#### Description

House File 517 makes the following changes impacting the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund:

- Increases the resident fishing license fee and creates a one-day resident fishing license.
- Creates a one-day and three-day nonresident fishing license.
- Combines fishing habitat fee with the fishing license fee to eliminate one transaction fee
  and specifies that \$3.00 from the sale of each resident and nonresident annual and
  seven-day fishing license fee be used for fish habitat development. Fifty percent of the
  funds collected will be given to County Conservation Boards for fish habitat
  development.

### **Assumptions**

- Gross receipts from fishing license increases to the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund are estimated to increase by \$650,000 for FY 2004 and \$813,000 for FY 2005 and subsequent years.
- 2. Federal funds are estimated to increase by \$1.0 million in FY 2004 and \$1.1 million in subsequent years.
- 3. Operating expenditures in the Fisheries Bureau are estimated to increase by \$418,000 in FY 2004 and \$528,000 in FY 2005 and subsequent years.
- 4. Capital expenditures are expected to increase by \$400,000 in FY 2004 and \$600,000 in FY 2005. Future capital projects include the completion of Lost Grove Lake in Scott County and the construction of fishing piers.
- 5. County Conservation Boards will receive approximately \$115,000 additional per year from increased license fees.

#### Fiscal Impact

The estimated net fiscal impact of HF 517 is an increase in revenue of \$832,000 to the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund for FY 2004 and \$735,000 for FY 2005 and subsequent years.

County Conservation Boards will receive approximately \$115,000 annually from the increased license fee revenues to the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund.
