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Section 1. Section 321G.4, unnumbered paragraphs 1 and 2, 2 Code 2003, are amended to read as follows: The owner of each all-terrain vehicle or-snowmobile 4 required to be numbered shall register it every two years, and 5 the owner of each snowmobile required to be numbered shall 6 register it annually, with the county recorder of the county 7 in which the owner resides or, if the owner is a nonresident, 8 the owner shall register it in the county in which the all-9 terrain vehicle or snowmobile is principally used. 10 commission has supervisory responsibility over the 11 registration of all-terrain vehicles and snowmobiles and shall 12 provide each county recorder with registration forms and 13 certificates and shall allocate identification numbers to each 14 county. 15 The owner of the all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile shall 16 file an application for registration with the appropriate 17 county recorder on forms provided by the commission. 18 application shall be completed and signed by the owner of the 19 all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile and shall be accompanied by 20 a fee of twenty-five dollars for an all-terrain vehicle or 21 fifteen dollars for a snowmobile, and a writing fee. An all-22 terrain vehicle or a snowmobile shall not be registered by the 23 county recorder until the county recorder is presented with 24 receipts, bills of sale, or other satisfactory evidence that 25 the sales or use tax has been paid for the purchase of the 26 all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile or that the owner is exempt 27 from paying the tax. However, an owner of an all-terrain 28 vehicle, except an all-terrain vehicle purchased new on or 29 after January 1, 1990, may apply for registration without 30 proof of sales or use tax paid until one year after January 1, 31 1990. An all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile that has an 32 expired registration certificate from another state may be 33 registered in this state upon proper application, payment of 34 all applicable registration and writing fees, and payment of a 35 penalty of five dollars for an all-terrain vehicle or two

- 1 dollars and fifty cents for a snowmobile.
- 2 Sec. 2. Section 321G.6, Code 2003, is amended to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 321G.6 REGISTRATION -- RENEWAL -- TRANSFER.
- 5 l. Every all-terrain vehicle or-snowmobile registration
- 6 certificate and number issued expires at midnight December 31,
- 7 and renewals expire every two years thereafter unless sooner
- 8 terminated or discontinued in accordance with this chapter.
- 9 After the first day of September each even-numbered year, an
- 10 unregistered all-terrain vehicle or-snowmobile-and-renewals
- 11 may be registered or a registration may be renewed for the
- 12 subsequent biennium beginning January 1. An all-terrain
- 13 vehicle or-snowmobile registered between January 1 and
- 14 September 1 of even-numbered years shall be registered for a
- 15 fee of twelve dollars and fifty cents for the remainder of the
- 16 registration period.
- 17 After the first day of September in even-numbered years an
- 18 unregistered all-terrain vehicle or-snowmobile may be
- 19 registered for the remainder of the current registration
- 20 period and for the subsequent registration period in one
- 21 transaction. The fee shall be five dollars for the remainder
- 22 of the current period, in addition to the registration fee of
- 23 twenty-five dollars for an-all-terrain-vehicle-and-twenty-five
- 24 dollars-for-a-snowmobile-for the subsequent biennium beginning
- 25 January 1, and a writing fee.
- 26 2. Every snowmobile registration certificate and number
- 27 issued expires at midnight December 31, unless sooner
- 28 terminated or discontinued in accordance with this chapter.
- 29 After the first day of September each year, an unregistered
- 30 snowmobile may be registered or a registration may be renewed
- 31 for the subsequent year beginning January 1. A snowmobile
- 32 registered between June 1 and September 1 shall be registered
- 33 for a fee of seven dollars and fifty cents for the remainder
- 34 of the registration period.
- After the first day of September, a snowmobile may be

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- 1 registered for the remainder of the current registration
- 2 period and for the subsequent registration period in one
- 3 transaction. The fee shall be two dollars and fifty cents for
- 4 the remainder of the current period, in addition to the
- 5 registration fee of fifteen dollars for the subsequent year
- 6 beginning January 1, and a writing fee.
- 7 3. Registration certificates and numbers for all-terrain
- 8 vehicles and snowmobiles may be renewed upon application of
- 9 the owner in the same manner as provided in securing the
- 10 original registration. The all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile
- 11 registration fee is in lieu of personal property tax for each
- 12 year of the registration.
- 4. An expired all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile
- 14 registration may be renewed for the same fee as if the owner
- 15 is securing the original registration plus a penalty of five
- 16 dollars for an all-terrain vehicle or two dollars and fifty
- 17 cents for a snowmobile, and a writing fee.
- 18 All-all-terrain-vehicles-used-on-public-land-must-be
- 19 registered-within-six-months-following-January-17-19907-unless
- 20 otherwise-exempt-
- 21 5. When a person, after registering an all-terrain vehicle
- 22 or snowmobile, moves from the address shown on the
- 23 registration certificate, the person shall, within ten days,
- 24 notify the county recorder in writing of the move and the
- 25 person's new address.
- 26 6. Upon the transfer of ownership of an all-terrain
- 27 vehicle or snowmobile, the owner shall complete the form on
- 28 the back of the title, if any, and registration, if any, and
- 29 deliver both to the purchaser or transferee when the all-
- 30 terrain vehicle or snowmobile is delivered. If the all-
- 31 terrain vehicle or snowmobile is not titled, the owner shall
- 32 complete the form on the back of the current registration
- 33 certificate and shall deliver the certificate to the purchaser
- 34 or transferee at the time of delivering the all-terrain
- 35 vehicle or snowmobile. If the all-terrain vehicle or

- 1 snowmobile has not been titled and has not been registered,
- 2 the owner shall deliver an affidavit for an unregistered and
- 3 untitled all-terrain vehicle or snowmobile to the purchaser or
- 4 transferee. The purchaser or transferee shall, within thirty
- 5 days of transfer, file a new application form with the county
- 6 recorder with a fee of one dollar and the writing fee, and a
- 7 transfer of number shall be awarded in the same manner as
- 8 provided in an original registration. If the purchaser or
- 9 transferee does not file a new application form within thirty
- 10 days of transfer, the transfer of number shall be awarded upon
- 11 payment of all applicable fees plus a penalty of five dollars.
- 12 All registrations must be valid for the current
- 13 registration period prior to the transfer of any registration,
- 14 including assignment to a dealer.
- 7. Duplicate registrations may be issued upon application
- 16 therefor to the county recorder and the payment of the same
- 17 fees collected for the transfer of registrations.
- 18 8. A motorcycle, as defined in section 321.1, subsection
- 19 40, paragraph "a", may be registered as an all-terrain vehicle
- 20 as provided in this section. A motorcycle registered as an
- 21 all-terrain vehicle may participate in all programs
- 22 established for all-terrain vehicles under this chapter except
- 23 for the safety instruction and certification program.
- 24 Sec. 3. Section 321G.7, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2003,
- 25 is amended to read as follows:
- Within ten days after the end of each month, a county
- 27 recorder shall remit to the commission the all-terrain vehicle
- 28 and snowmobile fees collected by the recorder during the
- 29 previous month. Before January 10 of odd-numbered years for
- 30 all-terrain vehicles and each year for snowmobiles, a recorder
- 31 shall remit unused license forms from the previous biennium
- 32 registration period to the commission.
- 33 EXPLANATION
- 34 This bill requires annual registration of snowmobiles and
- 35 establishes a \$15 fee, plus a writing fee, for the

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2 3	registration. Currently, snowmobiles are registered every other year upon payment of a \$25 fee plus a writing fee.  The bill amends related Code provisions to correspond to the change to annual registration.
