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A BILL FOR
1 An Act providing on-time funding for school districts with
      increasing enrollments, making an appropriation, and providing
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      effective and applicability dates.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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- 1 Section 1. Section 257.13, Code 2003, is amended by
- 2 striking the section and inserting in lieu thereof the
- 3 following:
- 4 257.13 ON-TIME FUNDING BUDGET ADJUSTMENT.
- 5 l. For the school budget year beginning July 1, 2003, and
- 6 succeeding budget years, if a district's actual enrollment for
- 7 the budget year, determined under section 257.6, is greater
- 8 than its budget enrollment for the budget year, the district
- 9 shall receive an on-time funding budget adjustment. The
- 10 adjustment shall be in an amount equal to the difference
- 11 between the actual enrollment for the budget year and the
- 12 budget enrollment for the budget year, multiplied by the
- 13 district cost per pupil. The additional funding received
- 14 under this section is miscellaneous income to the school
- 15 district.
- 16 2. A school district that is receiving a budget adjustment
- 17 for a budget year pursuant to section 257.14 shall receive on-
- 18 time funding for increased enrollment, reduced by the amount
- 19 of the budget adjustment for that budget year. The resulting
- 20 amount shall not be less than zero.
- 21 3. If a district receives additional funding under this
- 22 section for a budget year, the department of management shall
- 23 determine the amount of the additional funding which would
- 24 have been generated by local property tax revenues, in
- 25 proportion to the amount of funding actually received pursuant
- 26 to this section, if the actual enrollment for the budget year
- 27 had been used in determining district cost for that budget
- 28 year. The department of management shall reduce, but not by
- 29 more than the amount of the additional funding, the district's
- 30 total state school aid otherwise available under this chapter
- 31 for the next budget year by the amount so determined, and
- 32 shall increase the district's additional property tax levy for
- 33 the next budget year by the amount necessary to compensate for
- 34 the reduction in state aid, so that the local property tax for
- 35 the next following year will be increased only by the amount

- 1 which it would have been increased in the budget year if the
- 2 enrollment calculated in this section could have been used to
- 3 establish the levy.
- 4 4. There is appropriated each fiscal year from the general
- 5 fund of the state to the department of education the amount
- 6 required to pay additional funding authorized under this
- 7 section, which shall be paid to school districts in the same
- 8 manner as other state aid payable under section 257.16.
- 9 Sec. 2. APPLICABILITY AND EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being
- 10 deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment
- 11 and applies to the computation of school aid under the state
- 12 school foundation program for the school budget year beginning
- 13 July 1, 2003.
- 14 EXPLANATION
- This bill provides additional funding for school districts
- 16 that have increasing enrollments.
- 17 The bill provides that for the school budget year beginning
- 18 July 1, 2003, and succeeding budget years, if a district's
- 19 actual enrollment for the budget year is greater than its
- 20 budget enrollment for the budget year, the district shall
- 21 receive an on-time funding budget adjustment. The bill
- 22 provides that the adjustment shall be in an amount equal to
- 23 the difference between the actual enrollment for the budget
- 24 year and the budget enrollment for the budget year, multiplied
- 25 by the district cost per pupil. The bill makes an adjustment
- 26 to the budget guarantee provisions of Code section 257.14 to
- 27 reflect the amount of the adjustment received. The bill
- 28 provides that the additional funding received under the bill
- 29 is miscellaneous income to the school district, and will be
- 30 paid to school districts in the same manner as other state aid
- 31 is paid pursuant to Code section 257.16.
- 32 The bill provides that the additional funding received in a
- 33 given budget year will impact the following year's state aid
- 34 and property tax levels. The bill provides that the amount
- 35 which would have been generated by property taxes if the

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1 actual (increased) enrollment figure was used in determining
 2 the district cost will be calculated by the department of
 3 management. This amount will reduce the level of state aid
 4 available to the district for the following year, but not by
 5 more than the amount of the additional funding.
 6 provides that the district's additional property tax levy for
 7 the following budget year will then be increased by the amount
 8 necessary to compensate for the reduction in state aid.
      The bill takes effect upon enactment and applies to the
10 school budget year beginning July 1, 2003.
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
