      The bill provides for the addition of varicella
 4 (chickenpox) to the list of required childhood immunizations,
 5 and adds advanced registered nurse practitioners and physician
 6 assistants as health professionals authorized to sign
7 immunization medical waivers.
      The bill modifies exemption provisions relating to
9 activities constituting the practice of nursing, to make clear
10 that the performance of nursing services by students who are
11 licensed as registered nurses or practical or vocational
12 nurses in any United States jurisdiction will not fall within
13 the exemption and will be subject to the jurisdiction of the
14 board.
