A BILL FOR

1	An Act relating to third-party payor compensation of certified
2	registered nurse first assistants.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 249A.15A CERTIFIED REGISTERED 2 NURSE FIRST ASSISTANT -- ELIGIBLE FOR PAYMENT.

3 1. The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 4 17A entitling a certified registered nurse first assistant who 5 meets the requirements of this section and is acting within 6 the scope of practice of a certified registered nurse first 7 assistant to payment for services provided to recipients of 8 medical assistance.

9 2. To be eligible for reimbursement under this section as 10 a certified registered nurse first assistant, an individual 11 shall meet all of the following requirements:

12 a. Be currently licensed as a registered nurse pursuant to 13 chapter 152.

b. Be currently certified in perioperative nursing. For
15 the purpose of this paragraph, "perioperative nursing" means a
16 practice of nursing in which a registered nurse provides
17 preoperative, intraoperative, and postoperative nursing care
18 to surgical patients.

19 c. Hold a degree or certificate from and have successfully 20 completed a formal registered nurse first assistant program 21 approved by the department.

3. The department shall adopt rules establishing
reimbursement of certified registered nurse first assistants
at a rate which is a percentage of the surgeon's fee which may
be the percentage established under the Medicare program for
reimbursement of surgical first assisting services.

27 Sec. 2. Section 509.3, Code 2003, is amended by adding the 28 following new subsection:

29 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 8. A provision shall be made available to 30 policyholders, under group policies covering hospital, 31 medical, or surgical expenses for payment of necessary medical 32 or surgical care and treatment provided by a certified 33 registered nurse first assistant, if the care and treatment 34 are provided within the scope of the person's license and if 35 the policy would pay for the care and treatment if the care

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1 and treatment were provided by a person practicing a health-2 related profession required to be licensed or certified 3 pursuant to chapter 147 who is practicing within their scope 4 of practice. The policy shall provide that the policyholder 5 may reject the coverage or provision if the coverage or 6 provision for similar services which may be provided by a 7 certified registered nurse first assistant is rejected for all 8 providers of services required to be licensed or certified 9 pursuant to chapter 147 practicing within their scope of 10 practice. This subsection applies to all group policies 11 delivered or issued for delivery on or after July 1, 2004, and 12 to existing group policies on their next anniversary or 13 renewal date, or upon expiration of the applicable collective 14 bargaining contract, if any, whichever is later. This 15 subsection does not apply to blanket, short-term travel, 16 accident-only, limited or specified disease, or individual or 17 group conversion policies, or policies designed only for 18 issuance to persons for coverage under Title XVIII of the 19 federal Social Security Act, or any other similar coverage 20 under a state or federal government plan.

21 Sec. 3. Section 509.3, unnumbered paragraph 2, Code 2003, 22 is amended to read as follows:

In addition to the provisions required in subsections 1 24 through 7 8, the commissioner shall require provisions through 25 the adoption of rules implementing the federal Health 26 Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, Pub. L. No. 104-27 191.

28 Sec. 4. Section 514B.1, subsection 5, Code 2003, is 29 amended by adding the following new paragraph:

30 <u>NEW PARAGRAPH</u>. e. The health care services available to 31 enrollees under prepaid group plans covering hospital, 32 medical, or surgical expenses shall include a provision for 33 payment of necessary medical or surgical care and treatment 34 provided by a certified registered nurse first assistant, if 35 the care and treatment are provided within the scope of the

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1 person's license and the plan would pay for the care and 2 treatment if the care and treatment were provided by a person 3 practicing a health-related profession required to be licensed 4 or certified pursuant to chapter 147 who is practicing within 5 their scope of practice. The plan shall provide that the plan 6 enrollees may reject the coverage or provision if the coverage 7 or provision for similar services which may be provided by a 8 certified registered nurse first assistant is rejected for all 9 providers of services required to be licensed or certified 10 pursuant to chapter 147 practicing within their scope of 11 practice. This provision applies to services provided under 12 plans made on or after July 1, 2004, and to existing group 13 plans on their next anniversary or renewal date, or upon 14 expiration of the applicable collective bargaining contract, 15 if any, whichever is later. This paragraph does not apply to 16 enrollees eligible for coverage under Title XVIII of the 17 federal Social Security Act, or any other similar coverage 18 under a state or federal government plan.

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EXPLANATION

This bill provides for third-party reimbursement for services provided by certified registered nurse first assistants (CRNFAs). The bill directs the department to adopt rules pursuant to Code chapter 17A entitling a CRNFA who meets specified requirements to payment for services provided to recipients of medical assistance. The bill directs the department to establish reimbursement of CRNFAs at a rate which is a percentage of the surgeon's fee which may be the percentage established under the Medicare program for reimbursement of the surgical first assisting services.

30 The bill also requires group insurance policies and health 31 maintenance organization contracts to cover or include care 32 and treatment provided by a CRNFA if the policy or available 33 health care service currently covers or includes the care and 34 treatment if provided by a person practicing a health-related 35 profession required to be licensed or certified pursuant to

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1 Code chapter 147 who is practicing within their scope of 2 practice. The bill also requires that the care or treatment 3 be within the scope of practice of the CRNFA. The requirement 4 applies to policies delivered and issued and services provided 5 under plans on or after July 1, 2004, and to existing policies 6 or plans on the latter of the anniversary, renewal, or 7 expiration of a collective bargaining contract.

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
