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A BILL FOR
1 An Act relating to the ability of cities and counties to
      designate enterprise zones.
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 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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- Section 1. Section 15A.1, subsection 5, paragraph c, Code
- 2 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 c. The area is located in a city or county that meets-the
- 4 distress-criteria-provided-under-the is designated an
- 5 enterprise zone program-in pursuant to section 15E.1947
- 6 subsection-1-or-2.
- 7 Sec. 2. Section 15E.191, Code 2003, is amended to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 15E.191 INTENT.
- 10 It is the intent of the general assembly that this division
- ll be administered in a manner to promote new economic
- 12 development in-economically-distressed-areas by encouraging
- 13 communities to target resources in ways that attract
- 14 productive private investment.
- 15 Sec. 3. Section 15E.192, subsection 2, Code Supplement
- 16 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 17 2. A city with-a-population-of-twenty-four-thousand-or
- 18 more, as shown by the 2000 certified federal census, may
- 19 create an economic development enterprise zone as authorized
- 20 in this division, subject to certification by the department
- 21 of economic development, by designating one or more contiguous
- 22 census tracts, as determined in the most recent federal
- 23 census, or designating other geographic units approved by the
- 24 department of economic development for that purpose. If there
- 25 is an area in the city which meets the requirements for
- 26 eligibility for an urban or rural enterprise community under
- 27 Title XIII of the federal Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of
- 28 1993, such area shall be designated by the state as an
- 29 economic development enterprise zone. The area meeting the
- 30 requirements for eligibility for an urban or rural enterprise
- 31 community shall not be included for the purpose of determining
- 32 the area limitation pursuant to subsection 3. In creating an
- 33 enterprise zone, a city with-a-population-of-twenty-four
- 34 thousand-or-more,-as-shown-by-the-2000-certified-federal
- 35 census, may designate as part of the area tracts or approved

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- 1 geographic units located in a contiguous city if such tracts
- 2 or approved geographic units meet the criteria and the city
- 3 agrees to being included. The city may establish more than
- 4 one enterprise zone. Reference-in-this-division-to-"city"
- 5 means-a-city-with-a-population-of-twenty-four-thousand-or
- 6 more-ras-shown-by-the-2000-certified-federal-census-
- 7 Sec. 4. Section 15E.192, subsection 3, paragraph a, Code
- 8 Supplement 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 a. An enterprise zone certified by the department pursuant
- 10 to subsection 2 shall only be amended if the amendment
- ll consists of an area being added to the enterprise zone and-the
- 12 added-area-meets-the-criteria-of-section-15E-1947-subsection
- 13 2. An enterprise zone certified by the department pursuant to
- 14 subsection 1 or 2 may be decertified; however, if a subsequent
- 15 enterprise zone is designated, the expiration date of the
- 16 subsequent enterprise zone shall be the same as the expiration
- 17 date of the decertified enterprise zone. A portion of a
- 18 certified enterprise zone may be decertified,-provided-that
- 19 the-remaining-portion-of-the-certified-enterprise-zone-meets

- 22 2003, are amended to read as follows:

- 29 the-top-twenty-five-counties-in-the-state-based-on-the-2000
- 30 census.

- An enterprise zone may be designated by a city which
- 3 meets-at-least-two-of-the-following-criteria:
- 4 ar--The-area-has-a-per-capita-income-of-twelve-thousand-six
- 5 hundred-forty-eight-dollars-or-less-based-on-the-2000-census.
- b---The-area-has-a-family-poverty-rate-of-twelve-percent-or
- 7 higher-based-on-the-2000-census-
- 8 c---Ten-percent-or-more-of-the-housing-units-are-vacant-in
- 9 the-area.
- 10 d---The-valuations-of-each-class-of-property-in-the
- 11 designated-area-is-seventy-five-percent-or-less-of-the
- 12 citywide-average-for-that-classification-based-upon-the-most
- 13 recent-valuations-for-property-tax-purposes.
- 14 e---The-area-is-a-blighted-area-as-defined-in-section

- 16 3. The department of economic development shall certify
- 17 eligible enterprise zones that-meet-the-requirements-of
- 18 subsection-1 upon request by the a county or subsection-2-upon
- 19 request-by-the a city, as-applicable unless certification
- 20 causes the area limitations of section 15E.192 to be exceeded.
- 21 Sec. 6. Section 15E.195, subsection 2, Code 2003, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 2. A city with-a-population-of-twenty-four-thousand-or
- 24 more which designates an enterprise zone pursuant to section
- 25 15E.194, subsection 2, and in which an eligible enterprise
- 26 zone is certified shall establish an enterprise zone
- 27 commission to review applications from qualified businesses
- 28 located within or requesting to locate within an enterprise
- 29 zone to receive incentives or assistance as provided in
- 30 section 15E.196. The enterprise zone commission shall review
- 31 applications from qualified housing businesses requesting to
- 32 receive incentives or assistance as provided in section
- 33 15E.193B. The enterprise zone commission shall also review
- 34 applications from qualified development businesses requesting
- 35 to receive incentives or assistance as provided in section

- 1 15E.193C. The commission shall consist of nine members. Six
- 2 of these members shall consist of one representative of an
- 3 international labor organization, one member with economic
- 4 development expertise chosen by the department of economic
- 5 development, one representative of the city council, one
- 6 member of the local community college board of directors, one
- 7 member of the city planning and zoning commission, and one
- 8 representative of the local workforce development center.
- 9 These six members shall select the remaining three members.
- 10 If the enterprise zone consists of an area meeting the
- 11 requirements for eligibility for an urban enterprise community
- 12 under Title XIII of the federal Omnibus Budget Reconciliation
- 13 Act of 1993, one of the remaining three members shall be a
- 14 representative of that community. If a city contiguous to the
- 15 city designating the enterprise zone is included in an
- 16 enterprise zone, a representative of the contiguous city,
- 17 chosen by the city council, shall be a member of the
- 18 commission. A city in which an eliqible enterprise zone is
- 19 certified shall have only one enterprise zone commission. If
- 20 a city has established an enterprise zone commission prior to
- 21 July 1, 1998, the city may petition to the department of
- 22 economic development to change the structure of the existing
- 23 commission.

## 24 EXPLANATION

- 25 This bill relates to the ability of cities and counties to 26 designate enterprise zones.
- 27 Currently, only certain cities and counties meeting
- 28 specific distress criteria may designate enterprise zones
- 29 under the enterprise zone program. The bill eliminates the
- 30 distress criteria. The bill also eliminates a limitation that
- 31 only cities with a population of 24,000 or more may designate
- 32 an enterprise zone. Enterprise zones designated by both
- 33 cities and counties cannot, in aggregate, consist of more than
- 34 1 percent of the total county area.

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
