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#### A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for the department of elder affairs to assume
  2 authority over appropriations affecting the elderly.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 231.23B FUNDING.
- 2 l. It is the intent of the general assembly that
- 3 commencing with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, all
- 4 state funding for services to the elderly will be appropriated
- 5 to the department. The funding affected shall include but is
- 6 not limited to the appropriations to the department of human
- 7 services for the medical assistance program under chapter
- 8 249A. The department may administer funding appropriated to
- 9 the department as provided in this section by contracting with
- 10 public and private agencies as necessary to best meet the
- 11 needs of elders and to utilize the funding in the most cost-
- 12 effective manner.
- 13 2. The department of human services shall assist the
- 14 department of elder affairs by identifying all funding sources
- 15 and appropriations described in subsection 1 that are
- 16 administered by the department of human services and reporting
- 17 the information to the department of elder affairs on or
- 18 before September 15, 2004. The department of elder affairs
- 19 shall utilize this and other information to develop a budget
- 20 and funding plan for implementation of subsection 1. The plan
- 21 shall be submitted by December 15, 2004, to the governor and
- 22 general assembly. The report shall include the funding
- 23 sources and appropriations identified and recommendations as
- 24 to how the funding sources and appropriations may be shifted
- 25 to the department of elder affairs with minimal disruption of
- 26 services. This subsection is repealed July 1, 2005.
- 27 EXPLANATION
- 28 This bill states legislative intent for the department of
- 29 elder affairs to assume authority over appropriations
- 30 affecting the elderly commencing in fiscal year 2005-2006.
- 31 The department is authorized to administer the funding
- 32 appropriated to the department by contracting with public or
- 33 private agencies. "Elderly" is defined in Code chapter 231 to
- 34 mean individuals 60 years of age or older.
- 35 The department of human services is to assist the

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1 department of elder affairs in identifying the applicable
 2 funding sources and appropriations by reporting to the
 3 department of elder affairs by September 15, 2004. The
 4 department is directed to report to the governor and general
 5 assembly by December 15, 2004, regarding the funding sources
 6 and appropriations identified and making recommendations as to
 7 how the funding sources and appropriations may be moved to the
 8 department with minimal disruption of services. The study
 9 requirement is repealed July 1, 2005.
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
