EXPLANATION

This bill appropriates moneys for fiscal year 2003-2004 The general fund of the state to the college student aid

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1 commission, the department for the blind, the department of 2 cultural affairs, the department of education, and the state 3 board of regents and its institutions.

4 The bill includes appropriations to the college student aid 5 commission for general administrative purposes, student aid 6 programs, an initiative directing primary care physicians to 7 areas of the state experiencing physician shortages, the 8 accelerated career education grant program, the national guard 9 educational assistance program, and the teacher shortage 10 forgivable loan program. The bill nullifies the \$2.75 million 11 standing appropriation for the Iowa work-study program for 12 fiscal year 2003-2004.

13 The bill appropriates to the department for the blind for 14 its administration.

15 The bill appropriates to the department of cultural affairs 16 for its arts, historical and administration divisions, for 17 historic sites, and for community cultural grants.

18 The bill appropriates moneys to the department of education 19 for purposes of the department's general administration, 20 vocational education administration, board of educational 21 examiners, division of vocational rehabilitation services, 22 independent living, state library for general administration 23 and the enrich Iowa program, library service area system, 24 public broadcasting division, regional telecommunications 25 councils, vocational education to secondary schools, school 26 food service, Iowa empowerment fund, textbooks for nonpublic 27 school pupils, student achievement and teacher quality 28 program, and community colleges.

The bill modifies and updates Code language related to the student achievement and teacher quality program and to allocations provided for the program. The bill allocates moneys to administer the ambassador to education position from moneys appropriated to the program, and provides for the anonreversion of moneys allocated for purposes of the issuance of national board certification awards, and the career

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1 development and beginning teacher mentoring and induction
2 programs. The bill also amends the standing Code language
3 that provides for the allocation of educational excellence
4 moneys to the department of education for fiscal year 20025 2003 for purposes of the national assessment of education
6 progress and the ambassador to education position and makes
7 those provisions effective upon enactment.

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

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

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EXPLANATION

This bill appropriates moneys for fiscal year 2003-2004 from the general fund of the state to the college student aid commission, the department for the blind, the department of department of education, and the state board of regents and its institutions. 1 The bill includes appropriations to the college student aid 2 commission for general administrative purposes, student aid 3 programs, an initiative directing primary care physicians to 4 areas of the state experiencing physician shortages, the 5 accelerated career education grant program, the national guard 6 educational assistance program, and the teacher shortage 7 forgivable loan program. The bill nullifies the \$2.75 million 8 standing appropriation for the Iowa work-study program for 9 fiscal year 2003-2004. The bill increases the standing 10 appropriation for tuition grants.

11 The bill appropriates to the department for the blind for 12 its administration.

13 The bill appropriates to the department of cultural affairs 14 for its arts, historical and administration divisions, for 15 historic sites, and for community cultural grants.

16 The bill appropriates moneys to the department of education 17 for purposes of the department's general administration, 18 vocational education administration, board of educational 19 examiners, division of vocational rehabilitation services, 20 independent living, state library for general administration 21 and the enrich Iowa program, library service area system, 22 public broadcasting division, regional telecommunications 23 councils, vocational education to secondary schools, school 24 food service, Iowa empowerment fund, textbooks for nonpublic 25 school pupils, student achievement and teacher quality 26 program, and community colleges.

The bill modifies and updates Code language related to the student achievement and teacher quality program and to allocations provided for the program. The bill allocates moneys to administer the ambassador to education position from moneys appropriated to the program, and provides for the nonreversion of moneys allocated for purposes of the issuance of national board certification awards and the beginning teacher mentoring and induction programs. The bill also amends the standing Code language that provides for the

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S.F. H.F.

1 allocation of educational excellence moneys to the department 2 of education for fiscal year 2002-2003 for purposes of the 3 national assessment of education progress and the ambassador 4 to education position and makes those provisions effective 5 upon enactment.

6 The bill appropriates moneys to the state board of regents 7 for tuition replacement, the southwest Iowa graduate studies 8 center, the tristate graduate center, the quad-cities graduate 9 studies center, the state university of Iowa, Iowa state 10 university of science and technology, the university of 11 northern Iowa, the Iowa school for the deaf, the Iowa braille 12 and sight saving school, and for tuition and transportation 13 costs for students residing in the Iowa braille and sight 14 saving school, and the Iowa school for the deaf. The bill 15 provides that the regents universities must proportionately 16 bear the cost of operating the board office.

(3) For purposes of this section, "eligible public library" means a public library that meets all of the following requirements:

(a) Submits to the division all of the following:

(i) The report provided for under section 256.51, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

(ii) An application and accreditation report, in a format approved by the commission, that provides evidence of the library's compliance with at least one level of the standards established in accordance with section 256.51, subsection 1, paragraph "k".

(iii) Any other application or report the division deems necessary for the implementation of the enrich Iowa program.

(b) Participates in the library resource and information sharing programs established by the state library.

(c) Is a public library established by city ordinance or a library district as provided in chapter 336.

(4) Each eligible public library shall maintain a separate listing within its budget for payments received and expenditures made pursuant to this lettered paragraph, and shall annually submit this listing to the division.

(5) By January 15, 2004, the division shall submit a program evaluation report to the general assembly and the governor detailing the uses and the impacts of funds allocated under this lettered paragraph.

The community empowerment area board must also submit a written plan amendment extending by one year the area's comprehensive school ready children grant plan developed for providing services for children from birth through five years of age and provide other information specified by the Iowa empowerment board. The amendment may also provide for changes in the programs and services provided under the plan. The Iowa empowerment board shall establish a submission deadline for the plan amendment that allows a reasonable period of time for preparation of the plan amendment and for review and approval or request for modification of the plan amendment by the Iowa empowerment board. In addition, the community empowerment board must continue to comply with reporting provisions and other requirements adopted by the Iowa empowerment board in implementing section 28.8.

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The university of Iowa hospitals and clinics shall, within the context of chapter 255 and when medically appropriate, make reasonable efforts to extend the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics' use of home telemedicine and other technologies to reduce the frequency of visits to the hospital required by indigent patients. The university of Iowa hospitals and clinics shall submit a report to the general assembly and the legislative fiscal bureau by January 15, 2004, describing its use of these technologies to accomplish this purpose.

The university of Iowa hospitals and clinics shall submit quarterly a report regarding the portion of the appropriation in this lettered paragraph expended on medical education. (1) The attending physician certifies that continuing the pregnancy would endanger the life of the pregnant woman.

(2) The attending physician certifies that the fetus is physically deformed, mentally deficient, or afflicted with a congenital illness.

(3) The pregnancy is the result of a rape which is reported within 45 days of the incident to a law enforcement agency or public or private health agency which may include a family physician.

(4) The pregnancy is the result of incest which is reported within 150 days of the incident to a law enforcement agency or public or private health agency which may include a family physician. (5) The abortion is a spontaneous abortion, commonly known as a miscarriage, wherein not all of the products of conception are expelled.

The total quota allocated to the counties for indigent patients for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, shall not be lower than the total quota allocated to the counties for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1998. The total quota shall be allocated among the counties on the basis of the 2000 census pursuant to section 255.16.

sec. 10. MEDICAL ASSISTANCE -- SUPPLEMENTAL AMOUNTS. To the extent that state funds appropriated to a qualifying hospital for the treatment of indigent patients as provided in chapter 255 have been transferred to the department of human services as a result of these supplemental payments made to the qualifying hospital, the department shall not, directly or indirectly, recoup the supplemental payments made to a qualifying hospital for any reason, unless an equivalent amount of the funds transferred to the department of human services by a qualifying hospital pursuant to this provision is transferred to the qualifying hospital by the department.

If the state supplemental amount allotted to the state of Iowa for the federal fiscal year beginning October 1, 2003, and ending September 30, 2004, pursuant to section 1923(f)(3) of the federal Social Security Act, as amended, or pursuant to federal payments for indirect medical education is greater than the amount necessary to fund the federal share of the supplemental payments specified in the preceding paragraph, the department of human services shall increase the supplemental disproportionate share or supplemental indirect medical education adjustment by the lesser of the amount necessary to utilize fully the state supplemental amount or the amount of state funds appropriated to the state university of Iowa general education fund and allocated to the university for the college of medicine. The state university of Iowa shall transfer from the allocation for the college of medicine to the department of human services, on a monthly basis, an amount equal to the additional supplemental payments made during the previous month pursuant to this paragraph. A qualifying hospital receiving supplemental payments pursuant to this paragraph that are greater than the state appropriation made to the qualifying hospital for treatment of indigent patients as provided in chapter 255 shall be

obligated as a condition of its participation in the medical assistance program to transfer to the state university of Iowa general education fund on a monthly basis an amount equal to the funds transferred by the state university of Iowa to the department of human services. To the extent that state funds appropriated to the state university of Iowa and allocated to the college of medicine have been transferred to the department of human services as a result of these supplemental payments made to the qualifying hospital, the department shall not, directly or indirectly, recoup these supplemental payments made to a qualifying hospital for any reason, unless an equivalent amount of the funds transferred to the department of human services by the state university of Iowa pursuant to this paragraph is transferred to the qualifying hospital by the department.

Continuation of the supplemental disproportionate share and supplemental indirect medical education adjustment shall preserve the funds available to the university hospital for medical and surgical treatment of indigent patients as provided in chapter 255 and to the state university of Iowa for educational purposes at the same level as provided by the state funds initially appropriated for that purpose.

The department of human services shall, in any compilation of data or other report distributed to the public concerning payments to providers under the medical assistance program, set forth reimbursements to a qualifying hospital through the supplemental disproportionate share and supplemental indirect medical education adjustment as a separate item and shall not include such payments in the amounts otherwise reported as the reimbursement to a qualifying hospital for services to medical assistance recipients.

For purposes of this section, "supplemental payment" means a supplemental payment amount paid for medical assistance to a hospital qualifying for that payment under this section.

Sec. 16. Section 284.13, subsection 1, paragraph f, Code 2003, is amended by striking the paragraph.

Sec. 17. Section 284.13, subsection 1, paragraphs b, c, d, and e, Code 2003, are amended to read as follows:

b. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002 2003, and ending June 30, 2003 2004, to the department of education, the amount of one-million-four seven hundred thousand dollars for the issuance of national board certification awards in accordance with section 256.44.

For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002 2003, and c. succeeding fiscal years, an amount up to four million one two hundred thousand dollars for first-year and second-year beginning teachers, to the department of education for distribution to school districts for purposes of the beginning teacher mentoring and induction programs. A school district shall receive one thousand three hundred dollars per beginning teacher participating in the program. If the funds appropriated for the program are insufficient to pay mentors and school districts as provided in this paragraph, the department shall prorate the amount distributed to school districts based upon the amount appropriated. Moneys received by a school district pursuant to this paragraph shall be expended to provide each mentor with an award of five hundred dollars per semester, at a minimum, for participation in the school district's beginning teacher mentoring and induction program; to implement the plan; and to pay any applicable costs of the employer's share of contributions to federal social security and the Iowa public employees' retirement system or a pension and annuity retirement system established under chapter 294, for such amounts paid by the district.

For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002 2003, and d. ending June 30, 2003 2004, up to one million seven-hundred thousand dollars to the department of education for purposes of establishing the evaluator training program, including but not limited to the-development-of-criteria-models; an evaluation process; the training of providers; development of a provider approval process; training materials and costs; for payment to practitioners under section 284.10, subsection 3, and to pay any applicable costs of the employer's share of contributions to federal social security and the Iowa public employees' retirement system or a pension and annuity retirement system established under chapter 294, for such amounts paid by the district; and for subsidies to school districts for training costs. A portion of the funds allocated to the department for purposes of this paragraph may be used by the department for administrative purposes.

e. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002 2003, and ending June 30, 2003 2004, up to fifty three hundred seventyfive thousand dollars to the department of education for purposes of implementing the career development program requirements of section 284.6, and the review panel requirements of section 284.9. From the moneys allocated to the department pursuant to this paragraph, not less than seventy-five thousand dollars shall be used to administer the ambassador to education position in accordance with section 256.45. A portion of the funds allocated to the department for purposes of this paragraph may be used by the department for administrative purposes.

For each fiscal year in which funds are appropriated for purposes of this chapter, the moneys remaining after distribution as provided in paragraphs "a" "b" through "f" "e" and "h" shall be allocated to school districts in accordance with the following formula: Sec. 19. Section 284.13, subsection 1, Code 2003, is amended by adding the following new paragraph:

<u>NEW PARAGRAPH</u>. i. Notwithstanding section 8.33, any moneys remaining unencumbered or unobligated from the moneys allocated for purposes of paragraphs "b" or "c" shall not revert but shall remain available in the succeeding fiscal year for expenditure for the purposes designated. The provisions of section 8.39 shall not apply to the funds appropriated pursuant to this subsection.

Sec. 20. Section 284.13, subsection 3, Code 2003, is amended by striking the subsection.

Sec. 21. Section 294A.25, subsections 5 and 6, Code 2003, are amended to read as follows:

5. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001 2002, and ending June 30, 2002 2003, the amount of fifty thousand dollars to be paid to the department of education for participation in a state and national project, the national assessment of education progress, to determine the academic achievement of Iowa students in math, reading, science, United States history, or geography.

6. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001 2002, and ending June 30, 2002 2003, to the department of education from phase III moneys, the amount of seventy-five thousand dollars to administer the ambassador to education position in accordance with section 256.45.

Sec. 22. EFFECTIVE DATES.

1. Section 6 of this Act, relating to the supplemental aid for community colleges, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

2. Section 21 of this Act, relating to the appropriation of educational excellence moneys to the department of education for purposes of the national assessment of education progress and the ambassador to education position, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

3. Section 8 of this Act, relating to the nonreversion of career development funds, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

4. The section of this Act, amending section 261.86, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment and applies retroactively to July 1, 2002.
