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1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.1 SHORT TITLE.

2 This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Iowa 3 home inspection professional licensing Act".

4 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.2 DEFINITIONS.

5 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 6 requires:

7 1. "Board" means the home inspection licensing board8 established pursuant to section 543E.3.

9 2. "Client" means a person who engages, or seeks to 10 engage, the services of a home inspector for the purpose of 11 obtaining inspection of and the written evaluation of the 12 condition of a residential building.

13 3. "Home inspection" means an inspection and written 14 evaluation of the following components of a residential 15 building: heating system, cooling system, plumbing system, 16 electrical system, structural components, foundation, roof, 17 masonry structure, exterior and interior components, or any 18 other related residential housing component as determined by 19 the board by regulation.

4. "Home inspector" means a person licensed as a home
21 inspector pursuant to the provisions of this chapter who
22 performs home inspections.

5. "Home inspector in training" means a person licensed as
a home inspector in training to become a licensed home
inspector pursuant to the provisions of this chapter.

26 6. "Residential building" means a structure consisting of27 from one to four family dwelling units.

28 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.3 HOME INSPECTION LICENSING 29 BOARD -- CREATION -- MEMBERSHIP.

30 1. A home inspection licensing board is established within 31 the professional licensing and regulation division of the 32 department of commerce. The board shall consist of five 33 members each of which meets all of the following requirements:

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34 a. Is a resident of the state.

35 b. Is a licensed home inspector.

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c. Is a certified member of the Iowa association of home
 2 inspectors.

3 d. Has been actively engaged in the business of making 4 home inspections in this state for at least five years.

5 e. Has performed not less than five hundred home
6 inspections during the five-year period immediately preceding
7 the member's appointment.

8 2. For a period of one year after the effective date of 9 this Act, and notwithstanding any other provisions of this 10 chapter to the contrary, the first five home inspectors 11 appointed as members of the home inspection licensing board 12 shall not be required, at the time of their first appointment, 13 to be licensed to perform home inspections.

Members of the board shall be appointed by the governor 14 3. 15 subject to confirmation by the senate. Each board member 16 shall be appointed for a term of three years, except that of 17 the members first appointed, two shall serve for terms of 18 three years, two shall serve for terms of two years, and one 19 shall serve for a term of one year beginning and ending as 20 provided by section 69.19. Upon expiration of their terms, 21 members of the board shall continue to hold office until the 22 appointment and qualification of their successors. Any 23 vacancy in the membership of the board shall be filled for the 24 unexpired term in the manner provided for the original 25 appointment. A person shall not serve as a member of the 26 board for more than two consecutive terms in addition to any 27 unexpired term to which the person has been appointed. Members of the board are entitled to receive all actual 28 4. 29 expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties within the 30 limits of funds appropriated to the board. The administrator

31 of the professional licensing and regulation division of the 32 department of commerce shall hire and provide staff to assist 33 the board with administering this chapter. Each member of the 34 board may also be eligible to receive compensation as provided 35 in section 7E.6.

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5. The board shall annually elect from among its members a
 2 chairperson and a vice chairperson and may appoint a
 3 secretary, who need not be a member of the board.

6. The board shall meet at least twice each year to 5 conduct its business and may hold additional meetings as 6 necessary to discharge its duties.

7 Sec. 4. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.4 POWERS OF THE BOARD.
8 The board shall do all of the following:

9 1. Administer and enforce the provisions of this chapter.
10 2. Issue and renew licenses to home inspectors and home
11 inspectors in training pursuant to this chapter.

12 3. Suspend, revoke, or fail to renew the license of a home 13 inspector or a home inspector in training pursuant to this 14 chapter.

15 4. Establish standards for the initial and continuing 16 education of home inspectors.

17 5. Adopt and publish a code of ethics, standards of18 practice, and reporting requirements for home inspectors.

19 6. Establish and collect fees for examination, licensure, 20 renewal of licensure, and other services related to the 21 regulation and licensure of home inspectors performed by the 22 board.

23 7. Establish training and experience requirements for24 licensure as a home inspector.

8. Establish rules for handling complaints from the public
concerning home inspectors or the performance of home
inspections.

28 9. Establish reporting requirements for home inspections29 performed by home inspectors.

30 Sec. 5. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.5 LICENSURE REQUIRED.

31 A person shall not engage in the performance of a home 32 inspection for compensation unless licensed in accordance with 33 this chapter.

34 Sec. 6. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.6 ELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSURE AS 35 HOME INSPECTOR.

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To be eligible for licensure as a home inspector, an 1 2 applicant shall fulfill all of the following requirements: 3

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Be of good moral character. 1.

Successfully complete high school or its equivalent. 4 2. Acquire the training and experience required by the 5 3.

6 board.

4. Pass the national home inspector examination or the 7 8 American society of home inspectors examination. An applicant 9 may meet this requirement by passing the national home 10 inspector or American society of home inspectors examination 11 prior to the effective date of this Act.

Be engaged as a licensed inspector in training for at 12 5. 13 least one year, and perform at least two hundred fifty home 14 inspections for compensation in compliance with the standards 15 of practice and code of ethics of this chapter.

16 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 543E.7 REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE 17 AS A HOME INSPECTOR IN TRAINING.

To be eligible for licensure as a home inspector in 18 19 training, an applicant shall fulfill all of the following 20 requirements:

21 1. Be of good moral character.

22 Successfully complete high school or its equivalent. 23 3. Pass an approved course of study, as prescribed by the 24 board.

25 4. Perform at least ten home inspections in the presence 26 of and under the direct supervision of a home inspector. 27 Pass the national home inspector examination or the 5. 28 American society of home inspectors examination. An applicant 29 may meet this requirement by passing the national home 30 inspector or American society of home inspectors examination 31 prior to the effective date of this Act.

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32 543E.8 WHEN NOT APPLICABLE. Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. 33 The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to: 34 A person who is employed by the government or a 1. 35 governmental subdivision or agency and performs a home

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1 inspection that is within the official duties and 2 responsibilities of the person.

3 2. A person who performs a home inspection, if the 4 inspection will be used solely by a financial institution to 5 monitor the progress of construction of a residential 6 building.

7 3. A person who is a real estate broker or salesperson as 8 defined in section 543B.3 or 543B.5 when that person is acting 9 within the scope of that person's license pursuant to chapter 10 543B.

11 4. A person who is performing home inspections for the 12 purpose of meeting the requirements of section 543E.7 in order 13 to qualify for licensure as a home inspector in training. 14 Sec. 9. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.9 HOME INSPECTIONS NOT 15 REQUIRED.

16 This chapter shall not be construed to require a home 17 inspection to be performed on a residential property in this 18 state.

19 Sec. 10. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.10 ISSUANCE OF HOME INSPECTOR 20 LICENSE -- RECIPROCITY.

Upon payment of a fee and submission of a written application to the board, the board shall issue a home inspector license to any person who holds a valid home inspector license issued under the laws of another state if the board determines that the other state has standards that are substantially equivalent to those of this state.

27 Sec. 11. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.11 LICENSURE OF PRACTICING 28 HOME INSPECTORS.

29 During the first three hundred sixty days after the 30 effective date of this Act, the board shall issue, upon 31 application, a home inspector license to a person who does all 32 of the following:

33 1. Meets the requirements of section 543E.6, subsections 34 1, 2, and 4.

35 2. Has engaged in the performance of home inspections for

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1 compensation for at least three years prior to the effective
2 date of this Act.

3 3. Has performed at least three hundred home inspections 4 for compensation that conform to the standards of practice and 5 code of ethics set forth by the board pursuant to this 6 chapter.

7 Sec. 12. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.12 FEES FOR HOME INSPECTION 8 LICENSURE.

9 1. The board shall set fees for licenses, renewals of 10 licenses, or other services provided by the board pursuant to 11 this chapter. Licenses shall be issued for a period of two 12 years and shall be renewable biennially, except that the board 13 may, in order to stagger the expiration dates of licenses 14 issued, provide that those licenses first issued or renewed 15 after the effective date of this Act shall expire on a date 16 fixed by the board.

Fees and penalties shall be established and collected
 by the board in an amount necessary to pay the administrative
 costs of sustaining the board and administering this chapter.
 Licensing fees set under this chapter shall be comparable to
 those established by other licensing boards.

22 3. All fees and penalties imposed by the board shall be 23 paid to the board and shall be transmitted to the treasurer of 24 state who shall deposit the fees and penalties in the general 25 fund of the state.

26 Sec. 13. <u>NEW SECTION.</u> 543E.13 DENIAL, SUSPENSION, OR
27 REVOCATION OF HOME INSPECTOR LICENSE.

The board may deny, suspend, or revoke a home inspector 29 license or a home inspector in training license upon a 30 determination by the board that the licensee has done any of 31 the following:

32 1. Failed to fulfill any of the requirements in section 33 543E.6.

34 2. Disclosed information concerning the results of a home 35 inspection without the approval of a client or the client's

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1 representatives.

2 3. Accepted compensation from more than one client for the 3 same service without the consent of all clients for whom the 4 service is being performed.

5 4. Accepted commissions or allowances, directly or 6 indirectly, from other parties dealing with a client of the 7 licensee in connection with work for which the licensee is 8 responsible.

9 5. Failed to promptly disclose information to a client 10 about a business interest of the licensee that might 11 constitute a conflict of interest for a licensee in performing 12 a home inspection for a client.

13 Sec. 14. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.14 PRACTICE OF ARCHITECTURE 14 OR ENGINEERING PROHIBITED.

15 A person licensed as a home inspector pursuant to this 16 chapter shall not engage in the practice of architecture or 17 the practice of professional engineering.

18 Sec. 15. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.15 ERRORS AND OMISSIONS --19 INSURANCE REQUIRED.

20 1. Every licensee under this chapter who is engaged in the 21 performance of home inspections shall secure, maintain, and 22 file with the board proof of error and omissions insurance in 23 an amount of at least five hundred thousand dollars per 24 occurrence.

25 2. Errors and omissions insurance obtained by a licensee 26 in compliance with subsection 1 shall contain a provision that 27 cancellation or failure to renew the insurance shall not be 28 effective without at least ten days' notice of intention to 29 cancel or not renew the insurance given to the board in 30 writing by the licensee.

31 Sec. 16. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 543E.16 LIMITATION OF ACTIONS. 32 1. An action to recover damages arising out of an act or 33 omission of a home inspector in connection with the 34 performance of a home inspection can only be commenced within 35 one year from the date the home inspection was performed.

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2. An action to recover damages arising out of an act or
 2 omission of a home inspector in connection with the
 3 performance of a home inspection shall only be brought by the
 4 client for whom the home inspection was performed.

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5 Sec. 17. NEW SECTION. 543E.17 RULES.

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6 The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A and 7 consistent with this chapter for the administration and 8 enforcement of this chapter and may prescribe forms to be used 9 under this chapter.

## EXPLANATION

11 This bill provides for the regulation and licensing of home 12 inspectors of residential real estate consisting of from one 13 to four family dwelling units. The bill creates a home 14 inspection licensing board within the professional licensing 15 and regulation division of the department of commerce whose 16 members are appointed by the governor subject to confirmation 17 by the senate.

18 The bill provides that the home inspection licensing board 19 is responsible for the issuance and renewal and suspension and 20 revocation of home inspector licenses; for adopting ethics, 21 standards of practice, and reporting requirements for home 22 inspectors; for establishing and collecting fees for 23 examination, licensure, and other services related to the 24 regulation and licensure of home inspectors performed by the 25 board; for establishing licensure requirements; and for 26 establishing complaint procedures for handling complaints 27 about home inspections from the public.

The bill requires that a person who performs home inspections for compensation must be licensed in accordance with the bill. The bill sets forth eligibility requirements for licensure as a home inspector or as a home inspector in 2 training.

33 The bill specifies that the requirements of the bill are 34 not applicable to government employees performing home 35 inspections within their official duties, persons performing

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1 home inspections for a financial institution to monitor new 2 house construction, persons acting as real estate brokers or 3 salespersons, or persons performing home inspections in order 4 to qualify for licensure as a home inspector in training.

5 The bill provides for reciprocity with other states that 6 issue home inspector licenses pursuant to similar licensing 7 requirements. The bill also provides that practicing home 8 inspectors for at least three years prior to the effective 9 date of the bill can be issued licenses during the first 360 10 days after the bill's effective date by meeting certain ll conditions.

12 The bill sets forth the conditions under which the board 13 may deny, suspend, or revoke a home inspector license or home 14 inspector in training license. The bill also prohibits a 15 licensed home inspector from practicing architecture or 16 professional engineering.

The bill requires that a licensee under the chapter obtain 17 18 errors and omissions insurance and provide proof of such 19 insurance to the home inspection licensing board.

20 The bill requires actions to recover damages arising out of 21 an act or omission of a home inspector to be filed within one 22 year from when the home inspection was performed by the client 23 for whom the home inspection was performed.

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
