, and \$4.2 million would represent 0.56% of the fund.

#### AN ACT

CONCERNING UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION BY RELIEVING UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION CHARGES FOR EMPLOYEES WHO BECOME UNEMPLOYED DUE TO A PRESIDENTIALLY DECLARED DISASTER AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE AND RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY DATES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 96.7, subsection 2, paragraph a, subparagraph (2), Code 2001, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:

NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. The account of an employer shall not be charged with benefits paid to an individual for unemployment that is directly caused by a major natural disaster declared by the president of the United States, pursuant to the federal Disaster Relief Act of 1974, if the individual would have been eligible for federal disaster unemployment assistance benefits with respect to that unemployment but for the individual's receipt of regular benefits.

Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE AND RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY DATES.

This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment, and applies retroactively to January 1, 2001,
