SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Joint Resolution requesting the proposal of an amendment to the
- 2 Constitution of the United States on the subject of judicial
- 3 taxation.
- 4 WHEREAS, separation of powers is fundamental to the United
- 5 States Constitution and the power of the federal government is
- 6 expressly limited; and
- 7 WHEREAS, under the United States Constitution, the states are
- 8 to determine public policy; and
- 9 WHEREAS, it is the duty of the judiciary to interpret the law,
- 10 not to create law; and
- 11 WHEREAS, our present federal government has strayed from the
- 12 intent of our founding fathers and the United States Constitution
- 13 through inappropriate federal mandates; and
- 14 WHEREAS, these mandates by way of statute, rule, or judicial
- 15 decision have forced state governments to serve as the mere
- 16 administrative arm of the federal government; and
- 17 WHEREAS, federal district courts with the acquiescence of the
- 18 United States Supreme Court, continue to order states to levy or
- 19 increase taxes to comply with federal mandates; and
- 20 WHEREAS, these court actions violate the United States
- 21 Constitution and the legislative process; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the time has come for the people of this great nation
- 23 and their duly elected representatives in state government to
- 24 reaffirm that the authority to tax under the Constitution of the

1 United States is retained by the people who, by their consent
2 alone, do delegate such power to tax explicitly to those duly
3 elected representatives in the legislative branch of government
4 whom they choose, such representatives being directly responsible
5 and accountable to those who have elected them; and
     WHEREAS, several states, including Missouri, Colorado, New
7 York, Tennessee, Arizona, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Nevada,
8 Alaska, Michigan, South Dakota, Delaware, Alabama, Oklahoma,
9 Utah, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Kansas, New Hampshire, West
10 Virginia, and South Carolina, have petitioned the United States
11 Congress to propose an amendment to the Constitution of the
12 United States of America on this subject; and
      WHEREAS, the amendment was previously introduced in Congress;

      WHEREAS, the amendment seeks to prevent federal courts from
15
16 levying or increasing taxes without representation of the people
17 and against the people's wishes; NOW THEREFORE,
18 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 That the Congress of the United States is hereby petitioned 2 to propose and submit to the several states for ratification 3 an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to add a 4 new article providing as follows: "Neither the Supreme Court 5 nor any inferior court of the United States shall have the 6 power to instruct or order a state or a political subdivision 7 thereof, or an official of such a state or political 8 subdivision, to levy or increase taxes"; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this application constitutes a 10 continuing application in accordance with Article V of the 11 Constitution of the United States; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the General Assembly of the 13 State of Iowa also proposes that the legislatures of each of 14 the several states comprising the United States that have not 15 yet made a similar request petition the United States Congress 16 to propose such an amendment to the Constitution of the United

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That, upon passage, the Secretary of the Senate transmit copies of this Resolution to the President and Vice President of the United States, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the presiding officer in each house of the legislature in each of the states in the union, and each member of the Iowa congressional delegation.

25 EXPLANATION

This joint resolution constitutes a petition requesting the 27 United States Congress to propose an amendment to the United 28 States Constitution and submit it to the states specifying 29 that no court has the power to order a state or political 30 subdivision to levy or increase taxes.
