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- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 104A.3 MINIMUM UNIVERSAL DESIGN
- 2 STANDARDS -- ACCESSIBILITY.
- 3 1. FINDINGS. The general assembly finds and declares it
- 4 is the policy of this state to encourage the design and
- 5 construction of affordable homes and apartments that people of
- 6 all ages and abilities can independently access, enter, and
- 7 visit. Incorporating universal design features into new
- 8 construction dramatically reduces the need to make and pay for
- 9 home modifications that address temporary or long-term injury,
- 10 illness, or disability.
- 11 2. STANDARDS.
- 12 a. All new construction of public housing utilizing public
- 13 funds must incorporate minimum universal design standards in
- 14 its design and construction.
- 15 b. As used in this section:
- 16 (1) "Public housing" includes any single-family home,
- 17 townhouse, duplex, and any other building with three or fewer
- 18 dwelling units.
- 19 (2) "Public funds" means funding or assistance from the
- 20 state or any political subdivision through any of the
- 21 following:
- 22 (a) A building contract or similar contractual agreement
- 23 involving a state-funded program or fund.
- 24 (b) Any real estate purchase, lease, or donation.
- 25 (c) Credits, abatements, reductions, or other tax
- 26 incentives.
- 27 (d) Bond assistance or any other financial assistance.
- 28 (e) A contract to provide funding or a financial benefit
- 29 for housing.
- 30 (f) Disbursement or receipt of federal or state funds of
- 31 any kind.
- 32 c. The state building code commissioner shall adopt rules
- 33 to establish, administer, and enforce universal design
- 34 standards. The rules shall include, but are not limited to,
- 35 the following design and construction features:

- 1 (1) At least one building entrance must be on an
 2 accessible route and served by a no-step entrance or a ramp.
- 3 (2) Bathrooms must have walls that are reinforced to 4 support the installation of grab bars, handrails, or other 5 assistive devices and facilities.
- 6 (3) Light switches, electrical outlets, and other
 7 environmental controls must be installed at a height and
 8 location that a person in a seated position can easily reach.
- 9 (4) First floor doors and hallways must provide sufficient
 10 clear width to enable a person using a wheelchair, walker,
 11 crutches or other mobility dovice to enter and page through
- 11 crutches, or other mobility device to enter and pass through.
 12 3. APPLICABILITY. The requirements of this section shall
- 13 apply to any public housing, financed in whole or in part with
- 14 public funds, for which a building permit is requested on or 15 after July 1, 2004.

16 EXPLANATION

This bill requires the state building code commissioner to 18 create a set of minimum universal design standards, relating 19 to accessibility for persons with disabilities, applicable to 20 public housing constructed in whole or in part with public 21 funds.

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
