A BILL FOR

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1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION.</u> 135M.1 DEFINITIONS.

2 For the purposes of this chapter, unless the context 3 otherwise requires:

4 1. "Department" means the department of inspections and 5 appeals.

6 2. "Dialysis" means a process by which substances are 7 removed from a patient's body by diffusion from one fluid 8 compartment to another across a semipermeable membrane.

9 3. "End-stage renal disease" means end-stage renal disease 10 as defined in section 135.45.

11 4. "Renal dialysis facility" means an outpatient facility 12 which offers staff-assisted dialysis or training and support 13 services for self-dialysis at home to end-stage renal disease 14 patients, but does not include:

a. Facilities operated by the state or federal government.
b. Renal dialysis services provided by a licensed
17 hospital.

18 5. "Self-dialysis at home" means dialysis performed by a 19 patient at home when the patient has completed a course in 20 self-dialysis.

21 6. "Staff-assisted dialysis" means dialysis performed by22 qualified staff of a renal dialysis facility.

23 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 135M.2 REGULATION OF RENAL DIALYSIS 24 FACILITIES.

25 1. The department of inspections and appeals shall adopt 26 rules for the regulation of renal dialysis facilities located 27 in this state. The rules shall be consistent with the end-28 stage renal disease requirements for participation in the 29 Medicare program.

30 2. In addition to and consistent with the end-stage renal 31 disease requirements for participation in the Medicare 32 program, the rules adopted by the department under this 33 chapter shall include, but are not limited to, regulation of 34 all of the following:

35 a. Qualifications of renal dialysis facility personnel.

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1 b. Medical staffing.

2 c. Transfer agreements with hospitals to provide for the
3 transfer of a patient for the provision of inpatient care and
4 other hospital services.

5 d. The rights and responsibilities of patients.

6 e. Disaster preparedness.

7 f. Infection control.

8 g. Incident and accident reports.

9 3. The rules relating to disaster preparedness shall 10 include all of the following:

11 a. That a renal dialysis facility have written policies 12 and procedures for emergencies that address fire, natural 13 disaster, and medical emergencies. The emergency procedures 14 developed shall be individualized for each patient to include 15 an appropriate evacuation from the facility or the patient's 16 home and the emergency telephone numbers needed for each 17 patient.

b. That a renal dialysis facility familiarize personnel
and patients with the policies and procedures developed
pursuant to paragraph "a".

c. That the renal dialysis facility familiarize each
22 patient with the procedure for disconnecting the patient's
23 dialysis equipment in the event of an emergency.

d. That in the event of a medical emergency, renal dialysis facility personnel shall contact the patient's physician or surgeon, as designated by the patient, and follow the instructions provided by the physician or surgeon. If the patient's physician or surgeon is not available, the renal dialysis facility personnel shall contact the hospital with which the facility has a transfer agreement to seek instructions and shall follow the instructions provided by the hospital personnel.

33 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 135M.3 INSPECTIONS -- INJUNCTION.
34 1. The department shall coordinate efforts with the end35 stage renal disease network established by federal law to

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1 provide for inspection of renal dialysis facilities. The 2 facilities shall be inspected on at least an annual basis. 3 2. The department may request that the attorney general 4 bring an action to enjoin the operation of a renal dialysis 5 facility if the department finds that the facility is in 6 violation of this chapter and the department determines that 7 an imminent threat to the health and safety of a patient of 8 the facility exists.

EXPLANATION

10 This bill relates to the regulation of renal dialysis 11 facilities, defined by the bill as outpatient facilities which 12 offer staff-assisted dialysis or training and support services 13 for self-dialysis at home to end-stage renal disease patients. 14 Renal disease facilities under the bill do not include 15 facilities operated by the state or federal government or 16 renal dialysis services provided by a licensed hospital. 17 The bill directs the department of inspections and appeals 18 to adopt rules for the regulation of renal dialysis facilities 19 located in this state. The rules are to be consistent with

20 the end-stage renal disease requirements for participation in 21 the Medicare program.

The rules are to include, but are not limited to, a qualifications of renal dialysis facility personnel, medical staffing, transfer agreements with hospitals, the rights and responsibilities of patients, disaster preparedness, infection control, and incident and accident reports.

The bill specifies that the rules relating to disaster preparedness are to include that a renal dialysis facility have written policies and procedures for emergencies that address fire, natural disaster, and medical emergencies; that such a facility familiarize personnel and patients with the policies and procedures; that the facility familiarize each patient with the procedure for disconnecting the patient's dialysis equipment in the event of an emergency; and whom facility personnel are to contact in the event of a medical

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1 emergency.

2 The bill directs the department to coordinate efforts with 3 the end-stage renal disease network established by federal law 4 to provide for inspection of renal dialysis facilities. The 5 network contracts with the centers for Medicare and Medicaid 6 services of the United States department of health and human 7 services to ensure the administration of the end-stage renal 8 disease program under the Medicare program. The bill requires 9 the facilities to be inspected on at least an annual basis. 10 The bill also provides for injunctive relief if the 11 department finds that a facility is in violation of the Code 12 chapter and the department determines that an imminent threat 13 to the health and safety of a patient of the facility exists. 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35
