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## A BILL FOR

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- 1 Section 1. Section 48A.6, subsection 1, Code 2003, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 1. A person who has been convicted of a felony as defined
- 4 in section 701.7, or convicted of an offense classified as a
- 5 felony under federal law. If When the person's rights are
- 6 later restored by the governor, or by-the-president-of-the
- 7 United-States, pursuant to section 914.8, the person may
- 8 register to vote.
- 9 Sec. 2. Section 914.2, Code 2003, is amended to read as
- 10 follows:
- 11 914.2 RIGHT OF APPLICATION.
- 12 Except as otherwise provided in section 902.2 or 914.8, a
- 13 person convicted of a criminal offense has the right to make
- 14 application to the board of parole for recommendation or to
- 15 the governor for a reprieve, pardon, commutation of sentence,
- 16 remission of fines or forfeitures, or restoration of rights of
- 17 citizenship at any time following the conviction.
- 18 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 914.8 RESTORATION OF RIGHT TO
- 19 REGISTER AND TO VOTE.
- 20 1. When a person, who has once been convicted of a felony
- 21 criminal offense, is discharged from probation under section
- 22 907.9, discharged from parole or work release under section
- 23 906.15, or released from confinement under section 902.6
- 24 because the person has completed the person's term of
- 25 confinement, the person's right to register to vote and to
- 26 vote is restored.
- 2. Upon discharge from confinement or supervision, the
- 28 department of corrections or judicial district department of
- 29 correctional services, whichever is applicable, shall provide
- 30 written notice to the inmate, parolee, or probationer of the
- 31 person's discharge which shall include a voter registration
- 32 form and a statement containing the following information:
- 33 a. That the person's right to register to vote and to vote
- 34 has been restored.
- 35 b. That in the month following the month of discharge, the

- 1 department of corrections will notify the county auditor of
- 2 the person's discharge from confinement or supervision.
- 3 c. That the person may register to vote by mail using the
- 4 form enclosed with the statement or that the person may
- 5 register to vote in person at the county auditor's office in
- 6 the county where the person will be residing.
- 7 3. The department of corrections shall monthly provide a
- 8 list of all persons discharged from confinement or supervision
- 9 to the state registrar of voters who shall provide the
- 10 information to the county registrars of voters as deemed
- ll necessary.
- 12 4. For a person who has more than once been convicted of a
- 13 felony and upon that person's discharge from confinement or
- 14 supervision, the department of corrections or judicial
- 15 district department of correctional services, whichever is
- 16 applicable, shall provide written notice to the inmate,
- 17 parolee, or probationer of the person's discharge which shall
- 18 include a statement informing the person that the person must
- 19 apply for a restoration of rights of citizenship in order to
- 20 register to vote and to vote and information on the method by
- 21 which citizenship rights are restored.
- 22 Sec. 4. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to persons
- 23 discharged from probation, parole, work release, or otherwise
- 24 released from confinement on or after July 1, 2003.
- 25 EXPLANATION
- 26 This bill makes restoration of the right to register to
- 27 vote and to vote automatic upon a person's release from
- 28 probation, parole, or work release, or upon completion of the
- 29 person's term of confinement if the person has only once been
- 30 convicted of a felony offense. The bill requires the
- 31 department of corrections or the judicial district department
- 32 of correctional services to provide written notice of
- 33 restoration of voting rights and a voter registration form to
- 34 such persons upon discharge from confinement or supervision.
- 35 The bill requires the department of corrections to, once

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1 each month, send a list of those persons discharged from
2 confinement or supervision to the state registrar of voters.
      The bill also requires the department of corrections or the
4 judicial district department of correctional services to
5 notify persons who have more than once been convicted of a
6 felony and who have been discharged from confinement or
7 supervision of the method by which they can have their rights
8 of citizenship restored.
      The bill applies to persons discharged on or after July 1,
10 2003.
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
