## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the regulation of swine dealers and providing for a penalty. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 163.61, subsections 2 and 3, Code 2003, 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 2. a. Except as provided in paragraph-"b" subsection 3, a
- 4 person violating a provision of this chapter, or a rule
- 5 adopted pursuant to this chapter, shall be subject to a civil
- 6 penalty of at least one hundred dollars but not more than one
- 7 thousand dollars. In the case of a continuing violation, each
- 8 day of the continuing violation is a separate violation.
- 9 However, a person shall not be subject to a civil penalty
- 10 totaling more than twenty-five thousand dollars.
- 11 b. 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph-"a"
- 12 subsection 2, a all of the following shall apply:
- a. A person who falsifies a health certificate,
- 14 veterinarian inspection certificate, or certificate of
- 15 inspection shall be subject to a civil penalty of not more
- 16 than five thousand dollars for each reference to an animal
- 17 falsified on the certificate. However, a person who falsifies
- 18 a certificate of inspection issued pursuant to chapter 166D
- 19 shall be subject to a civil penalty as provided in this
- 20 section or section 166D.16, but not both. A person shall not
- 21 be subject to a civil penalty totaling more than twenty-five
- 22 thousand dollars for falsifying a certificate, regardless of
- 23 the number of animals falsified on the certificate.
- b. A person required to be licensed as a dealer pursuant
- 25 to section 163.30 and who is not issued a license by the
- 26 department pursuant to that section shall be subject to a
- 27 civil penalty of at least one thousand dollars but not more
- 28 than five thousand dollars. Each day that the person does
- 29 business as a dealer without being issued a license
- 30 constitutes a separate offense. A person shall not be subject
- 31 to a civil penalty totaling more than twenty-five thousand
- 32 dollars during any one year.
- 33 3. 4. Moneys collected from civil penalties shall be
- 34 deposited into the general fund of the state.
- 35 EXPLANATION

Code chapter 163 authorizes the department of agriculture 2 and land stewardship to regulate contagious and infectious 3 diseases among livestock populations. Code section 163.30 4 regulates swine dealers (dealers) engaged in the business of 5 buying for resale, or selling, or exchanging swine. The Code 6 section prohibits a person from acting as a dealer unless the 7 department of agriculture and land stewardship issues the 8 person a dealer's license. Code section 163.61 provides 9 penalties for persons who violate the chapter, including 10 engaging as a dealer without a license. Generally, a person 11 who violates the Code chapter is subject to a civil penalty of 12 at least \$100 but not more than \$1,000. In the case of a 13 continuing violation, each day of the continuing violation is 14 a separate violation. However, a person is not subject to a 15 civil penalty totaling more than \$25,000. This bill increases the civil penalty applicable to a 17 person who illegally acts as a dealer by not being issued a 18 license. The bill provides that a person is subject to a 19 minimum civil penalty of \$1,000 but not more than \$5,000. 20 bill repeats language applying to general violations of the 21 Code chapter by providing that each day of a violation 22 constitutes a separate offense. It also provides that a 23 person is not subject to a civil penalty totaling more than 24 \$25,000 during any one year. 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32

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
