13	challenge for governments and their officials around
14	the nation and for political parties; and
15	WHEREAS, use of the internet has become common
16	practice for millions of Americans; and
17	WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon government officials
18	to take steps to ensure public trust and confidence in
19	voting technology; NOW THEREFORE,
20	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE
21	SENATE CONCURRING, That the legislative council is
22	requested to establish a legislative interim study
23	committee for the 2004 interim on internet voting,
24	including whether it is feasible to consider use of
25	that type of voting system in Iowa; and

27	shall submit a report of its findings and
28	recommendations relating to internet voting to the
29	General Assembly by January 15, 2005.
