                             EXPLANATION
      This bill directs the director of human services to adopt
15
16 rules to increase the ongoing personal needs allowance for a
17 Medicaid recipient residing in a nursing facility to $50
18 beginning July 1, 2003. The rules are to provide that the
19 amount is to be increased annually thereafter by the same
20 percentage as the percentage increase in the consumer price
21 index for all urban consumers during the 12-month period prior
22 to June of the calendar year involved. The bill authorizes
23 the department to adopt emergency rules to implement the bill.

HF 40 - Personal Needs Allowance (LSB 1558 HH)

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Fiscal Note Version — New

#### Description

House File 40 requires the Director of the Department of Human Services to adopt rules to increase the personal needs allowance for a Medicaid recipient in a nursing facility to \$50 beginning July 1, 2003. The amount is to be increased annually by the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index. The current personal needs allowance is \$30 per month.

#### **Assumptions**

- 1. There are 529 nursing facility residents who have no other source of income. The increase in the personal needs allowance for these individuals would require 100% State funds.
- 2. The annual cost to increase the personal needs allowance by \$20 per month for the 100% State funded population is \$127,000 General Fund (529 x \$20 x 12 months) for FY 2004.
- 3. There are approximately 14,000 Medicaid recipients in nursing facilities who do have income above the current \$30 allowance and would be able to keep an additional \$20 per month pursuant to the Bill.
- 4. The \$20 would otherwise have been used to offset the cost of their care. This results in an increase in the Medicaid reimbursement to the facility to replace the \$20 per recipient per month.
- 5. The state match rate for FY 2004 is 36.18%.
- 6. The state match rate for FY 2005 is 36.20%
- 7. The annual cost to increase the personal needs allowance for the state/federally funded population is \$3.4 million in total State and federal funds (14,000 x \$20 x 12) for FY 2004. Of this amount \$1.2 million is from the State General Fund.
- 8. The estimated percentage increase in the consumer price index for FY 2005 is 2.9%.

#### Fiscal Impact

The estimated fiscal impact of House File 40 is an increase in General Fund expenditures of \$1.3 million for FY 2004 and \$1.4 million for FY 2005.
