## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to township emergency services, compensation	of
2 township officers, and township budgets.	
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:	
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- 1 Section 1. Section 331.322, subsection 14, Code 2003, is
- 2 amended by striking the subsection.
- 3 Sec. 2. Section 331.385, subsections 2 and 3, Code 2003,
- 4 are amended to read as follows:
- 5 2. The board of supervisors shall publish notice of the
- 6 proposed resolution, and of a public hearing to be held on the
- 7 proposed resolution, in a newspaper of general circulation in
- 8 the county at least ten days but no more than twenty days
- 9 before the date of the public hearing. If, after notice and
- 10 hearing, the resolution is adopted, the board of supervisors
- 11 shall assume the exercise of the powers and duties of township
- 12 trustees relating to fire protection service and emergency
- 13 medical service as set forth in sections 359.42 through
- 14 359.45.
- 15 3. If 7-after-notice-and-hearing 7-the-resolution-is
- 16 adopted, -the-board-of-supervisors-shall-assume-the-exercise-of
- 17 the-powers-and-duties-of-township-trustees-relating-to-fire
- 18 protection-service-and-emergency-medical-service-as-set-forth
- 19 in-sections-359-42-through-359-45- All of the real and
- 20 personal township property used to provide fire protection
- 21 service or emergency medical service shall be transferred to
- 22 the county. The county shall assume all of the outstanding
- 23 obligations of the township relating to fire protection
- 24 service or emergency medical service. If the township
- 25 provides fire protection outside of the county's boundaries,
- 26 the county shall continue to provide fire protection to this
- 27 area for at least ninety days after adoption of the
- 28 resolution.
- Sec. 3. Section 331.385, Code 2003, is amended by adding
- 30 the following new subsection:
- 31 NEW SUBSECTION. 5. Notwithstanding subsections 1 and 2,
- 32 if section 359.45A applies, a county shall provide fire
- 33 protection service and emergency medical service for a
- 34 township.
- 35 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 359.45A EMERGENCY SERVICES PROVIDED

## 1 BY COUNTY.

- 2 If, as of January 1, 2003, a township is not operating its
- 3 own township fire department, the county where the township is
- 4 located shall assume the exercise of all powers and duties of
- 5 the township relating to fire protection service and emergency
- 6 medical service beginning with the fiscal year beginning July
- 7 1, 2004. The county may contract with another township, a
- 8 benefited fire district, a county, or a city for fire
- 9 protection service and emergency medical service for the
- 10 township. However, any contract in force at the time the
- 11 county assumes responsibility for fire protection service and
- 12 emergency medical service shall remain in effect until its
- 13 expiration. Fire protection service and emergency medical
- 14 service shall be paid for by the county as provided in section
- 15 331.385.
- 16 Sec. 5. Section 359.46, Code 2003, is amended to read as
- 17 follows:
- 18 359.46 COMPENSATION OF TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES.
- 19 1. A township trustee while engaged in official business
- 20 shall be compensated at an hourly rate established by the
- 21 county-board-of-supervisors trustees. However, the county
- 22 board-of-supervisors trustees may establish a minimum daily
- 23 pay rate for the time spent by a township trustee attending a
- 24 scheduled meeting of township trustees. The compensation
- 25 shall be paid by from the county administration fund
- 26 established in section 359.48 except:
- 27 a. When the trustee is assessing damages done by
- 28 trespassing animals, payment of the compensation shall be made
- 29 in the same manner as other costs in such cases.
- 30 b. When the trustee is acting as a fence viewer or in a
- 31 case where provision is made for payment from a source other
- 32 than the general administration fund of the county township.
- 33 2. In cases where their fees or compensation are not paid
- 34 by from the county administration fund, the trustees shall be
- 35 paid by the party requiring their services. The trustees

- 1 shall attach to the report of their proceedings a statement
- 2 specifying their services, directing who shall pay the fees or
- 3 compensation, and specifying the amount to be paid by each
- 4 party. A party who makes advance payment for the services of
- 5 the trustees may take legal action to recover the amount of
- 6 the payment from the party who is directed to pay by the
- 7 trustees unless the party entitled to recovery under this
- 8 subsection is paid within ten days after a demand for
- 9 reimbursement is made.
- 10 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 359.48 ADMINISTRATION FUND.
- 11 A township shall establish an administration fund and may
- 12 certify a tax levy sufficient to pay administrative costs as
- 13 provided in sections 359.46 and 359.47.
- 14 Sec. 7. Section 359.49, subsection 9, Code 2003, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 9. Taxes-from-a-township-levy-shall-be-collected-but-not
- 17 disbursed-by-the-county-to-a-township-until-copies-of-the
- 18 township-budget-are-transmitted-to-the-county-auditor-as
- 19 required-in-subsection-7. If a township fails to certify
- 20 property taxes by March 15, the amount of taxes collected by
- 21 the county for the township shall be the amount collected for
- 22 the township in the previous fiscal year to the extent that it
- 23 does not exceed the applicable levy rate limits in this
- 24 chapter. However, that amount may shall not exceed the amount
- 25 the township could collect based on property assessments for
- 26 the fiscal year for which the township failed to certify
- 27 property taxes.
- 28 EXPLANATION
- 29 This bill makes changes to the law relating to township
- 30 emergency services, compensation of township officers, and
- 31 township budgets.
- 32 The bill provides that if, as of January 1, 2003, a
- 33 township is not operating its own fire department, the county
- 34 where the township is located shall assume all the powers and
- 35 duties of the township relating to fire protection service and

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- 1 emergency medical service beginning with the fiscal year
- 2 beginning July 1, 2004. The county may contract for fire
- 3 protection and emergency medical services.
- 4 The bill also requires a township to establish an
- 5 administration fund for paying compensation of township
- 6 trustees and the township clerk. The township is to levy
- 7 property taxes sufficient to pay such administrative costs.
- 8 The bill strikes the requirement that the county set the rate
- 9 of compensation and pay the compensation of the trustees and
- 10 clerks and requires that the trustees set the rate of
- 11 compensation.
- 12 The bill strikes the requirement that a county is not to
- 13 disburse a township's taxes until copies of the township
- 14 budget are transmitted to the county auditor.

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
