

1 HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 119
2 BY COMMITTEE ON HUMAN RESOURCES
3 (SUCCESSOR TO HF 2191)
4 A Concurrent Resolution providing for the formation
5 of a committee by the Legislative Council to make
6 recommendations regarding the development of a drug
7 repository program.
8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE
9 SENATE CONCURRING, That the legislative council is
10 requested to appoint an interim committee to conduct a
11 study of the development of a drug repository program
12 for accepting and distributing donated drugs. The
13 study shall include a determination of which drugs to
14 accept for donation pursuant to the program,
15 designation of entities that may participate in the
16 program and possible processing fees charged by such
17 entities, selection of a location for the repository,
18 identification of the ultimate recipients of donated
19 drugs, consideration of issues relating to unit-dose
20 packaging and drug packaging security, and evaluation
21 of liability issues relating to the operation of and
22 participation in the program. The interim committee
23 shall be composed of ten voting members, representing
24 both political parties and both houses of the general
25 assembly. Five members shall be members off the
26 senate, three of whom shall be appointed by the
27 majority leader of the senate and two of whom shall be
28 appointed by the minority leader of the senate. Five
29 members shall be members of the house of
30 representatives, appointed by the speaker of the

1 house, three of whom shall be of the majority party
2 and two of whom shall be of the minority party.
3 Committee members shall consult with representatives
4 of the board of pharmacy examiners, the Iowa
5 department of public health, the department of
6 inspections and appeals, the university of Iowa
7 hospitals and clinics, and various health care
8 provider groups in conducting the study. The interim
9 committee shall submit its findings and
10 recommendations relating to the development of the
11 program by January 1, 2005, to the general assembly.
