- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 155B.1 IOWA SENIOR
- 2 PHARMACEUTICAL CARE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED.
- 3 The Iowa senior pharmaceutical care program is established
- 4 to provide a comprehensive pharmacy benefits plan for Iowa's
- 5 Medicare-eligible population.
- 6 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 155B.2 DEFINITIONS.
- 7 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
- 8 indicates:
- 9 1. "Brand name" means brand name as defined in section
- 10 155A.3.
- 11 2. "Department" means the Iowa department of public
- 12 health.
- 3. "Federal poverty level" means the federal poverty level
- 14 as defined by the most recently revised poverty income
- 15 guidelines published by the United States department of health
- 16 and human services.
- 17 4. "Generic name" means generic name as defined in section
- 18 155A.3.
- 19 5. "Iowa senior pharmaceutical care program" or "program"
- 20 means the Iowa senior pharmaceutical care program created in
- 21 section 155B.1.
- 22 6. "Medical assistance" means medical assistance as
- 23 defined in section 249A.2
- 7. "Medicare" means the federal Medicare program
- 25 established by Title XVIII of the federal Social Security Act.
- 26 8. "Prescription drug" means a prescription drug as
- 27 defined in section 155A.3 that is included in coverage under
- 28 the medical assistance program and that is manufactured by a
- 29 drug manufacturer that enters into a rebate agreement under
- 30 this chapter.
- 31 9. "Prescription drug manufacturer" means a producer of a
- 32 prescription drug product that is made available for
- 33 distribution to consumers through licensed pharmacies in the
- 34 state.
- 35 10. "Prescription drug order" means prescription drug

- 1 order as defined in section 155A.3.
- 2 11. "Program payment rate" means the maximum rate of
- 3 payment allowed to participating pharmacies under the program,
- 4 established as the lower of either the pharmacy's usual and
- 5 customary charge or the average wholesale price minus ten
- 6 percent plus a dispensing fee which dispensing fee represents
- 7 the seventy-fifth percentile of dispensing fee charges by Iowa
- 8 pharmacists to private-paying patients.
- 9 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 155B.3 PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY --
- 10 BENEFIT LEVELS -- APPLICATION.
- 11 1. An individual may participate in the Iowa senior
- 12 pharmaceutical care program if the individual meets all of the
- 13 following criteria:
- 14 a. Is a resident of this state.
- 15 b. Is at least sixty-five years of age.
- 16 c. Is not a recipient of medical assistance or, as a
- 17 recipient, does not receive prescription drug coverage.
- 18 d. Does not have third-party coverage of prescription
- 19 drugs.
- 20 e. Pays the program enrollment fee, deductible, and
- 21 copayment amount specified in this section, as applicable.
- 22 2. Program participants shall pay all of the following:
- 23 a. For each twelve-month benefit period, a program
- 24 enrollment fee of twenty dollars.
- 25 b. (1) For an individual whose income is below one
- 26 hundred sixty percent of the federal poverty level, a
- 27 copayment of twenty dollars for each brand name prescription
- 28 drug and a copayment of five dollars for each generic name
- 29 prescription drug.
- 30 (2) For an individual whose income is between one hundred
- 31 sixty percent and two hundred forty percent of the federal
- 32 poverty level, a deductible for prescription drugs of five
- 33 hundred dollars for each twelve-month benefit period, and
- 34 following payment of the deductible amount, a copayment of
- 35 twenty dollars for each brand name prescription drug and a

- 1 copayment of five dollars for each generic name prescription 2 drug.
- 3 (3) For an individual whose income is above two hundred
- 4 forty percent of the federal poverty level, a deductible for
- 5 prescription drugs of one thousand dollars for each twelve-
- 6 month benefit period, and following payment of the deductible
- 7 amount, a copayment of twenty dollars for each brand name
- 8 prescription drug and a copayment of five dollars for each
- 9 generic prescription drug.
- 3. The department shall develop and distribute a form for
- 11 application for the program, shall determine eligibility of
- 12 applicants for each twelve-month period, and shall issue to
- 13 program participants a prescription drug card for use in
- 14 purchasing prescription drugs.
- 15 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 155B.4 CALCULATION OF CHARGES TO
- 16 PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS -- PAYMENTS TO PHARMACISTS -- REBATES --
- 17 PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION.
- 18 1. Beginning October 1, 2003, as a condition of
- 19 participation by a pharmacy or pharmacist in the medical
- 20 assistance program, the pharmacy or pharmacist shall not
- 21 charge an individual who presents a valid prescription drug
- 22 order and an Iowa senior pharmaceutical care program card in
- 23 excess of the following, as applicable:
- 24 a. For an individual whose income is below one hundred
- 25 sixty percent of the federal poverty level, the applicable
- 26 copayment.
- 27 b. For an individual whose income is between one hundred
- 28 sixty percent and two hundred forty percent of the federal
- 29 poverty level, payment of the program payment rate prior to
- 30 reaching the five hundred dollar deductible amount. Once the
- 31 five hundred dollar deductible amount is reached, such an
- 32 individual shall not be charged in excess of the applicable
- 33 copayment.
- 34 c. For an individual whose income is above two hundred
- 35 forty percent of the federal poverty level, payment of the

- 1 retail price prior to reaching the one thousand dollar
- 2 deductible amount. Once the one thousand dollar deductible
- 3 amount is reached, such an individual shall not be charged in
- 4 excess of the applicable copayment.
- 5 2. The department shall calculate and transmit to
- 6 pharmacies and pharmacists that are certified providers of
- 7 medical assistance the amounts that may be used in calculating
- 8 charges under subsection 1. The department shall periodically
- 9 update this information and transmit the updated amounts to
- 10 pharmacies and pharmacists.
- 11 3. The department shall, under a schedule that is
- 12 identical to that used by the department for payment of
- 13 pharmacy provider claims under the medical assistance program,
- 14 provide to pharmacies and pharmacists payments for
- 15 prescription drugs sold by the pharmacies or pharmacists to
- 16 participants in the program. The department shall develop and
- 17 distribute a claim form for use by pharmacies and pharmacists
- 18 under this subsection and may limit payment under this
- 19 subsection to those prescription drugs for which payment
- 20 claims are submitted by pharmacists or pharmacies directly to
- 21 the department.
- 22 4. Pharmacists shall be reimbursed for each prescription
- 23 drug sold to a program participant at the program payment
- 24 rate, minus any copayment paid by the individual. In order to
- 25 determine the dispensing fee paid under the program payment
- 26 rate, the university of Iowa college of pharmacy, department
- 27 of pharmaceutical socioeconomics, shall conduct a survey to
- 28 determine the seventy-fifth percentile level of dispensing fee
- 29 charges by Iowa pharmacists to private-paying patients on an
- 30 annual basis.
- 31 5. To ensure appropriate use of pharmaceuticals, the
- 32 program shall reimburse pharmacists for medication therapy
- 33 management services. The reimbursement system shall include
- 34 coverage for both pharmaceutical case management services and
- 35 event-based services as defined by rule of the department.

- 1 The department may adopt rules for the program that are the
- 2 same as the utilization and cost control procedures that apply
- 3 under the medical assistance program.
- 4 6. The department shall provide to a prescription drug
- 5 manufacturer that sells prescription drugs for use in this
- 6 state documents designed for use by the prescription drug
- 7 manufacturer in entering into a rebate agreement with the
- 8 department that is modeled on the rebate agreement specified
- 9 under 42 U.S.C. § 1396r-8. A rebate agreement under this
- 10 subsection shall include all of the following:
- 11 a. The prescription drug manufacturer shall make rebate
- 12 payments for each prescription drug of the manufacturer that
- 13 is prescribed for and purchased by individuals who meet
- 14 program criteria.
- b. The rebate amount shall be determined by a method
- 16 specified in 42 U.S.C. § 1396r-8.
- 7. The department shall establish an advisory council to
- 18 provide advice regarding program policies and directions. The
- 19 director shall appoint to the advisory council three
- 20 practicing pharmacists, three practicing physicians, one
- 21 representative of the university of Iowa college of public
- 22 health, one representative of the university of Iowa college
- 23 of medicine, one representative of the university of Iowa
- 24 college of pharmacy, and three members of the public who are
- 25 representative of individuals sixty-five years of age or
- 26 older.
- 27 8. The department, in consultation with the department of
- 28 human services, shall include in the contract for the Medicaid
- 29 drug utilization review commission a directive that the
- 30 commission develop and implement utilization and cost control
- 31 strategies. Cost-containment and quality assurance services
- 32 shall include but are not limited to formulary development,
- 33 utilization review and management, and provider and patient
- 34 education. Additionally, the commission shall manage the
- 35 rebate negotiation and collection processes under this

- 1 chapter.
- 2 10. The department shall monitor compliance by pharmacies
- 3 and pharmacists that are certified providers of medical
- 4 assistance with the requirements of this section and shall
- 5 annually submit a report to the general assembly and the
- 6 governor regarding compliance. The report shall include
- 7 information on any pharmacies or pharmacists that discontinue
- 8 participation as certified providers of medical assistance and
- 9 the reasons provided for the discontinuance.
- 10 11. The department shall adopt rules to implement and
- 11 administer this chapter. The department may contract with
- 12 outside entities to administer the program including but not
- 13 limited to contracting for rebate negotiation and collection
- 14 processes, and pharmacy claims administration to provide for
- 15 electronic, point-of-service claims adjudication.
- 16 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 155B.5 IOWA SENIOR PHARMACEUTICAL
- 17 CARE PROGRAM FUND.
- 18 There is created in the state treasury an Iowa senior
- 19 pharmaceutical care program fund under the authority of the
- 20 Iowa department of public health. Program enrollment fees and
- 21 any other moneys appropriated to or collected by the program
- 22 shall be deposited in the fund and are appropriated to the
- 23 department to carry out the purposes and requirements of this
- 24 chapter. Amounts deposited in the fund shall not be
- 25 transferred, used, obligated, appropriated, or otherwise
- 26 encumbered except as provided in this chapter.
- 27 Notwithstanding section 8.33, any unexpended balance in the
- 28 fund at the end of the fiscal year shall be retained in the
- 29 fund. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, subsection 2, interest
- 30 or earnings on moneys deposited into the fund shall be
- 31 credited to the fund. Amounts deposited in the fund that
- 32 remain unexpended or unencumbered at the close of the fiscal
- 33 year shall remain in the fund for utilization as provided in
- 34 this section for the following fiscal year.
- 35 EXPLANATION

- 1 This bill establishes an Iowa senior pharmaceutical care
- 2 program to provide coverage for prescription drugs for
- 3 individuals 65 years of age or older who meet certain other
- 4 program criteria. The prescription drugs for which coverage
- 5 is provided under the program are prescription drugs covered
- 6 under the medical assistance program for which a prescription
- 7 drug manufacturer has entered a rebate agreement with the Iowa
- 8 department of public health. The bill provides that as a
- 9 condition of participation in the medical assistance program,
- 10 a pharmacy or pharmacist must participate in the Iowa senior
- 11 pharmaceutical care program.
- 12 Under the program, eligible individuals would pay an annual
- 13 program enrollment fee of \$20, a copayment, and for those
- 14 individuals with incomes of 160 percent of the federal poverty
- 15 level and above, an annual deductible amount based on income.
- 16 The bill directs the Iowa department of public health to
- 17 develop and distribute a form for application for the program,
- 18 determine eligibility of applicants, and issue prescription
- 19 drug cards for use in purchasing prescription drugs under the
- 20 program.
- 21 The bill provides for the calculation of charges to program
- 22 participants by participating pharmacies and pharmacists and
- 23 directs the department to calculate and transmit to pharmacies
- 24 and pharmacists the amounts to be used in calculating the
- 25 charges. The bill provides for payment of participating
- 26 pharmacies and pharmacists based on a program payment rate,
- 27 minus any copayment paid by the participant. The program also
- 28 provides for reimbursement to pharmacists for medication
- 29 therapy management services. The bill also authorizes the
- 30 department to adopt rules for the program that are the same as
- 31 the utilization and cost control procedures that apply under
- 32 the medical assistance program.
- 33 The bill directs the department to provide to a
- 34 prescription drug manufacturer that sells prescription drugs
- 35 for use in this state documents designed for use by the

1 manufacturer in entering into a rebate agreement with the

2 department that is modeled on the rebate agreement specified

3 under federal law. The rebate agreement is to include that

4 the manufacturer make rebate payments for each prescription

5 drug of the manufacturer that is prescribed for and purchased

6 by individuals who meet program criteria and that the rebate

7 amount shall be determined by a method specified in federal

8 law.

9 The bill directs the department to establish an advisory

10 council to provide advice regarding program policies and

11 directions. The bill also directs the department to include

12 in the contract for the Medicaid drug utilization review

13 commission a directive that the commission develop and

14 implement utilization and cost control strategies. Cost-

15 containment and quality assurance services are to include

16 formulary development, utilization review and management, and

17 provider and patient education.

18 The bill directs the department to monitor compliance by

19 pharmacies and pharmacists with the requirements of the bill

20 and to submit an annual report to the general assembly and the

21 governor regarding compliance. The bill directs the

22 department to adopt rules to implement and administer the

23 bill.

24 The bill creates in the state treasury an Iowa senior

25 pharmaceutical care program fund under the authority of the

26 department. Program enrollment fees and any other moneys

27 appropriated to or collected by the program are to be

28 deposited in the fund and are appropriated to the department

29 to carry out the purposes and requirements of the bill.
