A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to expenditures from the waste tire management
2 fund.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 2349

1 Section 1. Section 455D.11C, subsections 2 and 3, Code
2 2003, are amended by striking the subsections and inserting in
3 lieu thereof the following:

4 2. Moneys in the waste tire management fund are
5 appropriated and shall be used for the following purposes:

6 a. Thirty percent of the moneys shall be used for all of
7 the following positions:

8 (1) One full-time equivalent position for the
9 administration of permits and registrations for tire
10 processing, storage, and hauling activities, and tire program
11 initiatives.

12 (2) One and one-half full-time equivalent positions for
13 waste tire-related compliance checks and inspections. The
14 full-time equivalent positions shall be divided equally
15 between the field offices in the state.

16 b. Ten percent of the moneys shall be used for a public
17 education and awareness initiative related to the proper tire
18 disposal options and environmental and health hazards posed by
19 improper tire storage.

20 c. Thirty percent of the moneys shall be used for market
21 development initiatives for waste tires.

22 d. Thirty percent of the moneys shall be used for waste
23 tire stockpile abatement initiatives which would require a
24 cost-share agreement with the landowner.

25 Sec. 2. Sections 455D.11D, 455D.11E, 455D.11F, and
26 455D.11H, Code 2003, are repealed.

27 Sec. 3. UNENCUMBERED OR UNOBLIGATED MONEYS --
28 APPROPRIATION. On July 1, 2004, any unencumbered or
29 unobligated moneys that were awarded from the waste tire
30 management fund pursuant to section 455D.11C, subsection 2,
31 Code 2003, shall revert to the waste tire management fund and
32 shall be reallocated and appropriated pursuant to section
33 455D.11C, subsection 2, paragraph "a", as amended in this Act.
34 Commencing with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005, and each
35 subsequent fiscal year through June 30, 2007, any unencumbered

1 or unobligated moneys that were awarded from the waste tire
2 management fund pursuant to section 321.52A, subsection 2,
3 shall remain in the waste tire management fund and shall be
4 used as appropriated pursuant to section 455D.11C, subsection
5 2, as amended in this Act.

6 EXPLANATION

7 This bill appropriates moneys in the waste tire management
8 fund.

9 The bill changes the appropriations from the waste tire
10 management fund. The bill changes the appropriations to
11 provide the following:

12 1. Of the moneys in the fund, 30 percent shall be used for
13 2.50 FTEs in the department of natural resources. One FTE
14 shall be for the administration of permits and registrations
15 for tire processing, storage, and hauling activities, and tire
16 program initiatives. One and one-half FTEs shall be for waste
17 tire-related compliance checks and inspections at field
18 offices around the state.

19 2. Of the moneys in the fund, 10 percent shall be used for
20 a public education and awareness initiative related to the
21 proper tire disposal options and environmental and health
22 hazards posed by improper tire storage.

23 3. Of the moneys in the fund, 30 percent shall be used for
24 market development initiatives for waste tires.

25 4. Of the moneys in the fund, 30 percent shall be used for
26 waste tire stockpile abatement initiatives which would require
27 a cost-share agreement with the landowner.

28 The bill repeals a future repeal of the waste tire
29 management fund. The bill repeals the waste tire grant
30 program and programs awarding moneys to regents institutions
31 for using tire-derived fuel and end-users of processed waste
32 tires.

33 The bill provides that, on July 1, 2004, any unencumbered
34 or unobligated moneys that were awarded from the waste tire
35 management fund shall revert to the waste tire management fund

1 and shall be reallocated and appropriated to fund the 2.50
2 FTEs created in the bill. The bill provide that, commencing
3 with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005, and each subsequent
4 fiscal year through June 30, 2007, any unencumbered or
5 unobligated moneys that are awarded from the waste tire
6 management fund shall remain in the fund and shall be
7 appropriated pursuant to the provisions of the bill.

A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating moneys in the waste tire management fund.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Section 455D.11C, subsections 2 and 3, Code
2 2003, are amended by striking the subsections and inserting in
3 lieu thereof the following:

4 2. Moneys in the waste tire management fund are
5 appropriated and shall be used for the following purposes:

6 a. Thirty-two percent of the moneys shall be used for all
7 of the following positions:

8 (1) One full-time equivalent position for the
9 administration of permits and registrations for tire
10 processing, storage, and hauling activities, and tire program
11 initiatives.

12 (2) One and one-half full-time equivalent positions for
13 waste tire-related compliance checks and inspections. The
14 full-time equivalent positions shall be divided equally
15 between the field offices in the state.

16 b. Eighteen percent of the moneys shall be used for a
17 public education and awareness initiative related to the
18 proper tire disposal options and environmental and health
19 hazards posed by improper tire storage.

20 c. Thirty percent of the moneys shall be used for market
21 development initiatives for waste tires.

22 d. Fifteen percent of the moneys shall be used for waste
23 tire stockpile abatement initiatives which would require a
24 cost-share agreement with the landowner.

25 e. Five percent of the moneys shall be used for a study on
26 the west nile virus, including where the virus is located in
27 the state, how the virus might spread, where the virus might
28 spread, and how the virus may be mitigated. The moneys
29 allocated under this paragraph may be carried forward to the
30 fiscal years beginning July 1, 2003, and ending July 1, 2007.

31 Sec. 2. Sections 455D.11D, 455D.11E, 455D.11F, and
32 455D.11H, Code 2003, are repealed.

33 Sec. 3. UNENCUMBERED OR UNOBLIGATED MONEYS --
34 APPROPRIATION. On July 1, 2004, any unencumbered or
35 unobligated moneys that were awarded from the waste tire

1 management fund pursuant to section 455D.11C, subsection 2,
2 Code 2003, shall revert to the waste tire management fund and
3 shall be reallocated and appropriated pursuant to section
4 455D.11C, subsection 2, paragraph "a", as amended in this Act.

5 EXPLANATION

6 This bill appropriates moneys in the waste tire management
7 fund.

8 The bill changes the appropriations from the waste tire
9 management fund. The bill changes the appropriations to
10 provide the following:

11 1. Of the moneys in the fund, 32 percent shall be used for
12 2.50 FTEs in the department of natural resources. One FTE
13 shall be for the administration of permits and registrations
14 for tire processing, storage, and hauling activities, and tire
15 program initiatives. One and one-half FTEs shall be for waste
16 tire-related compliance checks and inspections at field
17 offices around the state.

18 2. Of the moneys in the fund, 18 percent shall be used for
19 a public education and awareness initiative related to the
20 proper tire disposal options and environmental and health
21 hazards posed by improper tire storage.

22 3. Of the moneys in the fund, 30 percent shall be used for
23 market development initiatives for waste tires.

24 4. Of the moneys in the fund, 15 percent shall be used for
25 waste tire stockpile abatement initiatives which would require
26 a cost-share agreement with the landowner.

27 5. Of the moneys in the fund, 5 percent of the moneys
28 shall be used for a study on west nile virus-related issues.

29 The bill repeals a future repeal of the waste tire
30 management fund. The bill repeals the waste tire grant
31 program and programs awarding moneys to regents institutions
32 for using tire-derived fuel and end-users of processed waste
33 tires.

34 The bill provides that, on July 1, 2004, any unencumbered
35 or unobligated moneys that were awarded from the waste tire

1 management fund shall revert to the waste tire management fund
2 and shall be reallocated and appropriated to fund the 2.50
3 FTEs created in this bill.

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
