## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the issuance of deer hunting licenses to
2 nonresident landowners and providing a fee and penalties.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 483A.8, subsection 5, Code 2003, is
- 2 amended by striking the subsection and inserting in lieu
- 3 thereof the following:
- 4 5. a. Upon written application on forms furnished by the
- 5 department, the department shall issue annually without fee
- 6 one deer hunting license to a nonresident owner of a farm unit
- 7 or to a member of the nonresident owner's family, but not to
- 8 both. The deer hunting license issued shall be valid only on
- 9 the farm unit for which an applicant qualifies pursuant to
- 10 this subsection and shall be equivalent to the least
- 11 restrictive license issued under section 481A.38. A free deer
- 12 hunting license issued pursuant to this subsection shall be
- 13 valid during all shotgun deer seasons. If one or more parcels
- 14 of land have multiple nonresident owners, only one of the
- 15 nonresident owners is eligible for the free nonresident deer
- 16 hunting license. If a nonresident owner jointly owns land in
- 17 this state with a resident, only one joint owner or member of
- 18 a joint owner's family shall receive a free deer hunting
- 19 license and preference shall be given to the resident owner or
- 20 the resident owner's family member who applies for the
- 21 license.
- 22 b. In addition to the free deer hunting license received,
- 23 a nonresident owner of a farm unit or a member of the
- 24 nonresident owner's family may purchase a deer hunting license
- 25 through any option offered to paying nonresident deer hunting
- 26 licensees. A nonresident owner of a farm unit or a member of
- 27 the nonresident owner's family may also purchase two
- 28 additional antlerless deer hunting licenses which are valid
- 29 only on the farm unit owned for a fee of ten dollars each.
- 30 c. If the commission establishes a deer hunting season to
- 31 occur in the first quarter of a calendar year that is separate
- 32 from a deer hunting season that continues from the last
- 33 quarter of the preceding calendar year, each nonresident owner
- 34 of a farm unit located within a zone where a deer hunting
- 35 season is established, upon application, shall be issued a

- 1 free deer hunting license for each of the two calendar
- 2 quarters. Each license is valid only for hunting on the farm
- 3 unit of the nonresident owner.
- d. Deer hunting licenses issued to nonresidents who own
- 5 farm units in this state or to members of nonresident owners'
- 6 families pursuant to this subsection are exempt from the
- 7 limitations and allocations specified in subsections 3 and 4.
- 8 e. As used in this subsection:
- 9 (1) "Family member" means a person who is not a resident
- 10 of Iowa and who is the spouse or child of the nonresident
- 11 owner and who resides with the nonresident owner.
- 12 (2) "Farm unit" means all parcels of land, not necessarily
- 13 contiguous, which are operated as a unit for agricultural
- 14 purposes and which are under the lawful control of the
- 15 nonresident owner.
- 16 (3) "Nonresident owner" means an owner of a farm unit who
- 17 is not a resident of Iowa.
- 18 EXPLANATION
- 19 This bill provides that a nonresident who owns a farm unit
- 20 in this state or a member of the nonresident's family who
- 21 resides with the nonresident may apply annually for one free
- 22 deer hunting license. The deer hunting license issued is
- 23 valid only on the farm unit for which the applicant qualifies
- 24 pursuant to this subsection and is equivalent to the least
- 25 restrictive license issued under Code section 481A.38. A free
- 26 deer hunting license issued pursuant to the bill is valid for
- 27 all shotgun deer seasons. If one or more parcels of land have
- 28 multiple nonresident owners, only one of the nonresident
- 29 owners is eligible for the free deer hunting license. If a
- 30 nonresident landowner jointly owns land in this state with a
- 31 resident, only one joint owner or member of a joint owner's
- 32 family shall receive a free deer hunting license and
- 33 preference shall be given to the resident owner or the
- 34 resident owner's family member who applies for the free
- 35 license.

The bill provides that in addition to the free deer hunting 2 license received, a nonresident owner of a farm unit or a 3 member of the nonresident owner's family may purchase a deer 4 hunting license by any option offered to paying nonresident 5 deer hunting licensees. A nonresident owner of a farm unit or 6 a member of the nonresident owner's family may also purchase 7 two additional antlerless deer hunting licenses which are 8 valid only on the farm unit owned for a fee of \$10 each. The bill provides that if the commission establishes a deer 10 hunting season to occur in the first quarter of a calendar 11 year that is separate from a deer hunting season that 12 continues from the last quarter of the preceding calendar 13 year, each nonresident owner of a farm unit located within a 14 zone where a deer hunting season is established, upon 15 application, shall be issued a free deer hunting license for 16 each of the two calendar quarters. Each license issued is 17 valid only for hunting on the farm unit of the nonresident 18 owner. 19 The bill provides that deer hunting licenses issued to 20 nonresidents who own farm units in this state or to members of 21 nonresident owners' families pursuant to the bill are exempt 22 from the limitations and allocations that limit the number of 23 nonresident deer hunting licenses to 8,500. The bill also defines "nonresident owner" as an owner of a 25 farm unit who is not a resident of Iowa and "family member" as 26 a person who is not a resident of Iowa who is the spouse or 27 child of the nonresident owner and who resides with the 28 nonresident owner. The bill defines "farm unit" as all 29 parcels of land, not necessarily contiguous, which are
