7 32 nonadministrative duties of the state medical examiner. The

7 33 state medical examiner shall be a physician and surgeon or

9 10 EXPLANATION

9 11 This bill updates references to entities represented on the
9 12 medical assistance advisory council due to name changes or
9 13 termination of the existence of the entity. The bill also
9 14 makes conforming changes in the Code to reflect the name
9 15 changes.
