1 2 3	An	Act relating to elections and voter registration by implementing requirements of federal law, adjusting language to reflect current practice, making changes related to							
4		absentee voting, and including effective date provisions.							
5	BE	IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:							
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- 1 Section 1. Section 39A.4, subsection 1, paragraph c, Code
- 2 2003, is amended by adding the following new subparagraphs:
- NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (11) Returning a voted absentee ballot
- 4 to the commissioner's office and the person returning the
- 5 ballot is not the voter, a special precinct election official
- 6 designated pursuant to section 53.22, subsection 1, or the
- 7 designee of a voter described in section 53.22, subsection 5.
- 8 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (12) Making a false or untrue statement
- 9 reporting that a voted absentee ballot was returned to the
- 10 commissioner's office by a person other than the voter, a
- 11 special precinct election official designated pursuant to
- 12 section 53.22, subsection 1, or the designee of a voter
- 13 described in section 53.22, subsection 5.
- 14 Sec. 2. Section 47.1, Code Supplement 2003, is amended by
- 15 adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:
- 16 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. The state commissioner shall
- 17 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A, for the implementation of
- 18 uniform and nondiscriminatory administrative complaint
- 19 procedures for resolution of grievances relating to violations
- 20 of Title III of Pub. L. No. 107-252. In complaint proceedings
- 21 in which all of the respondents are local election officials,
- 22 the presiding officer shall be the state commissioner of
- 23 elections. In complaint proceedings in which one of the
- 24 respondents is the state commissioner of elections, the
- 25 presiding officer shall be a panel consisting of all members
- 26 of the state voter registration commission appointed pursuant
- 27 to section 47.8, except the state commissioner of elections or
- 28 the state commissioner's designee.
- 29 Sec. 3. Section 47.7, subsections 2, 3, and 4, Code
- 30 Supplement 2003, are amended by striking the subsections and
- 31 inserting in lieu thereof the following:
- 32 2. a. On or before January 1, 2006, the state registrar
- 33 of voters shall implement in a uniform and nondiscriminatory
- 34 manner, a single, uniform, official, centralized, interactive
- 35 computerized statewide voter registration file defined,

- 1 maintained, and administered at the state level that contains
- 2 the name and registration information of every legally
- 3 registered voter in the state and assigns a unique identifier
- 4 to each legally registered voter in the state. The state
- 5 voter registration system shall be coordinated with other
- 6 agency databases within the state, including, but not limited
- 7 to, the department of transportation driver's license records,
- 8 judicial records of convicted felons and persons declared
- 9 incompetent to vote, and department of public health records
- 10 of deceased persons.
- 11 b. On or after January 1, 2006, a county shall not
- 12 establish or maintain a voter registration system separate
- 13 from the state voter registration system. Each county shall
- 14 provide to the state registrar the names, voter registration
- 15 information, and voting history of each registered voter in
- 16 the county in the form required by the state registrar.
- 17 c. A state or local election official may obtain immediate
- 18 electronic access to the information contained in the
- 19 computerized voter registration file. All voter registration
- 20 information obtained by a local election official shall be
- 21 electronically entered into the computerized voter
- 22 registration file on an expedited basis at the time the
- 23 information is provided to the local election official. The
- 24 state registrar shall provide such support as may be required
- 25 to enable local election officials to electronically enter the
- 26 information into the computerized voter registration file on
- 27 an expedited basis. The list generated from the computerized
- 28 file shall serve as the official voter registration list for
- 29 the conduct of all elections for federal office in the state.
- 30 d. The state registrar shall prescribe by rule the
- 31 procedures for access to the state voter registration file,
- 32 security requirements, and access protocols for adding,
- 33 changing, or deleting information from the state voter
- 34 registration file.
- 35 Sec. 4. Section 47.8, Code Supplement 2003, is amended by

- 1 adding the following new subsection:
- 2 NEW SUBSECTION. 5. In complaint proceedings held pursuant
- 3 to section 47.1 in which one of the respondents is the state
- 4 commissioner of elections, the presiding officer shall be a
- 5 panel consisting of all members of the state voter
- 6 registration commission, except the state commissioner of
- 7 elections or the state commissioner's designee.
- 8 Sec. 5. Section 48A.8, Code 2003, is amended to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 48A.8 REGISTRATION BY MAIL.
- 11 1. An eligible elector may register to vote by completing
- 12 a mail registration form. The form may be mailed or delivered
- 13 by the registrant or the registrant's designee to the
- 14 commissioner in the county where the person resides. A
- 15 separate registration form shall be signed by each individual
- 16 registrant.
- 2. An eligible elector who registers by mail and who has
- 18 not previously voted in an election for federal office in the
- 19 county of registration shall be required to provide
- 20 identification documents when voting for the first time in the
- 21 county, unless the registrant provided on the registration
- 22 form the registrant's Iowa driver's license number, or the
- 23 registrant's Iowa nonoperator's identification card number, or
- 24 the last four numerals of the registrant's social security
- 25 number and the driver's license, nonoperator's identification,
- 26 or partial social security number matches an existing state or
- 27 federal identification record with the same number, name, and
- 28 date of birth. If the registrant under this subsection votes
- 29 in person at the polls, or by absentee ballot at the
- 30 commissioner's office or at a satellite voting station, the
- 31 registrant shall provide a current and valid photo
- 32 identification card, or shall present to the appropriate
- 33 election official one of the following current documents that
- 34 shows the name and address of the registrant:
- 35 a. Utility bill.

- b. Bank statement.
- 2 c. Paycheck.
- d. Government check.
- 4 e. Other government document.
- 5 3. If the registrant under subsection 2 votes an absentee
- 6 ballot by mail, the registrant shall provide a photocopy of
- 7 one of the documents listed in subsection 2 when returning the
- 8 absentee ballot.
- 9 4. A registrant under subsection 2 who is required to
- 10 present identification when casting a ballot in person shall
- 11 be permitted to vote a provisional ballot if the voter does
- 12 not provide the required identification documents. If a voter
- 13 who is required to present identification when casting a
- 14 ballot votes an absentee ballot by mail, the ballot returned
- 15 by the voter shall be considered a provisional ballot pursuant
- 16 to sections 49.81 and 53.31.
- 17 Sec. 6. Section 48A.11, subsection 1, paragraph b, Code
- 18 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 19 b. The registrant's name, including first name and any
- 20 family forename or surname.
- 21 Sec. 7. Section 48A.11, subsection 1, paragraph e, Code
- 22 2003, is amended by striking the paragraph and inserting in
- 23 lieu thereof the following:
- 24 e. Iowa driver's license number if the registrant has a
- 25 current and valid Iowa driver's license, Iowa nonoperator's
- 26 identification card if the registrant has a current and valid
- 27 Iowa nonoperator's identification card, or the last four
- 28 numerals of the registrant's social security number. If the
- 29 registrant does not have an Iowa driver's license number, an
- 30 nonoperator's identification card number, or a social security
- 31 number, the form shall provide space for a number to be
- 32 assigned as provided in subsection 7.
- 33 Sec. 8. Section 48A.11, subsection 1, paragraph f, Code
- 34 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- f. Date of birth, including month, date, and year.

- 1 Sec. 9. Section 48A.11, Code 2003, is amended by adding
- 2 the following new subsection:
- NEW SUBSECTION. 2A. The following questions and statement
- 4 regarding eligibility shall be included on forms that may be
- 5 used for registration by mail:
- 6 a. Are you a citizen of the United States of America?
- 7 b. Will you be eighteen years of age on or before election
- 8 day?
- 9 c. If you checked "no" in response to either of these
- 10 questions, do not complete this form.
- 11 Sec. 10. Section 48A.11, subsection 5, Code 2003, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 5. All forms for voter registration shall be prescribed by
- 14 rule-adopted by the state voter registration commission.
- 15 Sec. 11. Section 48A.11, Code 2003, is amended by adding
- 16 the following new subsection:
- 17 NEW SUBSECTION. 7. A voter registration application
- 18 lacking the registrant's name, sex, date of birth, or
- 19 residence address or description shall not be processed. A
- 20 voter registration application lacking the registrant's
- 21 driver's license number, Iowa nonoperator's identification
- 22 card number, or the last four digits of the registrant's
- 23 social security number shall not be processed. A registrant
- 24 whose registration is not processed pursuant to this
- 25 subsection shall be notified pursuant to section 48A.26,
- 26 subsection 3. A registrant who does not have an Iowa driver's
- 27 license number, an Iowa nonoperator's identification number,
- 28 or a social security number and who notifies the registrar of
- 29 such shall be assigned a unique identifying number that shall
- 30 serve to identify the registrant for voter registration
- 31 purposes.
- 32 Sec. 12. NEW SECTION. 48A.25A VERIFICATION OF VOTER
- 33 REGISTRATION INFORMATION.
- 34 Upon receipt of an application for voter registration by
- 35 mail, the state registrar of voters shall compare the driver's

- 1 license number, the Iowa nonoperator's identification card
- 2 number, or the last four numerals of the social security
- 3 number provided by the registrant with the records of the
- 4 state department of transportation. To be verified, the voter
- 5 registration record shall contain the same name, date of
- 6 birth, and driver's license or whole or partial social
- 7 security number as the records of the department of
- 8 transportation. If the information cannot be verified, the
- 9 application shall be rejected and the registrant shall be
- 10 notified of the reason for the rejection. If the information
- 11 can be verified, a record shall be made of the verification
- 12 and the application shall be accepted.
- 13 The voter registration commission shall adopt rules in
- 14 accordance with chapter 17A to provide procedures for
- 15 processing registration applications if the department of
- 16 transportation does not, before the close of registration for
- 17 an election for which the voter registration would be
- 18 effective, if verified, provide a report that the information
- 19 on the application has matched or not matched the records of
- 20 the department.
- 21 This section does not apply to persons entitled to register
- 22 to vote and to vote pursuant to section 48A.5, subsection 4.
- 23 Sec. 13. Section 48A.26, subsection 3, Code 2003, is
- 24 amended to read as follows:
- 25 3. If the registration form is missing required
- 26 information pursuant to section 48A.11, subsection 7, the
- 27 acknowledgment shall advise the applicant what additional
- 28 information is required. The commissioner shall enclose a new
- 29 registration by mail form for the applicant to use. If the
- 30 registration form has no address, the commissioner shall make
- 31 a reasonable effort to determine where the acknowledgment
- 32 should be sent. If the incomplete application is received
- 33 during the twelve days before the close of registration for an
- 34 election, the commissioner shall provide the registrant with
- 35 an opportunity to complete the form before the close of

- Sec. 14. Section 48A.26, Code 2003, is amended by adding
- 3 the following new subsections:
- 4 NEW SUBSECTION. 3A. If the registrant applied by mail to
- 5 register to vote and did not answer either "yes" or "no" to
- 6 the question in section 48A.11, subsection 2A, paragraph "a",
- 7 the application shall be processed, but the registration shall
- 8 be designated as valid only for elections that do not include
- 9 candidates for federal offices on the ballot. The
- 10 acknowledgment shall advise the applicant that the status of
- 11 the registration is local and the reason for the registration
- 12 being assigned local status. The commissioner shall enclose a
- 13 new registration by mail form for the applicant to use. If
- 14 the original application is received during the twelve days
- 15 before the close of registration for an election that includes
- 16 candidates for federal offices on the ballot, the commissioner
- 17 shall provide the registrant with an opportunity to complete
- 18 the form before the close of registration.
- 19 NEW SUBSECTION. 3B. If the registrant applied by mail to
- 20 register to vote and answered "no" to the question in section
- 21 48A.11, subsection 2A, paragraph "a", the application shall
- 22 not be processed. The acknowledgement shall advise the
- 23 applicant that the registration has been rejected because the
- 24 applicant indicated on the registration form that the
- 25 applicant is not a citizen of the United States.
- Sec. 15. Section 48A.28, subsection 2, unnumbered
- 27 paragraph 2, Code 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 28 A commissioner participating in the national change of
- 29 address program, in the first quarter of each calendar year,
- 30 shall send a notice and preaddressed, postage paid return card
- 31 by forwardable mail to each registered voter whose name was
- 32 not reported by the national change of address program and who
- 33 has not voted, in two or more consecutive general elections
- 34 and has not registered again, or who has not reported a change
- 35 to an existing registration, or who has not responded to a

- 1 notice from the commissioner or registrar during the preceding
- 2 four-calendar-years period between and following the previous
- 3 two general elections. The form and language of the notice
- 4 and return card shall be specified by the state voter
- 5 registration commission by rule. A registered voter shall not
- 6 be sent a notice and return card under this subsection more
- 7 frequently than once in a four-year period.

- 19 designating whether the records are active, or inactive,
- 20 local, or pending. Inactive records are records of registered
- 21 voters to whom notices have been sent pursuant to section

- 23 otherwise responded to the notice, and those records have been
- 24 designated inactive pursuant to section 48A.29. Local records
- 25 are records of applicants who did not answer either "yes" or
- 26 "no" to the question in section 48A.11, subsection 2A,
- 27 paragraph "a". Pending records are records of applicants
- 28 whose applications have not been verified pursuant to section
- 29 48A.25A. All other records are active records. An inactive
- 30 record shall be made active when the registered voter votes at
- 31 an election, registers again, or reports a change of name,
- 32 address, telephone number, or political party affiliation. A
- 33 pending record shall be made active upon verification. A
- 34 local record shall be valid for any election for which no
- 35 candidates for federal office appear on the ballot, but the

- 1 registrant may not vote in a federal election unless the
- 2 registrant submits a new voter registration application before
- 3 election day indicating that the applicant is a citizen of the
- 4 United States.
- 5 Sec. 18. Section 48A.38, subsection 1, paragraph f, Code

- 8 registrar of voters shall remove a voter's social security
- 9 number, driver's license number, or Iowa nonoperator's

- 12 Sec. 19. Section 49.81, Code 2003, is amended to read as

- 14 49.81 PROCEDURE FOR CHALLENGED VOTER TO CAST PROVISIONAL
- 15 BALLOT.
- 16 l. A prospective voter who is prohibited under section
- 17 48A.8, subsection 4, section 49.77, subsection 4, or section
- 18 49.80 from voting except under this section shall be permitted
- 19 to notified by the appropriate precinct election official that
- 20 the voter may cast a paper provisional ballot. If a booth
- 21 meeting the requirement of section 49.25 is not available at

This written 21 statement and evidence may be given to an election official of 22 this precinct on election day or mailed or delivered to the 23 county commissioner of elections, but must be received before 24 .... a.m./p.m. on ..... at ..... If your ballot is not 25 counted you will receive, by mail, notification of this fact 26 and the reason that the ballot was not counted. 27 Any elector may present written statements or 28 documents, supporting or opposing the counting of any special 29 provisional ballot, to the precinct election officials on 30 election day, until the hour for closing the polls. Any 31 statements or documents so presented shall be delivered to the 32 commissioner when the election supplies are returned.

     The ballots shall be counted according to the voters' marks
27 on them as provided in sections 49.92 to 49.97, and not
28 otherwise. If, for any reason, it is impossible to determine
29 from a ballot, as marked, the choice of the voter for any
30 office, the vote for that office shall not be counted. When
31 there is a conflict between a straight party or organization
32 vote for one political party or nonparty political
33 organization and the vote cast by marking the voting target
34 next to the name of a candidate for another political party or
35 nonparty political organization on the ballot, the mark next
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- 1 to the name of the candidate shall be held to control, and the
- 2 straight party or organization vote in that case shall not
- 3 apply as to that office. Any-ballot-shall-be-rejected-if-it
- 4 is-marked-in-any-other-manner-than-authorized-in-sections
- 5 49:92-to-49:97. A ballot shall be rejected if the voter used

- 33 7. A statement that an absentee ballot will by mailed to
- 34 the applicant within twenty-four hours after the ballot for
- 35 the election is available.

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- The commissioner shall make receipt forms required by this
- 2 section available for photocopying at the expense of the
- 3 political party, candidate, or committee.
- 4 Sec. 27. Section 53.8, subsection 2, Code 2003, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 2. If an application is received so late that it is
- 7 unlikely that the absentee ballot can be returned in time to

- 16 Sec. 28. Section 53.17, subsection 1, Code 2003, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 1. The sealed carrier envelope may be delivered by the
- 19 registered voter, by the special precinct election officials
- 20 designated pursuant to section 53.22, subsection 1, or by the
- 21 voter's designee if the absentee ballot is voted by a voter
- 22 described in section 53.22, subsection 5, to the
- 23 commissioner's office no later than the time the polls are
- 24 closed on election day.
- 25 Sec. 29. NEW SECTION. 53.37A STATE COMMISSIONER DUTIES.
- 26 The state commissioner of elections shall provide
- 27 information regarding voter registration procedures and
- 28 absentee ballot procedures to be used by members of the armed
- 29 forces of the United States. The state commissioner shall
- 30 accept valid voter registration applications and absentee
- 31 ballot applications and shall forward the applications to the
- 32 appropriate county commissioner of elections in a timely
- 33 manner.
- 34 Sec. 30. Section 53.40, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2003,
- 35 is amended to read as follows:

A request in writing for a ballot may be made by any member 1 2 of the armed forces of the United States who is or will be a 3 qualified voter on the day of the election at which the ballot 4 is to be cast, at any time before the election. Any member of 5 the armed forces of the United States may request ballots for 6 all elections to be held within-a-calendar-year through the 7 next two general elections. The request may be made by using 8 the federal postcard application form and indicating that the 9 applicant wishes to receive ballots for all elections as 10 permitted by state law. The county commissioner shall send 11 the applicant a ballot for each election held during-the 12 calendar-year-in-which after the application is received and 13 through the next two general elections. The commissioner 14 shall forward a copy of the absentee ballot request to other 15 commissioners who are responsible under section 47.2, 16 subsection 2, for conducting elections in which the applicant 17 is eligible to vote. Sec. 31. Section 53.53, Code 2003, is amended by adding 18 19 the following new unnumbered paragraphs: 20 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. A federal write-in ballot 21 received by the state commissioner of elections shall be 22 forwarded immediately to the appropriate county commissioner. 23 However, if the state commissioner receives a federal write-in 24 ballot after election day and before noon on the Monday 25 following an election, the state commissioner shall at once 26 verify that the voter has complied with the requirements of 27 this section and that the voter's federal write-in ballot is 28 eligible to be counted. If the ballot is eligible to be 29 counted, the state commissioner shall notify the appropriate 30 county commissioner and make arrangements for the ballot to be 31 transmitted to the county for counting. If the ballot is not 32 eligible to be counted, the state commissioner shall mail the 33 ballot to the appropriate commissioner along with notification 34 that the ballot is ineligible to be counted. 35 commissioner shall keep the ballot with the other records of

- 1 the election.
- 2 <u>NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH</u>. The county commissioner shall
- 3 notify a voter when the voter's federal write-in ballot was
- 4 not counted and shall give the voter the reason the ballot was
- 5 not counted.
- 6 Sec. 32. IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed
- 7 of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 8 EXPLANATION
- 9 This bill makes changes to the law relating to elections,
- 10 absentee voting, and voter registration. The bill contains
- 11 Code language changes which, unless otherwise noted, are
- 12 necessary to comply with requirements of Public Law No. 107-
- 13 252, the Help America Vote Act of 2002.
- 14 Code section 39A.4 is amended to provide that an
- 15 unauthorized person who returns a voted absentee ballot
- 16 commits election misconduct in the third degree. The section
- 17 is further amended to provide that a person who makes a false
- 18 or untrue statement reporting that a voted absentee ballot was
- 19 returned by an unauthorized person commits election misconduct
- 20 in the third degree. Election misconduct in the third degree
- 21 is a serious misdemeanor. The amendments to Code section
- 22 39A.4 are not required by the Help America Vote Act.
- 23 Code section 47.1 is amended to require the state
- 24 commissioner of elections (secretary of state) to adopt, by
- 25 rule, administrative complaint procedures for resolution of
- 26 grievances relating to violations of those provisions of the
- 27 Help America Vote Act relating to uniform and
- 28 nondiscriminatory election technology and administration
- 29 requirements.
- 30 Code section 47.1 is also amended to designate the
- 31 presiding officer in complaint proceedings. A conforming
- 32 amendment is made to Code section 47.8.
- 33 Code section 47.7 is amended to require the state registrar
- 34 of voters (secretary of state), on or before January 1, 2006,
- 35 to implement a centralized, computerized statewide voter

- 1 registration system. The statewide system must be interactive
- 2 with other agency computer databases in the state. Code
- 3 section 48A.36 is amended to conform to this requirement.
- 4 Code section 48A.8 is amended to provide that an eligible
- 5 elector who registers by mail and who has not previously voted
- 6 in an election for federal office in the county of
- 7 registration shall be required to present identification when
- 8 voting for the first time unless the voter provided the
- 9 voter's Iowa driver's license number, or the voter's Iowa
- 10 nonoperator's identification card number, or the last four
- 11 numerals of the voter's social security number on the
- 12 registration form and those numbers were subsequently
- 13 verified. If the voter votes an absentee ballot by mail, the
- 14 voter is required to include a photocopy of one of the
- 15 optional forms of identification with the ballot. If the
- 16 required identification is not provided, the voter will be
- 17 allowed to vote a provisional ballot or, if voting an absentee
- 18 ballot by mail, the absentee ballot shall be considered a
- 19 provisional ballot.
- 20 Code section 48A.11, relating to information required when
- 21 registering to vote, is amended to require that the first name
- 22 and any family forename or surname be included when providing
- 23 the registrant's name. That section is also amended to
- 24 require that the registrant provide the registrant's Iowa
- 25 driver's license number or Iowa nonoperator's identification
- 26 card number or, if not available, the last four numerals of
- 27 the registrant's social security number. If the registrant
- 28 does not have an Iowa driver's license, Iowa nonoperator's
- 29 identification card, or social security number, the registrar
- 30 is to assign the registrant an identification number for voter
- 31 registration purposes. Code section 48A.11 is amended to
- 32 specify that the requirement for the registrant's date of
- 33 birth includes the month, date, and year of birth.
- Code section 48A.11 is amended to require that the mail
- 35 voter registration form ask the registrant if the registrant

- 1 is a citizen of the United States and if the registrant will
- 2 be 18 years old on or before election day. The form shall
- 3 contain a statement that if the registrant answered "no" to
- 4 either of those questions, the registrant is not to complete
- 5 the registration form. The Code section is amended to add a
- 6 new subsection providing that if certain required information
- 7 is not provided on the registration form, the form shall not
- 8 be processed and the registrar shall mail an acknowledgment to
- 9 the registrant notifying the registrant that the registration
- 10 could not be processed.
- 11 The amendment to Code section 48A.11, striking the
- 12 requirement that the state voter registration commission
- 13 prescribe voter registration forms by rule, is not required by
- 14 the Help America Vote Act.
- New Code section 48A.25A requires the state registrar of
- 16 voters to verify the registrant's driver's license number,
- 17 nonoperator's identification card number, or the last four
- 18 digits of the registrant's social security number. If the
- 19 number provided cannot be verified, the state registrar shall
- 20 reject the registration application and the registrant shall
- 21 be notified. If the information can be verified, the
- 22 registrar is to make a record of the verification. The
- 23 section is also amended to require the voter registration
- 24 commission to adopt rules to provide procedures for processing
- 25 registration applications in certain circumstances. The bill
- 26 provides that new Code section 48A.25A does not apply to
- 27 registrants living outside the United States.
- 28 Code section 48A.26, is amended to provide that if a voter
- 29 registration form lacking required information is received
- 30 during the 12 days before the close of registration, the
- 31 commissioner shall provide the registrant with an opportunity
- 32 to complete the form before the close of registration. The
- 33 Code section is also amended to provide that registrants whose
- 34 registration status is local shall be notified of such status,
- 35 and provided an opportunity to submit another registration

- 1 before the close of registration for elections with federal
- 2 offices on the ballot. Finally, Code section 48A.26 is
- 3 amended to provide that if a registrant applied by mail to
- 4 register to vote and answered "no" to the question relating to
- 5 United States citizenship, the application shall not be
- 6 processed and the acknowledgement shall inform the applicant
- 7 why the application was not processed.
- 8 Code section 48A.28 is amended to change the time period
- 9 from four consecutive calendar years to two or more
- 10 consecutive general elections under which a commissioner
- 11 participating in the national change of address program is to
- 12 notify a registered voter if the voter has not voted after
- 13 registering or if the voter has not responded to a prior
- 14 notice mailed by the commissioner.
- 15 Code section 48A.37 is amended to add voter registration
- 16 status codes of "local" and "pending" to describe those
- 17 registrations by mail that did not answer the question of
- 18 United States citizenship or who provide incomplete
- 19 information on the voter registration form, respectively.
- 20 Code section 48A.38 is amended to require that a voter's
- 21 driver's license number or Iowa nonoperator's identification
- 22 card number be removed from a voter registration list prepared
- 23 at the request of any person. Current law requires that the
- 24 voter's social security number be removed.
- 25 Code sections 49.81, 50.20, and 50.21 are amended to change
- 26 the term "special ballot" to "provisional ballot" which is the
- 27 term used in the Help America Vote Act for a ballot cast by a
- 28 challenged voter. Code section 49.81 is also amended to
- 29 provide that when a challenged voter's ballot is not counted
- 30 the commissioner, when notifying the voter, shall notify the
- 31 voter by mail and shall inform the voter why the ballot was
- 32 not counted. The section is also amended to provide
- 33 notification to the voter pertaining to identification
- 34 requirements.
- 35 Code section 49.98, relating to counting ballots, is

- 1 amended to require the state commissioner of elections to
- 2 adopt rules providing uniform definitions of what constitutes
  3 a vote.
- 4 Code section 52.2, relating to the purchase of voting
- 5 machines or electronic voting systems, is amended to allow
- 6 voting machines and electronic voting systems to be used
- 7 concurrently at the same precinct.
- 8 Code section 53.2 is amended to strike the provision that
- 9 allows a voter to submit an absentee ballot application other
- 10 than the application prepared by the state commissioner of
- 11 elections. Code section 53.2 is also amended to provide that
- 12 a completed application for an absentee ballot returned by a
- 13 person acting on behalf of a political party, a candidate, or
- 14 a political committee or a candidate's committee shall be
- 15 returned to the commissioner's office within 72 hours of the
- 16 time the completed application was received from the
- 17 applicant. These amendments to Code section 53.2 are not
- 18 required by the Help America Vote Act.
- 19 New Code section 53.3 is enacted to provide that when an
- 20 application for an absentee ballot is solicited by, and
- 21 returned to the commissioner's office by, a person acting on
- 22 behalf of a political party, a candidate, or a political
- 23 committee or a candidate's committee, the person soliciting
- 24 and returning the application must give the applicant a
- 25 receipt for the completed application. The bill further
- 26 provides that the county commissioner of elections is to make
- 27 receipt forms available for photocopying at the expense of the
- 28 political party, candidate, or committee. New Code section
- 29 53.3 is not required by the Help America Vote Act.
- 30 Code section 53.17 is amended to provide that a voted
- 31 absentee ballot may be returned to the commissioner's office
- 32 only by the voter, or by the special precinct election
- 33 officials designated to deliver and return absentee ballots on
- 34 behalf of a person confined in a health facility, or by a
- 35 person designated by the voter if the voter was confined in a

1 health facility outside of the voter's county of residence 2 within three days of the election.

New Code section 53.37A requires the state commissioner of

4 elections to provide information to members of the armed

5 forces of the United States on voter registration and absentee

6 ballot procedures. The section also requires the state

7 commissioner to accept voter registration applications and

8 absentee ballot applications from members of the armed forces

9 and to forward the applications to the appropriate county

10 commissioner of elections.

Code section 53.40 is amended to extend the time period

12 during which a commissioner is to mail absentee ballots to a

13 member of the armed forces after receiving the member's

14 initial application for an absentee ballot. The time period

15 is extended from one calendar year after receipt of the

16 application to the next two general elections after receipt of

17 the application.

18 Code section 53.53 is amended to provide that when the

19 state commissioner receives a federal write-in ballot, the

20 commissioner is to immediately forward it to the appropriate

21 county commissioner of elections. If the ballot is received

22 after election day but before noon on the Monday following the

23 election, the state commissioner, rather than the county

24 commissioner, is to verify that the ballot is eligible to be

25 counted and shall notify the appropriate county commissioner

26 and transmit the ballot. If the ballot is not to be counted,

27 the county commissioner is required to notify the voter and

28 give the reason why the ballot was not counted.

The bill takes effect upon enactment.

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
