HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1001 2 BY HUSER 3 A Concurrent Resolution expressing the support of the general assembly for Iowa's adoption subsidy program 4 5 and encouraging the legislative council to authorize an independent assessment of the program's value to 6 7 the state. WHEREAS, Iowa's adoption subsidy program provides 8 9 financial support to adoptive parents who provide care 10 and a permanent home for hard-to-place children, ll including minority children, older children, sibling 12 groups, and children with mental or physical 13 disabilities; and 14 WHEREAS, the program currently serves approximately 15 6,000 children; and WHEREAS, providing a child who is in foster care 16 17 with an adoptive home can create for the child a 18 permanent, stable, and loving environment; and 19 WHEREAS, adoptive parents sign an adoption 20 agreement with the department of human services in 21 which the department agrees to provide specified 22 levels of support, including child care, necessary 23 therapeutic services, medical equipment, and other 24 support to assist the adoptive parents to accommodate 25 the special needs of their adoptive children; and 26 WHEREAS, Iowa's adoption subsidy program has been 27 highly successful in finding a permanent home for 28 hard-to-place adoptive children who have special 29 needs, resulting in a 56 percent increase in the 30 number of children qualifying for a special needs

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1 adoption subsidy from fiscal year 1998-1999 through
2 fiscal year 2002-2003; and

3 WHEREAS, the general assembly finds that the 4 program is currently subject to increased scrutiny due 5 to the budget growth resulting from the program's 6 increased participation and success; and

7 WHEREAS, the department convened an advisory group 8 to consider ways to control rising program costs and 9 based upon the advisory group's recommendations has 10 proposed administrative rule changes to reduce the 11 overall subsidy outlays; and

WHEREAS, in November 2003, the administrative rules review committee delayed the proposed rules changes; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE 15 16 SENATE CONCURRING, That the Iowa general assembly 17 expresses strong support for the adoption subsidy 18 program and applauds the department of human services' 19 efforts to make the program a success; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the legislative 20 21 council is encouraged to authorize an independent 22 assessment of the adoption subsidy program's value to 23 the state, to identify the program's strengths and 24 needs, and to identify budgetary priorities that will 25 enable the state to continue supporting the adoption 26 of hard-to-place children; that the assessment include 27 a full inventory of program costs and benefits, and 28 identify the impact of expected program growth and the 29 savings in other programs and services resulting from 30 the existence of the adoption subsidy program; that

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1 the legislative council is encouraged to seek 2 assistance in conducting the assessment from an 3 independent consultant or another entity with 4 expertise in child welfare issues; that the 5 legislative council is encouraged to seek financial 6 support for the assessment costs from a private 7 foundation or other appropriate sources; and that the 8 assessment should be completed by December 15, 2004; 9 and 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That if private funding for 11 the assessment cannot be secured, the legislative 12 council is encouraged to create a legislative interim 13 study committee to address the program needs. 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29

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
