A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to determining compliance with course of study
2 requirements regarding cosmetology licensure.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 2193

1 Section 1. Section 157.5A, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code
2 2003, is amended to read as follows:

3 The department shall issue a license to practice manicuring
4 to any person who submits proof of successful completion of a
5 course of at least forty clock hours of training, or the
6 equivalent number of credit hours of training determined using
7 a standard, recognized method of conversion determined by the
8 board, relating to manicuring in a licensed school of
9 cosmetology arts and sciences or licensed barber school. The
10 board shall adopt rules defining the course of study for a
11 manicurist and the practices which a licensed manicurist may
12 perform.

13 Sec. 2. Section 157.10, subsection 1, Code 2003, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 1. The course of study required for licensure for the
16 practice of cosmetology shall be two thousand one hundred
17 clock hours, or the equivalent number of credit hours
18 determined using a standard, recognized method of conversion
19 determined by the board. The clock hours or equivalent number
20 of credit hours of a course of study required for licensure
21 for the practices of electrology, esthetics, and nail
22 technology shall be established by the board. The board shall
23 adopt rules to define the course and content of study for each
24 practice of cosmetology arts and sciences.

25 EXPLANATION

26 This bill relates to the manner in which hours of study
27 requirements regarding licensure as a cosmetologist shall be
28 determined. Current Code provisions relating to licensure as
29 a cosmetologist, and relating to a license to practice
30 manicuring, electrology, esthetics, and nail technology
31 specify that a designated number of hours of study shall be
32 completed, or shall be specified by the board of cosmetology
33 arts and sciences examiners. The bill provides additional
34 clarification that the hours of study requirements shall refer
35 to clock hours, or the equivalent number of credit hours of

1 training determined using a standard, recognized method of
2 conversion determined by the board.

RELATING TO DETERMINING COMPLIANCE WITH COURSE OF STUDY
REQUIREMENTS REGARDING COSMETOLOGY LICENSURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 157.5A, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2003, is amended to read as follows:

The department shall issue a license to practice manicuring to any person who submits proof of successful completion of a course of at least forty clock hours of training, or one and three-quarters semester credit hours or the equivalent thereof as determined pursuant to administrative rule and regulations promulgated by the United States department of education, relating to manicuring in a licensed school of cosmetology arts and sciences or licensed barber school. The board shall adopt rules defining the course of study for a manicurist and the practices which a licensed manicurist may perform.

Sec. 2. Section 157.10, subsection 1, Code 2003, is amended to read as follows:

1. The course of study required for licensure for the practice of cosmetology shall be two thousand one hundred clock hours, or seventy semester credit hours or the equivalent thereof as determined pursuant to administrative rule and regulations promulgated by the United States department of education. The clock hours, and equivalent number of semester credit hours or the equivalent thereof as determined pursuant to administrative rule and regulations promulgated by the United States department of education, of a course of study required for licensure for the practices of electrology, esthetics, and nail technology shall be

established by the board. The board shall adopt rules to define the course and content of study for each practice of cosmetology arts and sciences.
