A BILL FOR 1 An Act relating to the prevention and control of certain invasive plant and animal species and providing penalties. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 456A.37, Code 2003, is amended by
- 2 striking the section and inserting in lieu thereof the
- 3 following:
- 4 456A.37 INVASIVE SPECIES -- PREVENTION AND CONTROL.
- 5 1. DEFINITIONS. As used in this section:
- 6 a. "Eurasian watermilfoil" means myriophyllum spicatum, a
- 7 submerged aquatic weed that invades lakes, ponds, reservoirs,
- 8 and other bodies of water.
- 9 b. "Infestation of an invasive species" means an
- 10 infestation of Eurasian watermilfoil that occupies more than
- 11 twenty percent of the littoral area of a body of water or an
- 12 infestation of any other species defined as an invasive
- 13 species in this section.
- 14 c. "Invasive species" means a species that is not native
- 15 to an ecosystem and whose introduction causes or is likely to
- 16 cause economic or environmental harm or harm to human health
- 17 including but not limited to habitat alteration and
- 18 degradation, and loss of biodiversity. For the purposes of
- 19 this section, "invasive species" are limited to eurasian
- 20 watermilfoil, purple loosestrife, and zebra mussels.
- 21 d. "Purple loosestrife" means lythrum salicaria, a wetland
- 22 plant that invades marshes, lakeshores, and other wetlands.
- 23 e. "Watercraft" means any vessel which through the
- 24 buoyance of water floats upon the water and is capable of
- 25 carrying one or more persons.
- 26 f. "Zebra mussel" means dreissena polymorpha, a small
- 27 mussel that invades lakes, rivers, and other bodies of water.
- INVASIVE SPECIES MANAGEMENT PLAN. Before January 1,
- 29 2004, the commission shall prepare a long-term statewide
- 30 invasive species water management plan. The plan shall
- 31 address all of the following:
- 32 a. The detection and prevention of accidental
- 33 introductions into the state of invasive species.
- 34 b. A public awareness campaign regarding invasive species.
- 35 c. The control and eradication of invasive species in

- 1 public waters.
- 2 d. The development of a plan of containment strategies
- 3 that at a minimum includes all of the following:
- 4 (1) The participation by lake associations, local citizen
- 5 groups, and local units of government in the development of
- 6 lake management plans where invasive species exist.
- 7 (2) Notice to travelers of the penalties for violation of
- 8 laws relating to invasive species.
- 9 3. GRANTS. The director of the department of natural
- 10 resources shall accept gifts, donations, and grants to aid in
- 11 accomplishing the control and eradication of invasive species.
- 12 4. RULEMAKING. The commission shall adopt rules pursuant
- 13 to chapter 17A for the implementation and administration of
- 14 this section. The rules shall do all of the following:
- a. Restrict the introduction, propagation, use,
- 16 possession, and spread of invasive species.
- 17 b. Identify bodies of water with infestations of invasive
- 18 species. The department shall require that such bodies of
- 19 water be posted as infested. The department may prohibit
- 20 boating, fishing, swimming, and trapping in infested bodies of
- 21 water.
- 22 5. PROHIBITIONS.
- a. A person shall not do any of the following:
- 24 (1) Transport an invasive species on a public road.
- 25 (2) Place a trailer or launch a watercraft that contains
- 26 or to which an invasive species is attached in public waters.
- 27 (3) Operate a watercraft in a marked invasive species
- 28 infestation area.
- 29 b. A person who violates this subsection is subject to a
- 30 scheduled fine pursuant to section 805.8B, subsection 5.
- Sec. 2. Section 805.8B, subsection 5, Code 2003, is
- 32 amended to read as follows:
- 33 5. Eurasian-water-milfoil Invasive species violations.
- 34 For violations of section 456A.37, subsection 5, the scheduled
- 35 fine is one hundred dollars.

1 EXPLANATION

- 2 This bill relates to the prevention and control of certain
- 3 invasive plant and animal species in this state. The bill
- 4 defines an "invasive species" as a species that is not native
- 5 to an ecosystem and whose introduction causes or is likely to
- 6 cause economic or environmental harm or harm to human health
- 7 including but not limited to habitat alteration and
- 8 degradation and loss of biodiversity. For the purposes of the
- 9 bill, "invasive species" are limited to Eurasian watermilfoil
- 10 (myriophyllum spicatum), a submerged aquatic weed that invades
- ll lakes, ponds, and reservoirs; purple loosestrife (lythrum
- 12 salicaria), a wetland plant that invades marshes, lakeshores,
- 13 and other wetlands; and zebra mussels (dreissena polymorpha),
- 14 a small mussel that invades lakes and rivers.
- 15 The bill requires the natural resource commission to
- 16 prepare a long-term statewide invasive species water
- 17 management plan before January 1, 2004, that addresses the
- 18 detection and prevention of accidental introductions into the
- 19 state of invasive species, a public awareness campaign
- 20 regarding invasive species, the control and eradication of
- 21 invasive species in public waters, and the development of a
- 22 plan of containment strategies.
- 23 The plan of containment strategies must include at a
- 24 minimum participation by lake associations, local citizen
- 25 groups, and local units of government in the development of
- 26 lake management plans where invasive species exist, and notice
- 27 to travelers of the penalties for violation of laws relating
- 28 to invasive species.
- 29 The bill provides that the director of the department of
- 30 natural resources can accept gifts, donations, and grants to
- 31 aid in accomplishing the control and eradication of invasive
- 32 species.
- 33 The bill provides that the commission shall adopt rules
- 34 pursuant to Code chapter 17A that restrict the introduction,
- 35 propagation, use, possession, and spread of invasive species,

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1 and identify bodies of water with infestations of invasive 2 species. The bill requires that bodies of water that are 3 infested be posted as infested. The department of natural 4 resources may prohibit boating, fishing, swimming, and 5 trapping in infested bodies of water. The bill provides that a person shall not transport an 7 invasive species on a public road, place a trailer or launch a 8 watercraft that contains or to which an invasive species is 9 attached in public waters, or operate a watercraft in an area 10 that is marked as an invasive species infestation area. 11 penalty for violating these provisions is a scheduled fine of 12 \$100. 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34

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
